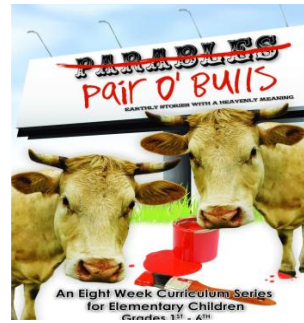


Lesson Three - Key Word Forgive- January 21st & 22nd

Birth – Kindergarten

Forgive others over and over. Matthew 18:21-22



Grades 1 – 5

Peter came to Him and asked, "Lord, how often should I forgive someone who sins against me? Seven times?" "No!" Jesus replied, "seventy times seven!" Matthew 18:21-22 NLT

Day One:

Take your Bible and read this week's "Parable" together as a family. The parable is called "The Unforgiving Servant." Do you remember where it's found? (Matthew 18:21-35) After you read the parable, retell the story to your parents in your own words using made up names or the names of your friends as the characters.

Day Two:

Our word for this lesson is "Forgive." In our lesson we learned that the servant was forgiven a very large debt by the king. Later, that servant wouldn't forgive someone who only owed him a few dollars. The King heard about this and had the servant thrown into jail until he could repay the large debt. According to this parable, forgiveness is very important to God. Can you think of someone you need to forgive? Write the name of the person you are thinking about here and pray for the right words to say to them.

Day Three:

Our key word for this lesson is "FORGIVE." Take a few minutes and write a sentence for each letter in the word that would best describe what it means to be kind to others. The "I and V" are done for you. You can also draw a picture of you showing forgiveness to someone!

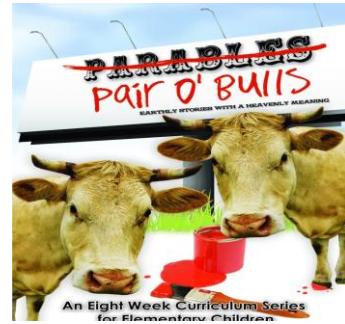
