Strawberry Balls

2 c coconut

1 can Eagle Brand milk

4 small boxes strawberry Jello

2 t vanilla

4 t red food coloring

Mix together; let set overnight.

Next day: form into small balls. Make a mixture of one cup sugar and one teaspoon red food coloring; blend well. Put mixture in a jar and add the balls. Put lid on the jar and shake very gently until the balls are covered with the sugar mixture.

Store in the fridge.


Line a cookie sheet (with sides) with foil. Spray with Pam. Cover cookie sheet with saltine crackers.

Boil:

One cup brown sugar and one cup (two sticks) of real butter. You must use "real" butter. You cannot use margarine. Boil and stir for three minutes. Pour mixture over crackers and spread evenly. Bake at 350° for 10-15 minutes.

Take out of oven and cover with two 12 oz bags of Hershey Milk Chocolate Chips (you must use Hershey..no other brand works well). Spread after five minutes when the chips have melted.

Cool to harden for several hours then cut into small squares. (Do not cool by putting in the refrigerator, as the chocolate will separate and fall off.)

Paula Deen's Cake Balls

1 pkg white cake mix

1 16 oz container prepared butter cream frosting

6 oz chocolate flavored confectioners coating disks or bar (available in white, dark or milk chocolate) or white almond bark Food coloring (optional)

Prepare the cake mix according to the directions on the box. When cake is finished baking, allow to cool for 30 minutes. Crumble the cake into a large bowl using a stand mixer or a hand mixer. Add the frosting and mix until well combined. Place the bowl in the refrigerator for at least 3 hours or overnight.

Line a baking tray with wax paper. Use a melon baller as a scooper to form balls with the cake mixture. Place on wax paper. Once you have used all of the cake mixture, place the baking tray in the freezer for one hour. Melt the chocolate in a glass bowl in the microwave, stirring every 5-10 seconds until smooth. At this point, you can add a bit of food coloring if you are using white chocolate.

Remove the balls from the freezer. Using one toothpick, pick up the balls one at a time and dip in the chocolate. Use a second toothpick to slide the ball off the first toothpick onto the wax paper lined baking tray.

NOTE: if the balls fall off the toothpick into the chocolate, they are not firm enough to work with and you'll need to place them back in the freezer for additional time.

Once you have covered all the balls in chocolate coating, place the tray in the refrigerator until the coating is set. At this point, you can drizzle other chocolate on the balls for decoration.

There are a number of cake/icing combinations that you can try. Have fun with this recipe!
