Competition Rules

Effective: January 1st 2011

In association with FIH Rules of Hockey the Gold Coast Hockey Association Inc produces these Competition Rules. GCHA will review any Rules that come from HA, HQ Inc, before any rules are changed or amendments added. The Executive has ratified these rules.

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Changes to the Rules of Hockey – 2011

- Rule 9.15:** “players must not force an opponent into offending unintentionally”. This Rule is deleted.
- Rule 13.1:** location of a free hit. This former Mandatory Experimental Rule becomes a full Rule of Hockey.
- Rule 13.1.d:** “a free hit awarded inside the circle to the defence is taken anywhere inside the circle or up to 15 metres from the back-line in line with the location of the offence, parallel to the side-line”. The option of taking the free hit “anywhere inside the circle” is deleted.
- Rule 13.2:** taking a free hit, centre pass and putting the ball back into play after it has been outside the field. This former Mandatory Experimental Rule becomes a full Rule of Hockey.
- Rule 13.3.h:** “taking a penalty corner ... until the ball has been played, no attacker other than the one taking the push or hit from the back-line is permitted to enter the circle”. When an attacker enters the circle before permitted, the penalty corner is taken again except that when attackers persistently enter the circle before permitted, a free hit is awarded to the defence. In the full printed set of Rules, the penalties which apply for an offence during the taking of a penalty corner will listed in detail.
- Rule 13.9.a:** for an offence during the taking of a penalty stroke”. If the stroke is taken before the whistle has been blown and a goal is scored, it is taken again.
- Rule 13.9.c:** “for an offence during the taking of a penalty stroke ... for any other offence by the player defending the stroke which prevents a goal being scored”. Instead of a goal being awarded, the penalty stroke is taken again. This means that Rules 13.9.c and 13.9.d both now lead to the penalty stroke being taken again.

Each team shall have a goal keeper or a player with goalkeeping privileges on the field, but no team may play with only field players.

** In 2007, Hockey Australia recommended to all States and Regional Associations that the change to the FIH rules regarding the requirement of a Goal Keeper would not be enforced below a National Championship level, meaning that a goal keeper is required on the field at all times (fully protected or a minimum of a helmet) for a game to be played. Hockey Queensland adopted this recommendation.*

2.2 2 c Junior matches U11 should consist of 2 x 25 min halves with a 5 min 1/2 time break.

1 GCHA Structure

- 1 The Gold Coast Hockey Association Inc. competition fixtures are as follows:

DIVISIONS	NUMBER OF TEAMS
Divisions 1, 2, 3...etc Male & Female	Generally 8 with a minimum of 6
Vets ... Male & Female	As recommended by the GCHA Competitions Committee
Juniors	U9, U11, U13, U15, U18 As recommended by the GCHA Junior Committee

2. There will be a minimum number of matches for each division as determined by the GCHA Board.
 3. There will only be full rounds in all divisions unless decided otherwise by the GCHA Board.
 4. The GCHA Board reserves the right to grade all teams in any division where it benefits the competition.

2 Local Rules

- 1 The GCHA Board has discretionary powers over these Competition Rules with respect to interpretation and application. This document replaces all previous versions of the Competition Rules and will remain current until replaced with a newer version.

2.1 Local Competition Rules

1. These local rules shall prevail over any other rules. The order for applying rules is as follows:
 a. Local Rules;
 b. International Rules (as per rule book).

2.2 Match Template, Durations and Starting Times

1. The template continues to be a product of ongoing negotiation and agreement between GCHA and other sporting associations as required. The GCHA Board will determine the Template.
 2. Match Durations are as follows:
 a. Senior matches should consist of 2x35-min halves with a 5-minute half time break.
 b. Veteran matches should consist of 2x25-min halves with a 5-minute half time break.
 c. Junior matches (U18,U15 U13) should consist of 2x30-min halves with a 5-minute half time break.

2.3 Time Keeping for Matches

1. Official game time is the advertised game start time as per fixture draw.
 2. Where matches are timed by technical officers or by means other than the umpires, the matches will be started and re-started by the umpires but the match will end on the siren at the end of the required period of time except in the case of extension of time to allow for the completion of a penalty corner or penalty stroke in which case the match will end on the umpires' whistle.
 3. Time off during fixture matches will not be permitted. However, match time may be lost for various reasons such as serious injury or when the playing surface has become unplayable, e.g. excessive water (rain) on surface, etc.
 4. Where players incur a serious injury and cannot be removed from the field for a period greater than 15 minutes then the match shall be abandoned unless otherwise agreed by the team captains.

Umpires are required to ensure that all injured players leave the field as quickly as possible. Every reasonable effort must be made to complete the match at its scheduled time.

5. Where the Competitions Co-ordinator rules that the playing surface is unplayable and more than 15 minutes of playing time is lost then the match shall be abandoned.
6. Where the team captains and umpires agree that a surface is unplayable for a period in excess of 15 minutes then the match shall be abandoned.
7. The GCHA Competitions Committee shall reschedule abandoned matches, game must be replayed or rescheduled giving each team at least one(1) week's notice with the game to be played within two (2) weeks of cancelled game. If no suitable date agreed upon, then game declared a NIL All draw.
8. In exceptional circumstances, the Competitions Co-ordinator may reduce the duration of fixture matches after consultation with the Tech Bench and the Umpires Co-ordinator. (Div 1 – no less than 2 x 25 min halves; other divs – no less than 2 x 20 min halves) plus 5-minute halftime break.
9. Where games are cancelled after half time, the score at that time will be deemed the final score.

2.4 Yellow Card Rule – A Player Penalty System

1. In addition to all Senior Competitions this rule also incorporates the junior competition with points accumulated in any of these competitions being cumulative and reciprocal.
2. A Green Card issued in a match will incur a 2 min time on the sideline. No points will accrue.
3. GCHA. Implement a points system for yellow cards where by each yellow card given is worth four (4) points. All yellow cards issued in a match must be accurately recorded on the team sheets in the Yellow Card column beside the relevant player.
4. When a player has accumulated twelve (12) points, a player shall be automatically suspended for one (1) competition round. The player cannot play in any other team until suspension has been served. In the event of a bye occurring in that competition round, then the suspension will transfer to the following round.

2.5 Team Points Scoring for Fixture Matches

1. During the fixture competitions for all divisions, three (3) points will be awarded for a win, one (1) point will be awarded for a draw, three (3) points will be awarded for a bye and three (3) points and six (6) goals to nil (0) will be awarded for a forfeit.

2.6 Determination of Late Starting Fixture Matches

1. If after a period of ten (10) minutes a team does not take the field, forfeiture will be awarded to the team ready to play.

2.6.1 Extenuating Circumstances

1. The GCHA Board has discretionary powers to consider extenuating circumstances in the case of forfeits.

2.7 Permitted Number of Players

1. Teams may be completed to their full strength of eleven (11) players at any time during the match provided that the names of the players have been entered on the match card and provided that no team shall take a field with less than seven (7) players. Up to sixteen (16) players may be used in any fixture match.
2. Should any Club be found guilty of taking the field with more than eleven (11) players in any team in any match the following penalties shall be applied:-
 - In excess of sixteen (16) players **or** substituting a suspended player - loss of points
 - In excess of eleven (11) players –penalty as determined by the Competitions Committee.

2.8 Forfeiture of Matches

1. Any club receiving forfeiture shall be credited with three points and shall be treated as having scored six (6) goals to nil (0). In the event of two opposing teams giving forfeiture, the point's score by each team shall be nil (0) and the goals scored shall be nil (0).

2. For the purpose of these rules, a forfeit shall be deemed to have arisen when one team, either fails to appear at the time set down for play, within such time specified in these rules, and without notification that such team intends to forfeit, or appears at the playing ground with less than seven (7) players. The team being awarded the game does not have to take the field, but a game card can be completed in full and be lodged with GCHA prior to the next fixture.
3. Should a team forfeit a fixture match less than 48 hours before the scheduled starting time in writing, the Club concerned shall be liable for payment of their opponent's turf fees in addition to their own.
4. Should the Secretary/President of the Club notify the GCHA of its forfeit in writing at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled starting time, the team shall only be liable for payment of its own team's turf fee.
5. Should a team forfeit any match in the final series then that team shall be liable to pay double turf fees regardless of the amount of notice given.

2.9 Withdrawal of a Team Mid-Season

1. In the event of a Club withdrawing a team during the season, then all matches scheduled for that team shall be deemed null and void. All Games against that team played or not played shall be deemed forfeitures.

2.10 Umpires

1. The Umpires' Committee shall appoint umpires to officiate at fixtures. Where the Committee has designated Clubs to provide umpires it is the Club's responsibility to ensure that capable umpires attend.
2. Where an umpire has been named and fails to umpire, that player shall be given a Yellow card and be given the penalty points.
3. Where a team is named and fails to umpire, that team will lose 3 game points. Unless they have advised the umpire's name in writing to GCHA. To comply with this rule, umpire's names must be advised in writing to GCHA not less than 24 hrs prior to match.
4. If non- attending umpires have a suitable replacement umpire, they must be sanctioned by GCHA Umpires Co-ordinator.
5. If an umpire is more than ten (10) minutes late for match then penalty will apply, unless extenuating circumstances satisfy the umpire committee.

2.11 Club Days

1. Any Club wishing to have a Club Day shall negotiate with the GCHA Director of Competitions prior to the creation of the season's fixtures.

2.12 Under 9 Competitions

1. The Under 9 Competition at GCHA is coordinated and overseen by the GCHA Junior Coordinator. Affiliate clubs with teams involved in this level of competition will join together for 1 hour for skill development followed by modified games as an introduction to the sport of hockey. The emphasis is on enjoyment and the teaching of basic skills. This competition is mixed gender and is not for points. The season culminates in a carnival day with an emphasis on participation.

2.13 Coaching from the Back Line & Dugouts

1. Coaching from the back line is prohibited for all Senior and Junior Competitions. Penalties will be invoked for breaches of this rule.
2. Junior Competition allows two coaching staff and one manager only to accompany the players in dugouts.

2.14 Player Substitutions

1. All player substitutions must be effected from the halfway line. Exception of goalkeeper substitution when are done in accordance with FIH.

2.15 Umpire Examinations

1. Players nominated by their clubs must sit and pass an umpiring familiarisation examination compiled by GCHA. Any umpire who does not pass will not receive payment for umpiring, unless exemption granted by GCHA board at their discretion.

2.16 Fixture Matches during State Titles

1. Where a junior team has four (4) or more players, a senior team has five (5) or more players, away on representative duties for GCHA, then they may request rescheduling of game. The GCHA Competitions Committee shall reschedule game and must be replayed or rescheduled giving each team at least one(1) week's notice with the game to be played within two (2) weeks of cancelled game. If no suitable date agreed upon, then game declared a NIL All draw.

2.17 Head Injuries

1. Where a player has been knocked unconscious ('knocked out') or on the advice of the First Aid Officer, is advisable that the player not participate any further in the match, but not mandatory in Seniors.

2.18 Goalkeepers (FIH Rule 4.3 & 4.4)

1. Goalkeepers must wear protective equipment comprising at least headgear, leg guards and kickers except that the headgear and any hand protectors may be removed when taking a penalty stroke.
2. Goalkeepers and players with goalkeeping privileges must wear a coloured shirt or garment which is different in colour from that of both teams.
3. A registered goalkeeper may play in the division higher than he/she is team registered as goalkeeper, without penalty.
4. A registered goalkeeper can play down on field one division, without penalty.

2.19 Banned Play – Drag Flicks & “Tomahawk”

1. The Drag Flick and “tomahawk” method of striking the ball is allowed in all GCHA divisions exclusive of U11 & U9.
2. It is strongly recommended that all clubs provide facemasks for all age groups above and including U13 for defenders to wear in short corners.

3 Registration System

1. Competing clubs shall register a **minimum** of 9 active players, one of whom is designated as goalkeeper in each team in the club's top two (2) divisions, with the remaining players being nominated in the lower divisions. Team nominations are to be received by the 3rd fixture round.
2. GCHA Board upon application may consider variations to these requirements.
3. Where a player is registered in a particular division, that same player can play an unlimited number of games in the next immediate higher division for his/her club.
4. Should a player miss five (5) matches in succession in their registered division then that player will be automatically de-registered in that division.
5. At all times the GCHA Board shall administer de-registrations and/or re-registrations including players coming back after a lengthy period of injury.

3.1 Registrations

1. A player cannot be registered in any division/competition with more than one Club. The GCHA Board may consider a relaxation of this rule, but only under exceptional circumstances for example, where a player's Club does not have:
 - a. “Senior” team or
 - b. “Junior” team.

3.1.2 Age Eligibility

1. For grades where age eligibility is considered the age is determined as at 1 January of each year. Players must be under the maximum age for a division as at 1 January. Players eligible to be registered in “Age” graded divisions (U7 – U13) shall not be older than the maximum age for that

division during the year of competition (i.e.: players who will be under or turn 13 during the current calendar year are eligible to be registered in the U/13 division and likewise for the other "Age" graded divisions).

3.1.3 New Player Registrations

1. No player may participate in any match unless such player is registered with the GCHA.
2. Teams who play unregistered players will be penalised. Penalty loss of points to team.

3.2 Player List for Matches

1. At the commencement of any match, the Captain/Manager of each team will hand to the technical bench a list of the players in the team listing registered shirt/playing number, as prescribed by the GCHA Board.

3.3 Players Eligibility for Finals

1. A player must have played five (5) fixture matches in any division or competition in which his/her club has registered him/her for that season. (Whereby one (1) week equals one (1) fixture match).
2. A player must have played a minimum of three (3) games in a team that he/she is registered with to be eligible to play finals in that team.
3. Players registered in a junior division who also play seniors must play 50% of the scheduled junior fixture games to be eligible to play in the finals of the junior competition.

3.4 Registered Juniors Playing Seniors

1. A junior may be named in one (1) junior team and one (1) senior team.
2. A junior player playing in Junior Competition may play a maximum of three (3) games per weekend of competition, which may consist of:-
 - i. Two (2) games in Junior competition and one (1) game in Senior or
 - ii. One (1) game in Junior competition and two (2) games in Senior.

3.5 Mixed Gender Policy

1. For 2011 U13 through to U/18 is single gender as per HQ policy. Clubs must write to HQ for special request for 2011 as per guidelines in the "variation to policy" distributed in 2010 by HQ.

3.6 Playing in a Lower Division / Competition

1. A player can play in a team lower than where he/she is registered but will be automatically downgraded. That player must play two (2) games in that team before he/she can be reinstated in the original higher team.
2. A Junior player may not play below his/her eligible age group.
3. A player's first game after at least three (3) weeks off with injury or illness may be in a team one (1) division lower than team listed without penalty. Letter of notification with medical certificate attached must be received by GCHA prior to taking the field.

3.7 De-Registration of Players

1. De-registration of players from higher to lower divisions will not be accepted after the commencement of the final five (5) fixture matches. (whereby one (1) week equals one (1) fixture match).

3.8 Transfers and Clearances

1. Clearances should be sought to avoid the possible loss of competition points. Players shall not be registered without clearances. Teams that play unregistered players, penalties will apply.

4 Control of Matches

1. Captains/ Managers and/or Technical Bench are responsible for the relevant duties as follows:
 - a. Ensure that all yellow cards are registered on the prescribed team card/sheet.

- b. Ensure that all match cards/sheets are returned to the GCHA office.
 - c. Operate the scoreboard, where relevant.
 - d. Ensure that players and officials adhere to all artificial surface rules.
 - e. Ensure that player behaviour is appropriate for the circumstances.
 - f. Report to the Board in writing, any instances of misconduct, not reported by an umpire.
2. Junior Teams prior to taking the field at start of game must meet on centre line to shake hands and complete the toss of the coin for control of play.

5 Requirements for Team Sheets and Result Slips

5.1 Results

1. At all GCHA venues it is the responsibility of the person in charge of the Technical Bench to communicate the results of fixtures played at that venue to the person appointed by the GCHA Board on the day the fixtures are played.

5.2 Match Records and Team Sheets

1. Match Records must be presented to the Umpire/Technical Bench, at the commencement a fixture match. Team sheets must be correctly filled in as follows:
 - a. Surname first, followed by full Given Name;
 - b. For GCHA divisions each player's individual shirt number must appear on the team card;
 - c. The players' registration numbers must appear in the designated space on the team sheet when such a system is in place.
2. Team sheets are in triplicate with the top (original) leaf to be submitted to the GCHA Office, the blue copy exchanged with the opposing team and the green copy retained in the book for the Club's records.
3. All match cards must be lodged within fourteen (14) days of the played game date. Failure to do so may result in forfeit being applied to offending team.

5.3 Premiership Points Table

1. The Board will publish on a regular basis Premiership Points Tables for each Competition/division.

5.4 Temporary Suspensions

1. Temporary suspensions (yellow cards) must be accurately recorded on the team sheets in all divisions.

5.5 Permanent Suspensions

1. A RED CARD issued to any one player in any one match will result in an automatic suspension from play for the balance of the game in which the card is issued. A red card shall be referred to the Judiciary Committee in accordance with By-Laws.
2. A player issued with a **Red Card must appear before a Judiciary hearing and cannot take the field prior to appearing before the Judiciary.**

6 Premiership Final Series and Presidents Cup

6.1 Determining Premiership Ladder Placings

1. After completion of all competition (fixture) matches, team placings on the premiership ladder shall be determined for each division. Premiership points awarded throughout the season are totalled and the premiership ladder is arranged in descending order, i.e. the team with the most premiership points appears at the top of the premiership ladder. In the event of equal points, the team with the greater goal difference shall be placed higher on the premiership ladder.

6. For the third period of “sudden death drop off”, only five (5) players from each team, including goalkeeper take the field.
7. Normal interchange rules will apply during Sudden Death Drop Off.
8. “Sudden Death” means the match will conclude once the first goal has been scored.

7 Communications

7.1 Wet Weather Procedures

1. All draw changes for Junior competition due to wet weather will be placed on GCHA Website no later than 1pm Friday. www.goldcoasthockey.com
2. If there are Regional games scheduled, the Junior delegate from the home club must contact GCHA asap if cancelling any games. GCHA will then contact the delegates of the travelling teams.

7.1.2 Postponement of Matches

1. In the event of the grounds being determined as unfit for play the matches will be postponed to a future date to be arranged by the GCHA Board. If a suitable date is not available the GCHA Board will decide what actions to take.

7.2 Communication with the GCHA Office

1. The telephone number of the GCHA. Office is 55 712244. The preferred method of communications is email. Requests for information such as fixture/training times should be addressed to the individual's Club Secretary and not to the GCHA office. Should your call not be answered when telephoning the GCHA Office, please leave a meaningful message on the answering machine. Include your name, contact number and the nature of your enquiry. 2. Further information such as fixtures, results, progressive points tables, venue locations, Club contacts, etc, can also be found on the Internet at: www.goldcoasthockey.com and is maintained by GCHA Office Administrator.

7.3 Courtesy in Communications

1. Most people who are involved with Hockey do so for the love of the sport. Most are volunteers. While there will be disagreements between people from time to time and the occasional mistake made, generally everyone is well intentioned. Most people can accept constructive criticism, however abusive verbal attacks are not acceptable, either on or off the field. *Think before you let fly!*

8 Player Insurance Claims

1. Should it be necessary for you to lodge a claim for injury, please contact the insurer, OAMPS LASER, by telephoning 3367 5160 to request the appropriate (hockey) form. Alternatively the (hockey) claim form may be downloaded from the OAMPS LASER Website: www.ieasport.com.au. 9 Turf Surface and User Manuals/Rules

1. The rules governing the use of the artificial surfaces for matches, training and/or supporters is contained in the respective **User Manuals** as prescribed by the relevant venue operators.

10 Using the GCHA Match Record Sheets

1. GCHA uses Team & Match Record Books to record the outcomes of matches. They are used in all Senior Divisions and most Junior Divisions.
2. GCHA will supply one book per registered team prior to the commencement of the season.

3. The aim of the following is to explain the correct way to use and fill in the Team & Match Record sheets. While filling in the sheets is mostly straight forward and in the main fairly obvious this document seeks to establish practical Association-wide standards. A copy of this section is generally included in each book.

10.1 Checking and Signing Summary

1. It is the responsibility of each of the captains/managers of the opposing teams to check that the details of the match have been correctly recorded on both teams' sheets. Once satisfied each captain is to sign in the spaces provided on both teams' sheets.
2. The match umpires are also required to check that the details of the match have been correctly recorded on both teams' sheets. Once the umpires are satisfied with the details they will each record legibly their name, umpire number and signature in the spaces provided. These details will be used as the basis for the payment of umpires.
3. Once completed and signed it is an offence for any further alterations to be made to the sheets.

10.2 Completed Sheets

1. Once the sheets have been completed, checked and signed as described, the "original" (white) copy is removed from each team's book while the blue copy is given to the opposing team, the green copy is retained in the books for the teams' and the clubs' records. The "original" copies must be dealt with as follows:
 - a. At turf venues it is the responsibility of the Manager/coaches to see that the "originals" from the match are returned to the GCHA office

11 Uniforms Players & Umpires

1. Shirt numbers to be displayed on the backs of playing club shirts.
2. Numbers must be a minimum of 15 cm in height. No two (2) players in the same team shall wear the same number.
3. No White socks as at 2010.
4. Uniforms to be standard throughout each Club, as per GCHA Uniform Registry, except when a second strip has been nominated and approved by GCHA. Players wearing incorrect team uniform will not be allowed to take the field. New players will be given 1 fixture round grace, to wear colours acceptable by teams & umpires.
5. Umpires shall wear an official GCHA umpire's shirt with black shorts/skirt/long pants and appropriate sports shoes.

12 Fees

1. To be determined by GCHA
2. Refunds
Any registered player who has played three (3) games or less may be eligible for a refund upon request to GCHA by their affiliated Club, an admin fee of \$10 and insurance component are non refundable.
3. Players registered after the June Long weekend will be charged a ProRata fee determined by GCHA. **Replace with the 10 game Fee.....**
