

#### The Second Sunday of Lent

Please help St. Agnes congratulate Sr. Vera on her retirement! She began her ministry by taking her vows on August 15, 1964. She has served as an active pastoral minister for the past 59 years. What an accomplishment!

Sr. Vera Meis grew up in a wonderful close family with her parents William & Elizabeth Meis and her six siblings, who taught her to appreciate her faith. Their motto was, "*The Family who prays together stays together*." Her faith was nurtured by the Holy Ghost Catholic Parish in Sharon Springs, KS and by the Sisters of St. Joseph at Marymount College. While in college at Marymount in Salina, KS she began to think about what she wanted to do with her life. The answer came when she was teaching about God, helping others, and



praying, and she knew she could do all that as a Sister. So, she visited the Sisters of St. Joseph in Concordia, KS. It was there that she felt so at home and said, "Yes, to the love of my life, Jesus, the one who has guided and blessed my life in every way." Sr. Vera's greatest joy has been the various ministries she has been engaged in: Teaching, Chaplaincy, Leadership, and Pastoral Ministry. To walk with people dealing with life's joys, sorrows, struggles and questions is a great honor and privilege for which I am most grateful," says Sr. Vera. "Some of my most memorable and touching experiences have been with those who are dying. I have felt the presence of God profoundly as I join with the one who is dying and their families in prayer. Being involved in grief ministry these past years has brought me so close to many families. and others."

St. Agnes was very blessed to have Sr. Vera as a pastoral minister. She served so many and became such a fixture of our parish. Sr. Vera recently moved back to her Motherhouse: Sisters of St. Joseph in Concordia, Kansas.



### The Long Walk

The walk down from Mount Tabor after the Transfiguration must have been a long one for Peter, James, and John. How differently they must have viewed the world with the eyes that had seen what they had just seen. How uncertain they must have been.

I think it's important to remember that, on the mountain, they were amazed, yes but first, they were afraid. We are given the image of these three grown men — these saints, these giants of salvation history ---cowering in fear at the voice of God. It was not until Jesus touched them that they could even bear to look up.

Christ was transfigured on Tabor, but in a way, the disciples were transfigured as well. We are all changed by what we see and what we hear. That change can be hard because knowledge is hard. Truth is hard. Sometimes cowering is easier.

Go forth, God told Abram. I will make of you a great nation.

Rise, Christ told his disciples. And do not be afraid.

I spend too much time cowering in fear at the voice of God. I cower even when the voice whispers into my heart instead of booming from the clouds. When it's the start of a hard day or a tough conversation. When it's the middle of a half-finished battle, big or small. When I know where Christ is and what he is asking, but I'm afraid because the walk down the mountain is so long, and the world that awaits me is so uncertain.

After Mass, light a candle for someone who passed away recently. Your parish family will join their prayers to yours.


Monday - March 6th Set out an empty box. Throughout Lent, add any unused clothes, books, or toys that are in good condition.

Fourth grade has finished many projects and lessons this last month! We have also started into some new concepts, activities, and lessons.
