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MORE THAT JUST FACT Romans 1: 3-4; 4: 25; Acts 17: 31 I Corinthians 15: 19-20

When it comes to believing the Bible, it means more than just believing the FACTS stated. Take the DEATH of Christ, for instance. Believing in the DEATH of Christ is more than just believing in the FACT that He died. Who did He die for? Why did He die? Why was His death necessary? What did His death accomplish? These are all things you must understand if you (truly) believe in the death of Christ.

Today we are going to apply that reasoning to the Resurrection of Christ. **The** resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is a FACT. **It is** a HISTORIC fact. **It is** a BIBLICAL fact. **It is** a GOSPEL fact. **But**, it is so much more that (just) FACT. **In our** lesson today we will consider some things DECLARED by the resurrection of Christ. **These** are things that will take us BEYOND the fact.

First, though I want us to (briefly) consider the fact. I don't want to spend a lot of time on this because most (professing) Christians believe (adamantly) that Christ was raised from the dead. History records the FACT of Christos resurrection. It is a HISTORICAL fact.

Christ's resurrection is, also, a BIBLICAL fact. Look at Acts 2: 22-24 "Ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know:

- 23 Him, being delivered by the determinate counsel and foreknowledge of God, ye have taken, and by wicked hands have crucified and slain:
- 24 Whom God hath raised up, having loosed the pains of death: because it was not possible that he should be holden of it."

It was NECESSARY for Christ to go the Cross. It was NECESSARY that He die. But, it was not POSSIBLE that death should hold Him. Christ's resurrection is a BIBLICAL fact.

Christ's resurrection is a GOSPEL fact. Look at I Corinthians 15: 12 "Now if Christ be preached that he rose from the dead, how say some among you that there is no resurrection of the dead?"

Apparently some in the Church at Corinth were questioning whether there was a bodily resurrection. **Paul** affirms that there is by affirming Christøs resurrection.

Look at I Corinthians 15: 13-15 "But if there be no resurrection of the dead, then is Christ not risen:

- 14 And if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain.
- 15 Yea, and we are found false witnesses of God; because we have testified of God that he raised up Christ: whom he raised not up, if so be that the dead rise not.

To preach the resurrection of Christ but deny the (bodily) resurrection of those in Him is a contradiction. **Christ's** resurrection is PROOF that there is a resurrection. **Christ** was raised,

but not as a private person. He was raised as a Representative, which means that ALL who die in Him will be raised. Christ's resurrection is the SUBSTANCE of Gospel preaching; not just the FACT of His resurrection; but, what it means that He was raised.

Look at I Corinthians 15:16-18 "For if the dead rise not, then is not Christ raised: 17 And if Christ be not raised, your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins. 18Then they also which are fallen asleep in Christ are perished."

Again, to deny the (bodily) resurrection of sinners is to deny Christøs resurrection. **And**, that makes the Gospel a õvainö (empty and worthless) message. **It leaves** believing without any substance. **It means** that those who die in Christ die without hope.

Look at I Corinthians 15: 19-20 "If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable.

20 ¶ But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept."

If this life is all we have, (i.e. if there is no life beyond/no bodily resurrection), then, those of us who believe the Gospel are most miserable. **But,** thankfully, that is NOT the case. **Christ** was raised from the dead. **And**, He is the õfirstfruitsö; He is the forerunner of all who die in Him. **Christ's** resurrection is a Gospel FACT.

It is easy to see that Christøs resurrection is an established FACT. **It is** a Historical/Biblical/Gospel FACT. **But**, it is MORE, (so much more), than JUST fact. **Christ** was raised again õaccording to the scripturesö.

Look at 1 Corinthians 15: 1-4 "Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand;

- 2 By which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain.
- 3 For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures;
- 4 And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day <u>according to the</u> scriptures:"

Christ rose again õaccording to the scripturesö. The scriptures have much more to say about Christøs resurrection than the MERE fact of it. Christ's resurrection is a DECLARATION from God.

Today we will consider four things that the scriptures (clearly) show Christøs resurrection to DECLARE. **These** are (scriptural) truths DECLARED (specifically) by Christøs resurrection. **They** take us beyond the FACT that

Christ was raised to WHO was raised, WHY He was raised, and WHAT His resurrection means for those who rest their hope of eternity in Him ALONE.

FIRST, Christøs resurrection DECLARES Him to be the õSon of God with powerö.

Look at Romans 1: 1-4 "Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, separated unto the gospel of God,

- 2 (Which he had promised afore by his prophets in the holy scriptures,)
- 3 Concerning his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David according to the flesh;
- 4 And <u>declared to be the Son of God with power</u>, according to the spirit of holiness, <u>by the</u> resurrection from the dead:"

Christ's resurrection from the dead DECLARES that He is the Son of God; and, it DELCARES that He is the Son of God WITH POWER. I think these are two related (but separate) things. Let's look at them that way.

First, what about Christøs resurrection DECLARES, Him to be the Son of God? **Christ** went to the Cross bearing the sins (the Legal guilt) of those He was given. **He** went there to suffer the Just punishment His sheep deserved. **This** punishment is infinite. "**The** wages of sin is deathö-ETERNAL death. **Infinite** punishment is required because God is INFINITE.

Only One who is God, (One whose sacrifice had infinite value), could bear that penalty that punishment and live to tell about it. **Only** One who is God could make an end of sins. **Only** One who is God could satisfy Godøs inflexible justice.

No sinner who dies in his/her sins will ever satisfy Godøs demand for punishment. That is why their separation from God is eternal. They can never make an end of sins; because they can never make the payment required.

God raised Christ from the dead because His justice was satisfied and because the Righteousness by which He justifies had been established. Christ's obedience unto death had accomplished both. That is how Christ's resurrection DECLARES Him to be the Son of God.

Next, how does Christos resurrection DECLARE Him to be the Son of God WITH POWER?

Christ has always been a Person of õpowerö. He is the Eternal Word with omnipotent (unlimited) õpowerö.

Look at John 1: 1-3 "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

- 2 The same was in the beginning with God.
- 3 All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made."

Christ, (the eternal WORD), created everything. **Not** only did He create everything, He also UPHOLDS everything. **By** Him all things oconsisto (i.e. They are held together.)

Look at Colossians 1: 15-17 "Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature:

16 For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him:

17 And he is before all things, and by him all things consist."

Not only is Christ the Eternal WORD with the õpowerö to create and uphold all things, when He walked on the earth (as God-man), He was given õpowerö. **He** had the õpowerö of God. **He** was given the Spirit õwithout measureö. **He** performed 100¢s of miracles to prove this õpowerö. **And,** we could look at many examples.

But, look at Luke 4:36 "And they were all amazed, and spake among themselves, saying, What a word is this! for with authority and power he commandeth the unclean spirits, and they come out."

Not only was Christ given the õpowerö (of miracles), He also, gave this õpowerö to His disciples.

Look at Luke 9: 1-2 "Then he called his twelve disciples together, and gave them power and authority over all devils, and to cure diseases.

2 And he sent them to preach the kingdom of God, and to heal the sick."

What Iøm showing here is that Christ has always been a Person of great õpowerö. **But** the õpowerö spoken of in our text is a DIFFERENT õpowerö.

Look back at Romans 1: 4 "And <u>declared to be the Son of God with power</u>, according to the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead:"

This is SPECIFIC õpowerö. **This is** õpowerö which Christ EARNED by the work He finished. **It is** the õpowerö of life (Not just to HAVE live but to GIVE life).

Look at I Corinthians 15: 45. "And so it is written, The first man Adam was made a living soul; the last Adam was made a quickening spirit."

The first Adam was made a living soul. **But,** Christ (the last Adam) was õmade a quickening (life giving) spiritö. **By** His obedience unto death; by the righteousness He established, Christ EARNED the right to give eternal life to every sinner whose salvation His Father entrusted to Him.

Look at John 17: 1-2 "These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee:

2 As thou hast given him power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him."

This is the õpowerö REVEALED and DECLARED by Christøs resurrection from the dead. **The** FIRST thing DECLARED by Christøs resurrection: **It** DECLARED Him to be the Son of God; the Infinite I Am; with the POWER to give (eternal) life to as many as He has been given.

The SECOND thing Christøs resurrection DECLARES is: That by His obedience unto death He accomplished EVERYTHING necessary for the Justification of His people.

Look at Romans 4: 23-25 "Now it was not written for his sake alone, that it was imputed to him:

24 But for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up <u>Jesus</u> our Lord from the dead;

25 Who was delivered for our offences, and was raised again for our justification."

NO SINNER Christ died for will perish. **His** resurrection DECLARES that. **He** was oraised againo because He had accomplished everything necessary for the justification of EVERY sinner whose offences He bore on the Cross. **He** went to the Cross bearing THEIR offences. **And,** He was oraised againo because He had answered all the charges against THEM. **He** was oraised againo because He had established the (one) righteousness THEY needed to stand eternally righteous in Godos sight. **God** is just to declare them so by Christos righteousness imputed.

The THIRD thing DECLARED by Christøs resurrection is: That His righteousness is Godøs STANDARD of Judgment.

Look at Acts 17: 29-31 "Forasmuch then as we are the offspring of God, we ought not to think that the Godhead is like unto gold, or silver, or stone, graven by art and man's device.

- 30 And the times of this ignorance God winked at; but now commandeth all men everywhere to repent:
- 31 Because he hath appointed a day, in the which <u>he will judge the world in righteousness</u> by that man whom he hath ordained; whereof <u>he hath given assurance unto all men</u>, in that he hath raised him from the dead."

The prophet Daniel foretold that Christ would omake and end of sins and bring in everlasting righteousnessö. Christ's resurrection from the dead is a DECLARATION from God that He FULFILLED that prophecy; that He ofinishedo that work.

Christ's resurrection from the dead is a DECLARATION from God that the righteousness established by Christ's obedience unto death is God's STANDARD of judgment. I.e. You will stand before God and be counted (unchangeably) righteous based on Christ's righteousness accounted/imputed to you. Or, you will stand (forever) condemned under God's eternal wrath because you have no righteousness that answers the demands of God's holy law and inflexible justice.

Here is a question for all who have heard (and understood) Godøs Gospel: "Has the Gospel changed your STANDARD of judgment? **Do** you (now) judge (salvation) by a DIFFERENT Standard than you did BEFORE you heard the Gospel and Godøs STANDARD? **Do** you NOW judge by Christøs righteousness imputed ALONE? That is STANDARD (Declared) by Christøs resurrection.

The FOUTH thing DECLARED by Christøs resurrection is HOPE; **HOPE** for all who are in Him. **This** is HOPE (the ONLY hope) for sinners who deserve nothing but Godøs eternal wrath and judgment.

Look at 1 Corinthians 15: 19-20 "If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable.

20 ¶ But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept." Christ is the õfirstfruitsö (the forerunner) of all who die IN HIM. In the Mosaic Economy the õfirstfruitsö were an indication of the harvest. Representatively, Godøs people are already partakers of Christ, the õfirstfruitsö.

Look at Ephesians 2: 4-7 "<u>But God</u>, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us, 5 Even when we were dead in sins, <u>hath quickened us together with Christ</u>, (by grace ye are saved;) 6 And <u>hath raised us up together</u>, and <u>made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus</u>:

7 That in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in his kindness toward us through Christ Jesus."

Representatively, God has õquickened usö (made us alive). **He** has õraised us up. He has õmade us sit together in heavenly places in Christö. **And**, He has done all this in order that at the appointed time, He will raise us up and give us new (spiritual) bodies. **Christ's** resurrection is a GUARANTEE of the resurrection of EVERY sinner who is found in Him. **This** õcorruptible must put on incorruption and this mortal must put on immortalityö (I Cor 15: 53).

Look at John 6: 37-40 "All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out. 38 For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me.

- 39 And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day.
- 40 And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day."

This is the confidence of every believing sinner. **Not** the confidence of being one of Godøs elect. **But,** the confidence that Christ will MOST CERTAINLY raise up every sinner He was given; every sinner He died for. **This** is the will of the Father. **And,** because of Christøs work ALONE, it cannot fail to happen. **Our** confidence is that Christ will do the will of His Father concerning those He was given.

The CERTAINTY of this resurrection is the motivation for the life believers live out on the earth AFTER our spiritual regeneration and conversion.

Look at Colossians 3:1-2 "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God.

- 2 Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth."
- 3 For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God.
- **I.e.** If you see yourselves saved and kept by the doing and dying of Christ ALONE, act accordingly. **Nothing in** this life can change the STANDING of a sinner whom God has put in Christ.

Look at Galatians 6: 14-16 "But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world.

- 15 For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision, but a new creature.
- 16 And as many as walk according to this rule, peace be on them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God."

The world is crucified to every sinner in Christ by His doing and dying ALONE. We are crucified to the world when we learn of His work on our behalf and rest our whole salvation in Him.

The Bible speaks õpeaceö and proclaims õmercyö to those who see the resurrection of Christ as MORE THAN JUST FACT. **They** walk by a DIFFERENT õruleö; the Gospel õruleö. **And,** they (alone) are õthe Israel of Godö.

Many (professing) õChristiansö believe the FACT of Christøs resurrection. **They** look at passages like Romans 10 and find confidence that they are saved.

Look at Romans 10: 8-11 "The word (of faith) is nigh thee, even in thy mouth, and in thy heart: that is, the word of faith, which we preach;

- 9 That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.
- 10 For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.
- 11 For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed."

The EMPHASIS is oconfessing the Lord Jesusö. It is oconfessing the God-man recorded in the scriptures. It is oconfessing the salvation that is conditioned on and accomplished by His doing and dying ALONE. It is oconfessing God glorified in salvation ONLY by His righteousness imputed ALONE.

The EMPHASIS is õbelieving ON HIMÖ. **This** is MORE than trusting in a õhistorical Jesusö. **It** is MORE that believing the FACT of His resurrection. **I.e.** It is more than just believing that God raised a dead body to life. **It** is believing that Christ was raised õaccording to the scripturesö.

And, the scriptures show Christøs resurrection to be a DECLARATION from God. **By** His resurrection from the dead, Christ is DECLARED:

- 1. **To be** the Son of God (the Infinite I Am), with opowero to give eternal to every sinner He was given.
- 2. **To have** accomplished everything necessary for God to Justify (declare eternally righteous) His chosen people.
- 3. To have established Godøs STANDARD of Judgment.
- 4. **To be** the HOPE of eternal life to all who die IN HIM.

May God enable His people to see beyond the FACT of Christøs resurrection to those things the scriptures clearly show His resurrection to DECLARE.
