#### Dear Friends in Ministries of Christ

HAPPY NEW YEAR! We are receiving gifts of 366 days in a new year since the year 2024 is a leap year. Every day will be a different gift to us even though they may look and feel very similar to one another. I hope and pray that all of you are excited to open your gift each morning and use them as a channel of blessing, growing and healing. May God help us all!

I am inspired to pursue the Conference Vision Statement for 2024:

- 1. Following Jesus
- 2. Thriving in Community
- 3. Healing the World

I will focus on "Following Jesus" from January to April, "Thriving in Community" from May to August," and "Healing the World" from September to December. I will try to do that through my messages, pastoral letters, and prayers. I am not sure how much I can achieve this goal. But I will pray and ask for help to the Holy Spirit that my journey be meaningful and relevant to my congregation.

Jesus changed the world from darkness to light, from despair to hope, and from fear of death to joy of new life. I am fearfully excited to "Follow Jesus" and always pray that I be humble, genuine, and faithful as I follow my Jesus. I am not the only one who is in love with Jesus this way. I was very happy to see our sanctuary fully packed on Christmas Eve. 78 people filled the pews in person and total 83 were present including online participants. That was the highest attendance in a very long time since the pandemic. While regulars are out of town, others fill the pews on Christmas Eve. It has been that way like our tradition. Worshippers on Christmas Eve are not just guests and visitors but also our own members and their families who have not come to church throughout the year. They show up on Christmas Eve for Candlelight Service and join the congregation to celebrate the birth of Jesus. I find it very precious and wonderful. No one can judge their faith as less faithful. We are all different. My husband needs 6 hours while I need 8 hours of sleep daily. He drinks water constantly while I do it barely. Likewise, spiritual walks are all different depending on the person's need and style. That's why I prepare a sermon diligently for Christmas Eve. I know that the worshippers came because they love Jesus and they were there to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ – forgiveness, redemption, a new life and eternal gifts. I was so glad that I delivered the message based on the movie, Christmas Carol, which was about redemption available for everyone, even a person like Scrooge. No one is beyond the reach of God's redemptive love. Scrooge turned into Ebenezer, the one who was helped by God to become more like Christ.

We will continue to take our journey together from Christmas to Epiphany in January. Let us celebrate the presence of Jesus in and among us and follow Him, His way, His words, His actions, His rituals, His prayers and His love for God and God's Kindom!

Many thanks to those who helped provide refreshment for the reception after the Annual Christmas Musical Program on December 16th; it was a wonderful event.







We continue to support HOPE House an important food and clothing ministry in our community, we have a new organ, a new order of worship, Sunday School classes that took place all year, an ongoing adult Sunday School program, a new chairperson for the Reconciling Committee, we established a new Communications Committee, we adopted a faith based budget at the beginning of 2023 and ended the year in the black, we gained new members, and celebrated several baptisms. 


