| <p>As part of our educational program in Lent, we are offering a five week series on the Gospel of St. Mark. This course is designed to study and reflect on the life of Christ as we proceed through Lent, culminating in the reading of Mark’s Passion Gospel on Palm Sunday, April 1st.</p> | <p>Written in 65 AD, the Gospel of Mark is the earliest record of the life of Jesus. It begins with the baptism of Christ, not His birth, and it contains an eyewitness account of the apostle Peter, as Mark recorded from Peter’s teaching and preaching. This Gospel is the shortest of the four Gospel records of the life of Christ. Six of the sixteen chapters are devoted to the last week of Jesus’ life, making this study timely suited to your Lenten journey.</p> |
