

The Sword and the Family

In the first few weeks of parenthood, the tears flowed fast and freely, and with very little provocation.

Sometimes I wept because it was getting dark out, and sometimes because the sun was coming up. Sometimes I wept because the days were so unbearably long. Sometimes I wept because they were so cruelly short and slipped past so quickly, bearing away with them forever these inaugural moments of my daughter's life — moments I knew I would long for on my deathbed.

So, the inclusion of the Presentation of Christ in the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary has always struck me. The Blessed Mother, just a few weeks after giving birth, standing at the holy temple: Is she tired? Is she emotional? Is she frightened? Is she happy? We cannot know for sure, but if she is anything like most of the postpartum women I know, she is all four. But she stands there dutifully, offering her baby to the Lord, and this is what she is told, "A sword shall pierce your heart."

Joyful? I would have snatched the baby back, called the police and sobbed for a week.

But Mary knows that Simeon speaks the truth, and she cannot receive God's will with anything less than joy, even if it means a pierced heart.

Family means love, but love means — what, exactly? Pleasure, fulfillment, contentment? Yes, but so much more, too. Love means you have much to lose.

How full is family life with these beautiful moments which, on the surface, look and feel painful — but hold within them the opportunity to be like Mary, to bow our heads and once again say "Yes, Lord."



St. Agnes Church Pew Renovation Project

The original pews at St. Agnes Church are in need of some attention. As a result, the pews have been beautifully recovered by Doug's Upholstery, a local business. In addition, new hymnal pocket racks have been installed. Further work is to be completed on supporting the middle brace of the pews, fixing kneelers and stabilizing backs. This work is being completed by another local business—Cowan's Custom Cabinetry. And lastly, the Music Ministry would like to order new Gather Music Books to replace our ageing Gather Books. The new Gather books are larger than the current volumes, thus the reason for replacing the Hymnal pockets.

- Total Estimated Cost of the entire project is \$45,000.
- Gracious Donations of \$20,000 have been received from:
 - The Church Foundation
 - The Altar Society
 - The Knights of Columbus
 - o Memorials from Theresa Rezac
- Funds to finish the project: \$25,000 which includes the final payments for Upholstery, Cowen's Custom Woodworking and purchasing the Gather Books. (Which will cost approximately \$4500.00)



Celebrating Sunday Feast of the Holy Family **Gospel:** Luke 2:22, 39-40

On the Way to Mass:

Baptism is our birth into the family of God; through it, we become members of the church. Share the story of you children's baptisms with them.

On the Way Home From Mass:

Today's Gospel tells us about Jesus, and that the favor of God was upon him. What could this mean, to live in the favor of God?

Living the Word:

How do we mark the baptism anniversary of the members of our family? Besides telling the story of the day, display photos (or show a video of the day), the baptismal candle, and the white garments in a special place or prayer table in your home. Ask your parish priest for some holy water and use it at home to bless one another. Finally, write a thank—you letter to godparents and the priest or deacon who baptized each family member.





Grinch Day was celebrated on December 15. Happy Holidays to All!




