## ◆ Pastor's Letter ◆

#### Dear Friends in Ministry

Many people told me that both Saturday and Sunday were well prepared and attended. Former pastors' memories and messages were inspiring. We were confirmed that our "friendly" and "kind" character as a congregation had started a long time ago. Pastor Ellen Rowan told me that she had received so much love as she served the congregation. "What is your dream?" "What do you like about the church?" etc. And she incorporated what she heard from people into her sermon and benediction. Personally, I loved her benediction best. It was like she was reading everybody's mind. Before she left, she blessed me with prayer in the parking lot. And she said, "Please let me know when your BIG DREAM begins to appear!"

Yes, our dream will continue to grow as we pay attention and listen carefully to the guidance of God. That big dream has already begun with the installation of Youth Director and the blessing of Confirmands/ Mentors/ Teachers during the Service. Let us keep praying for them and for our church! We are so blessed!

Rev. Dr. Rebecca Irelan (Willow Glen UMC in San Jose, CA)

Rebecca Irelan was born in Iowa, raised in Montana and is at least third generation Methodist. She attended Boston University, a Methodist school, where she started as a pre-med religion

major. She received her call to ordained ministry in her sophomore year on the way to an organic chemistry exam! After graduation, Rebecca enrolled at Duke Divinity, another Methodist school, and served parishes in Idaho and Oregon before returning to graduate school in 1996. It wasn't until she entered the doctoral program in systematic and philosophical theology at the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, a program dominated by Catholics and Lutherans, that Rebecca discovered her inner Wesley. She ended up writing her dissertation on Wesley's ideas about sanctification and how we can test and prove the power of those ideas in the 21st century.


