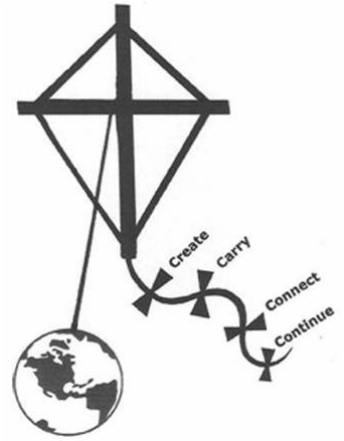

2009...To Create

“Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.”

Psalm 51:10

The cross is the center of creating a relationship with God through the redeeming love of Jesus. Creating means keeping a fresh perspective and looking with new eyes to programs, needs and resources.

2010...To Carry
