



Pentecost Sunday

The Fame Communicated

"Fire! They're all gonna die! They're all gonna burn up!"

I had absolutely no hope of restoring order as I read the story of
Pentecost with my young children last year. As soon as they glimpsed the
tongues of fire hovering over the foreheads of the apostles, they were lost
to giggles and shrieks. I sighed, sipped my coffee, and wondered
resentfully why the Holy Spirit couldn't have chosen to be a dove on that
particular day. Just a nice, peaceful dove.

I'll say this, though: the fire left an impression. It usually does, doesn't it? Fire consumes. It renews. It illuminates. It leaves you breathless with fear and awe. The memory and scent and impact of a flame lingers long after it is extinguished.

When I am trying to explain theology to my kids, I have an awful habit of overcomplicating things. I'd had a whole speech prepared for them about what the Holy Spirit is, but it went out the window as soon as they saw the flames. And you know what? It's probably for the best. They wouldn't have remembered that speech. The flames, though? The flames they remembered. The flame communicated.

As a result of Pentecost, the apostles suddenly had the ability to give the truth to foreigners. Aliens. People who were heretofore beyond their reach, isolated by language. The flame communicated.

God's sense of timing is impeccable, and His delivery is carefully crafted. And on Pentecost, the Holy Spirit did not descend as a dove or pour forth as water.

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit burned.

"Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth." — Psalm 104

Listen for the words Jesus says in today's gospel: "Peace be with you." Where else in the Mass do we hear these words? Why do we say them?

On the Way Home From Mass:

What do you think the disciples felt before Jesus came and stood in their midst? After he breathed on them, how do you think they felt?

Living the Word:

The Holy spirit is waiting to be invited into everything you do. As a family, make it a habit to invite him into your every activity be saying, "Come, Holy Spirit. You are welcome here." Scripture Lessons:

John 20:19-23, God's transforming mercy

In this Gospel reading, the Apostles spent their first Easter Sunday fearfully hiding in a locked room. They were terrified the Romans would find them and execute them for being Jesus' students. Instead, Jesus appeared to them in glory and spoke words of peace. He showed them His wounds as "the living proof" of His Resurrection. He was alive!



That night, Jesus created the Sacrament of Penance, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained," (John 20:23). He knew we would need to hear the words of forgiveness. Having authority to forgive sins in His name, the Apostles and their successors could continue Jesus' work after he returned to Heaven.

What can parents do?

Jesus appeared to His Apostles in their darkest moments and gave them strength, peace, and grace to move forward. Tell children God doesn't wait for us to mess up, but instead prefers to keep us close. Teach them that when they fall into sin, don't waste time "hiding" from Jesus. Instead, seek Him out in Confession and celebrate His forgiveness.

Helping children encounter the Holy Spirit



At the Last Supper, Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit, the Counselor, who would remain with us to comfort, guide, and teach us (John 14:16, 26). Encourage children to:

Accept His gifts: Knowledge to know right from wrong, fortitude to stand up and be strong, understanding to follow God's way, piety to worship and pray, counsel to enlighten

and guide, wisdom to feel God's presence, fear of the Lord to always be awed by the mighty wonders of our God.

Listen for His voice: Even when "the still small voice" (1 Kings 19:12) reveals our wrongdoing, the Holy Spirit gently urges us back to the right path. Teach children to rely on Him for inspiration and guidance.

Asking Him to reveal God's love: God pours out His love to us through the Holy Spirit (Romans 5:5) and makes us His beloved children (Romans 8:15-16). When we accept this gift, we're empowered to extend it to others. Every day, pray together for your children to receive His love and grace.


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

Facility Updates

- The gym and school roofs were replace summer 2022
- Security upgrades continue to be made to ensure the safety of our students and staff. Additional cameras were added to the exterior of the building, Improvements were made to the front and back door security entrances boxes. A paging system that includes speakers throughout the building was installed for drill and communication purposes.
- The main floor boy's bathroom received upgrades.
- The kitchen garbage disposal was replaced.
- Gym upgrades will be made during the summer of 2023. The upgrades made are meant to improve school program and event experiences. 100 new folding chairs and new chair racks have been purchased. The stage curtains and sound system will be replaced this summer. ('23)

The RIT score is the overall score for a subject based on a Rasch unit (RIT) scale that indicates how a child performed in a subject.

Curriculum Upgrades

The Language Arts curriculum was replaced and began use in fall of 2021 (Wonders). A new math curriculum, Reveal, has been adopted and will begin use in fall 2023. A new religion curriculum, Blest Are We, has been adopted and will begin use in fall 2023.
