The Hardness of Holiness

Want to know the words I find hardest to say? "Lord, give me the strength."

The world tells us to push ourselves outside of our comfort zone if we're training for a marathon or applying for a job — but if we're talking about God, everything is supposed to be easy. If it comes "naturally" or without struggle it's supposed to be right.

Only God is perfect, the world tells us. What's the use of trying so hard? I'm really good at finding excuses for myself, especially when it comes to holiness. Holiness, often (not always, but often), is about choosing the hard, but right, thing. The invitation to holiness is whispered in the hardest moments of my day when I am the most hopelessly human. After the kids' bedtime, when I really just want to watch Dateline and eat too much ice cream instead of saying the Rosary. When I've committed to helping someone, but it suddenly becomes incredibly inconvenient. When I see a social media post that's just begging for a snarky reply. When the conversation becomes gossip and I'm dying to make myself feel superior to someone.

The reason it's so difficult for me to mutter these five simple words is because I know that if I say them and I mean them, they form a prayer that God will always answer in the affirmative. He will give me the strength I ask for, and then I will have no excuse.

It's not unlike my kids claiming they're too tired to clean up the playroom. If they would just ask me for help, it would all be so doable. But where would that leave them? With a job to do, that's where.



<u>Old Palms Disposal</u>





Remember

The Lenten season is just around the corner. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.



The Liturgy Corner

The Sacrament of Penance

The experience of the sacrament of penance in the Roman rite will be slightly different this Lent, thanks to approved changes in the English translation set to take effect in a few weeks.

Starting Ash Wednesday—which takes place this year on Feb. 22—the prayer of absolution will include three modifications, so that the revised version will read as follows:

"God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and poured out [formerly "sent"] the Holy Spirit for [previously "Holy Spirit among us for"] the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God grant [instead of "give"] you pardon and peace. And I absolve you from your sins in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."


The new text was adopted by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops during its Spring 2021 meeting, with the Vatican's Dicastery (then-Congregation) for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments approving the text in April 2022. As of April 16, 2023, the Second Sunday of Easter known also as Divine Mercy Sunday, the revised formula for absolution is mandatory. The dicastery also approved another option for the penitent's Act of Contrition, in addition to the 10 prayers already approved by the

The dicastery also approved another option for <u>the penitent's Act of Contrition</u>, in addition to the 10 prayers already approved by the Holy See. The text of this newly approved prayer will be well known to many U.S. Catholics:

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins because of your just punishments, but most of all because they offend you, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen

"The essential part of the absolution formula has not changed," said Father Andrew Menke, executive director of the USCCB's Secretariat for Divine Worship, during an Oct. 25, 2022, webinar co-sponsored by his office and the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions. Parent Talk:

Lent often felt like a holy diet to me. I focused on cutting out sweets, alcohol, and snacking. I ended up, six weeks later, pounds lighter and not an ounce holier. When the children came along, I decided to look at the three pillars: prayer, penance, and almsgiving.

On Ash Wednesday Mass we each offered a sacrifice – a favorite toy, screen time, some luxury. Then, we agreed that each night before bedtime we would pray a decade of the Rosary and offer spontaneous prayer.

Finally, we spent the weeks setting aside gently used toys and clothes to donate at the end of the season. We also increased our contributions to the poor box at church.

The emphasis on God and the practices the Church encouraged brought us out of ourselves and helped us approach Easter with a new perspective. As my daughter said, "Isn't that the whole point of Lent?"




Pre-k just had their Valentine's Day party. They loved passing out their Valentines, playing bingo and eating their yummy treats. This next week they will be
