† Pastor's Letter †

Dear Siblings in Christ,

I'd like to share with you my thoughts on some wordings that we use regularly during Sunday Worship Service. My desire is to make changes in these two wordings. One is in the Lord's Prayer and the other at the end of Scripture Reading. I've been thinking about this for a long time and had chances to talk about them with small group bible study groups. For all the guiding thoughts and theological understandings, I'd like to give credit to three books written by Rev. Adam Hamilton: "Making Sense of the Bible" (2014), "Half Truth" (2016), and "Doubt" (2023). I think it is time to change these wordings and remove a barrier that may cause some misunderstandings about God and the Bible. Here are they:

(1) "Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil" in the Lord's Prayer will be changed to "Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil."

The reason for this change is that the current wording may imply that it is God who leads us into temptation. But the Bible tells us that God is not a tempter. Even though Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness, it was not the Holy Spirit (or God) but Satan (devil, tempter, liar) who tempted Jesus after 40 days of fasting. James, Jesus' half-brother, said: "No one, when tempted, should say, 'I am being tempted by God,' for God cannot be tempted by evil and he himself tempts no one. But one is tempted by one's own desire, being lured and enticed by it" (James 1:13-14). It is a wrong understanding of God that He is the source of temptation, of trial or of hardship. Some Christians try to comfort those suffering/struggling by saying "God won't give you more than you can handle." Telling it to someone grieving the loss of a child can be incredibly insensitive and even hurtful. It implies that God intentionally caused the tragedy and is now testing their ability to cope. Such a notion can lead to feelings of anger, devastation, and even rejection of faith (see Chapter 3 of Half Truth). God does not give us a disaster and later comfort or healing. Life happens. Nature brings disasters in its own cycle. Satan tempts us. Ill-minded or irresponsible people cause tragedies. When we are in trouble, however, our loving God never leaves us alone or let us down but always be there to help us come through it.

Catholic Church changed the wording into "do not let us fall into temptation but deliver us from evil" in 2017. But I think this wording still may imply that it is God who does let us fall into temptation. I prefer the new version suggested by the Upper Room Worship Book (2016) which is "Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil." This makes it clear that God is the Savior and Deliverer.

(2) "This is the word of God for the people of God" at the end of each Scripture readings will be changed to "This is the word of the Holy Scripture for the people of God."

The reason for this change is that the current wording implies that every word in the Bible is the word of God, even *literally*. In the Bible, there are passages reflecting the timeless will of God such as "Love your neighbor as yourself!" while some reflect God's will in a particular time but not for all time such as ritual laws of the Old Testament – no tattoo or no trimming beard (Lev 19:27-28). On the other hand, some others reflect the culture and historical circumstances in which they were written but never reflect God's timeless will such as slavery or ethnic cleansing through war or discriminatory remarks against some particular groups like women, children, the disabled, etc. Rev. Hamilton says, "Rather than attempting to justify such things, we should loudly condemn these teachings and commands and make clear that this did not ever reflect the will of God" (p.273, Making Sense of the Bible). The Bible is the foundation of our faith, the guiding light on our feet and the means of saving grace. So, we will cherish, read and meditate on it as long as we live. That is why we read them during our worship service. We cannot proclaim however that they are the word of God *literally* after we read the passage about ethnic cleansing in the name of God. So, rather than we keep saying "This is the word of God for the people of God," I'd like to suggest to say "This is the word of the Holy Scripture for the people of God."

I am planning to change these wordings from Palm Sunday March 24th, since we need some time to let everybody know about these. I'd like to welcome your thoughts, feedback, or suggestions in the meantime.

"Lent is about Becoming, Doing, and Changing whatever it is that is blocking the fullness of life in us right now.




We believe love in action can change the world

S - SPECIFIC M - MEASURABLE A - ACTIONABLE R - REALISTIC T - TIMELY



SPECIAL EASTER OFFERING goes to HOPE HOUSE!



BCUMC Food Policy By Heidi Stark

A number of people have asked Ad. Council to reevaluate our current food policy and lift the ban on homemade items. We will take this issue to a vote at Ad. Council on March 13th. Any change to the current policy would go into effect in April. Our food policy was changed in November following an incident of food poisoning. Ten people suffered from food poisoning and six of those people had to seek medical attention. We must be sensitive to those who were directly impacted by the incident. It is easy for those of us who were not affected in the November incident to dismiss the issue; however, all opinions and feelings are valid and important, and we want everyone to be heard and respected. We do believe that what happened in November was an accident; it was not intentional, and it is unlikely to happen again. We want BCUMC to be a safe and hospitable space for everyone. I am reaching out to those who were involved in the November food poisoning, but all opinions will be considered. Please let us know your thoughts and recommendations for hospitality at BCUMC going forward. You may leave feedback in the suggestion box at the back of the sanctuary or contact Pastor Lee, or Lay Leader, Dave Funk or Ad. Council Chair/Lay Leader, Heidi Stark. We will vote on this matter at the March Ad. Council meeting; so, please reach out by March 13 if you strongly feel one way or the other. We look forward to hearing from you.

Frequent Questions about Lent:

- What is Tenebrae Service for Good Friday? "Tenebrae" is the Latin word meaning "darkness." The service of Tenebrae as practiced in most Protestant Churches is typically held at night on Maundy Thursday or Good Friday. Tenebrae is a prolonged meditation on Christ's suffering. Readings trace the story of Christ's passion, music portrays his pathos, and the power of silence and darkness suggests the last journey of Jesus Christ. As lights are extinguished, we ponder the depth of Christ's suffering and death; we remember the cataclysmic nature of his sacrifice; and through the return of the small but persistent flame of the Christ candle at the conclusion of the service, we anticipate the joy of ultimate victory.
- What do we call the Friday before Easter "good"? "Our name for the Friday before Easter, "Good Friday," is most likely related to the English and the Dutch, the only two languages that use this term, which etymologists say is likely an alteration of the Germanic word, "Goddes," meaning "God's" or "Holy." That term does not mean "good." The day is called *Holy* Friday in nearly all other languages in the world. Good Friday, or Holy Friday as most of the rest of the world calls it in their languages, proclaims God's purpose of loving and redeeming the world even in the face of human rejection and cruelty through the cross of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is a day that is holy and makes us holy because God was drawing the world to God's self in Christ." (https://www.umc.org/en/content/ask)

How long is Lent? Do Sundays count in Lent? Lent lasts 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Holy Thursday, excluding Sundays. Sundays are an important part of Lent, but we do not include them in the "40 days" because on every Sunday we remember and celebrate the Resurrection of Christ in the Mass.

These are just suggestions, and every bag will be different with a focus on hygiene items for all. The more items and variety of items we collect will mean we can create more bags. A Blessing Bag is a small bag filled with essential items that can be provided to the homeless. Each bag is filled with simple items to help someone get through the day. Hygiene items, snacks, and inspirational materials are common blessing bag items.

The items we collect during Lent will be used to assemble Blessing Bags at our Sunday Night Live event on April 28th. We will gather at 5pm to share a meal and put together the Blessing Bags. The completed bags will be distributed throughout our community to help those in need. Please plan to join us for a time of fellowship and service.
