



The Invitation to the Vineyard

I have been working since I was 17, and in that time, I've encountered my fair share of bosses who don't like being, well, fair.

There was the retail gig that paid me less than the official minimum wage because I was a minor and scheduled me for long shifts because it meant cheaper labor. There was the restaurant manager who tried to convince me to leave seventh period early so I could waitress on a busy dinner shift (totally illegal, by the way). There was the unpaid internship with the editor who had no sense of work/life balance.

Our resumes are all full of these experiences — it's capitalism, after all. It conditions us to look out for ourselves, because we know no one else will. And it breeds an attitude of suspicion that often blooms into jealousy when we encounter the reckless mercy of God.

Most of us work hard for what we have in this life, and so we make the mistake of thinking we deserve the good things that come our way. That's all right and good when we're talking about a just wage. But sometimes we get our lines blurred and we begin to think we deserve, or have done something to earn, the salvation offered by Christ.

I am not the laborer who has borne the heat of long hours in the sun. I am the straggler, the lost one, the idler at the marketplace as the day draws to a close.

What's Happening at St. Agnes School.....

The past five weeks have flown by! The students have adjusted quite well to second grade. We start our day after announcements and prayers with a morning meeting. We talk about calendar events, weather, and review telling time. Our math time starts after that with a review of math concepts using our math bulletin board. Some of the concepts taught during this time are solving word problems, fact families, greater than and less than, arrays, missing addends, money, time, shapes, and decomposing numbers. In our math book, we are learning about place-value to 100.

In science, we are studying plants and animals. One of the topics included in the unit is the life cycles of both. We have made some take-home crafts representing these life cycles.

In reading, we are learning how to take vocabulary tests. This is a new skill that they have not had before. They study eight words and then have to be able to match the correct word to the definition. They are doing great! The stories that we are reading for this unit revolve around families, friendship, and working together. These are perfect topics to cover at the beginning of the year.

One of our STEM activities this month was to see if students could get a gummy lifesaver on a gummy worm using paper clips instead of their

fingers. With the help of a friend, they were able to accomplish this task. It was fun to see the ideas and brainstorming going on.

The school year is off to a great start and 5th graders are already hard at work and looking forward to all the amazing things that are set to happen in their final year at St. Agnes School.

5th grade brings about lots of responsibilities beyond just our academics. Everyone in the class has trained as a lunchroom helper and is assigned to duty once a week. The majority have also trained to be altar servers and will serve in this role at both school and weekend Masses. Most of the class has taken on the opportunity to participate in band or orchestra and several will be sharing their talents with the Singspirations group and their hearts and hands with the student council. Being the oldest In the school means being ready to set a good example, and this group of students is up to the challenge.

Our classroom studies are keeping us busy. We are enjoying a group novel, *Holes*, and created a diorama of one of the settings. In math, we are working hard to master volume. While in science, we are learning about matter and its different properties. We did a cool science investigation using different properties to identify unknown substances. A highlight in social studies was watching an informative documentary on 9-11. We are excited about our new religion series

and the upcoming Discipleship Fridays where we will learn more about the Eucharist.

We are off and running in 5th grade and are ready to let our lights shine bright to make a difference in our school and in the world!
