

Newburgh, NY Aug 25, 2008 - The ALNRS returned to the Adirondack Int. Speedway this past weekend where Randolph, VT driver Dylan Smith one upped his previous finish at the circle shaped oval in upstate NY in his Randolph National Bank, Windshield World, Edward Jones, Chevy Monte Carlo. Dylan finished second in the first annual North/South Shootout a month earlier behind former series standout Tayla Orleans who has since relocated to Randleman, NC. Second place went to the series current point leader James Logan from Dighton, MA. in his #44 , G. Lopes Construction, Bristol CountyVactions.com, Middleboro Glass Ford Thunderbird. Followed by **aDP Rivet Rookie of the Year** contender Kyle Poodiack in the #3 Peterboro Tool Co. Inc., SIS Photography sponosred Chevy Monte Carlo, who for the second week in a row finished in third. Rounding out the top five was Taunton, MA driver Shane D'Agostino in fourth followed by Series Director Michael Vasquez, Sr. of Newburgh, NY in the #8 KMV Racing & V-Twin Performance Ford Thunderbird.

D'Agostino who started on the pole after winning the heat race led the first twelve circuits. Lap thirteen would see the first lead change as Dylan would swap spots with Shane. The two would continue their battle up front swapping spots over the next few laps. It wouldn't be until lap 22 that Dylan would grab the lead for the final time and never look back.

At this point the battle was for second place as D'Agostino and Logan would battle for the spot. On lap 26 D'Agostino would spin his #79 After Hours Auto Body, Aggregate Industries, Silver City Spindle Chevy thus relinquishing the second spot to Poodiack who had worked his way past Logan a lap earlier.

Lap 30 would see another caution involving the #19 Islandwide Auto & Truck Collision sponsored Chevy of David Schneider of Northport NY, the #8 of Vasquez and the 17 of Mellissa Fifield in her Napa of Sandbornville, NH Chevy. Vasquez and Fifield spun to avoid Schneider as he spun coming out of turn four. Vasquez was unable to avoid Schneider and the two had a door to door meeting. Both drivers along with Fifield would be able to continue. Lap 36 would bring out the final caution for a second spin by the 79 as he battled once again with the 44 of Logan. The 79 would recover once again to finish fourth.

With only fifteen points separating the top two drivers the next few races will be very important. As of right now there are four races left on the 2008 schedule with a possible 5th Race to be announced shortly.
