#### **Annual Meeting** and Reunion

The annual meeting of the Friends of the James Farm will take place at the Park Place Hotel in Kansas City from 1-2 P.M., Saturday, July 25. At this meeting we will have our reports, elections, and several short historical and genealogical presentations. At six o'clock on Saturday night, NOLA will have a reception; the banquet follows and after that relatives will be introduced to the audience. For those who plan on attending the Saturday meeting only, the registration fee will be \$25.00 a person. That includes the banquet. If you plan on coming for the entire rendez-vous, the fee is \$50.00. This will include a bus tour of historic sites and a cook-out and the drama "The Life and Times of Jesse James."

#### Park Place Hotel

This lovely hotel is located on I-435 just south of the Missouri River in eastern Kansas City, Missouri. It has 330 beautiful recently redecorated rooms, and 2,000 free parking spaces. It will provide free transportation to and from Kansas City International Apport. Equivalent to a savings of about \$30.00 per person.

A special room rate of only \$48.00 for up to four persons in a room per night has been established for us. That's far less than half their normal rate. It is indeed a great bar-in, but you must register before July 7 to

certain of that low rate. Use the registration card enclosed with this issue or call the hotel toll free: 800-821-8532.

The hotel features a fine restaurant open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. A speacial lunch buffet is served in the Unwinder Lounge, which has entertainment in the evenings. In addition, Smuggler's Inn Restaurant and Lounge also featuring live entertainment is next door to the hotel. Several fast food restaurants are a couple of minutes drive away.

For those who don't want to bother with breakfast, the hotel has coffee stations along the corridors outside the rooms where you can make your own coffee free of charge and take it to your room.

Bring your swimming suits! Your registra-admits you to the large indoor-outdoor pool, health club, lighted tennis courts, and a jogging area. If you want to just relax and laze around, you can watch the ducks on the lake and the giant fountain. Remember, you must register before July 7 to get this low, low rate. Why not share a room and save money? You can stay for as little as \$12.00 a night if you do. That's a steal even Jesse James didn't get in on!

## 1987 Reunion and Annual Meeting

The 1987 Annual Reunion of the James and Allied Families and the annual meeting of the friends of the James Farm will be held at the Park Place Hotel in Kansas City, Missouri, Saturday, July 25, 1987, instead of out at the Farm. Please make a note of this important date now!!!

This has come about in an interesting and exciting way. The National Center for the Study of Outlaw and Lawman History affiliated with the University of Wyoming, has chosen to have its 1987 Rendezvous in Kansas City at the Park Place Hotel, July 23-25, and have invited the Friends of the James Farm and the Friends of the Youngers to join them. Historians from all over the United States will attend and have requested we present programs about the James and Youngers to a national audience. The program is included here. Members of both Friends groups are invited to attend the Conference by paying the same registration fee as the NOLA group: \$50.00 for the entire meeting, or \$25.00 for the Saturday meetings only. Both fees include the gourmet Saturday night banquet at which descendants and relatives of outlaws and lawmen will be recognized.

The Park Place has established a special, very low room rate for this meeting of \$48.00 per night, for as many as four persons in one room. (That breaks down to only \$12.00 each per night for a room full, cheaper than staying home!).

The three days of programs will feature nationally known speakers, the banquet, numerous western exhibits of art and literature, two receptions, and a historical tour and special night at the outdoor historical drama "The Life and Times of Jesse James."

The tours will visit the graves of Frank and Jesse James, Cole Younger, the scene of the famous Kansas City Union Station Massacre, and the restored jail where Frank was kept awaiting trial. You will also get a chance to see the new museum at the James Farm and the multi-media show about the Jameses.

Other articles give details about the program, the hotel and the tours.

Optional tours of Harry Truman historic sites and St. Joseph, Missouri, will be available.

### Another Jesse James Hide-Out?

We understand that in southern Mississippi there is a story that claims that Frank and Jesse James had an outlaw camp in Jackson County, not far from Pascagoula. It was a place where wanted outlaws could hide for a while, at a price — at a very high price. Apparently the place, away back in the swamps, was operated for profit and was known throughout the outlaw world.

It is known that the James Gang did operate in that part of the nation, holding up a bank in Corinth, Mississippi, and robbing a government payroll messenger near Muscle Shoals, Alabama. Whatever the truth of this is, we hope our readers will send us stories of this type for they fit into the pattern of Jesse James being a part of American folklore.

It really doesn't matter whether these stories are actual events or not. What is important is their place in our folklore. Unless we gather them and put them in print they may be lost, for most folklore is a word of mouth thing, and too much of it is not recorded and is lost to history.
