GIVE CLEAN WATER

According to the World Health Organization, 1.8 million, including infants and children, die every year from diarrheal diseases. Globally it is the leading cause of illness and death. The great news is that it is preventable!

Give Clean Water, Inc., a non-profit organization, provides and installs clean water filters in

people's homes so no matter what type of water they have access to, these families will always have clean water to drink. Recently, a member of Faith Journey Church, Jim Randol, made the trek to Fiji to work on a project with Give

Clean Water. Fiji has a tremendous need for water filtration; almost 50% of the Fijian population do not have access to clean water. The team Jim was with installed a water



filtration system at the supply tank for a village so that it could affect all the homes versus just one home. They believe this is just the beginning of solving the entire country's water problems because Fiji is a relatively small demographic area and it is a tangible goal. We are happy to join with Give Clean Water this Christmas with a giving goal of \$6000.

\$25 per month for 1 year provides a sustainable clean drinking water solution for a family for the next 10 years. That is just \$300 for an entire family to be able to have clean

drinking water and relief from the fear of disease and even death!

We want to give this precious gift to at least 20 families — and you can help us do that! Together we can easily reach our goal starting Sunday, November 24th and ending Sunday, December 22nd!

THE "WHO" IN THE HOLIDAYS

"The worst moment in the world for an atheist is when he is genuinely thankful, but has nobody to thank."

~Dante Gabriel Rossetti

I just flat-out love the Thanksgiving holiday! And, it is probably not for the reason you "may" be thinking. No, it isn't the food, or the football, it is the heart of the season, the "WHO in the holiday!" Thanksgiving is a national holiday created for the purpose of "giving thanks for the previous year's blessings." It is a time to reflect and be grateful for "all" the "good" that has taken place in the past year. With Thanksgiving and Christmas, it is often easier to point out the "what" of a holiday than it is the "who" of the holiday.

While the "what" speaks to the event, such as Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Memorial Day... we tend to think of the "who" in connection with the name that is attached to the holiday. This Veteran's Day I think of Devin Bentz, who has recently become part of our Faith Journey family. I am very grateful for the sacrifice he and his fellow Marines gave to their country while serving in Afghanistan. You see the "WHO" in the holiday is so very vital in understanding and celebrating with purpose. I guess that is why Christmas for those who know Christ is so important. That is why "Xmas" does NOT cut it for most that follow Christ Jesus. The day declares simply and succinctly for whom the holiday is named. But then there is this holiday we call "Thanksgiving." The thing about Thanksgiving that has always puzzled me is to "whom or what are people giving thanks?" Are we giving thanks to the earth for the sweet potatoes, cranberry and green beans, or perhaps the turkey for his supreme sacrifice? C. K. Chesterton in his 1908 classic Christian apologetic book entitled "Orthodoxy," tells of finding his own experience of gratitude:

"The test of all happiness is gratitude; and I felt grateful, though I hardly knew to whom." ~G. K. Chesterton

Thomas Aquinas' once said; "every effect turns naturally to it's cause" (a benefactor) ... the natural order requires that he who has received a favor should, by repaying the favor, turn to his benefactor according to the mode of each." Dr. Alma Acevedo in "On The Square" rephrases Aquinas' comments on gratitude in more understandable terms:

"the virtue of gratitude entails that the recipient ought to repay the giver with spontaneous "affection of the heart" in a manner commensurate with the gift received." ~Alma Acevedo

We need to show gratitude "commensurate" to the many blessings we have received and to acknowledge the ONE who brought about those blessings... God. The true purpose of offering thanks is to confess our dependence upon God and others. It is to humbly acknowledge that others have the power to benefit us! It is to admit that our life is better because of their efforts and investment in us. To offer thanks is to understand that radical gratitude is linked to the very nearness of God.

For to offer thanks is to live at the beginning of a miracle in wildly expressive gratitude before ever receiving the benefit of the Father's gracious gift.

Paul the Apostle writing to the church in Galatia wrote in Galatians 2:10: "They (the disciples) asked us to remember the poor, the very thing I was eager to do!"

This holiday season I will begin a brand new sermon series entitled: "God's Storyboard." As part of this sermon series we will be looking at God's wonderful story of sending His son into the world in storyboard fashion. We will also learn about our own stories, crucial junctions on life's journey and those that lie ahead. We will also look at how we can enter someone else's storyboard and help change their lives forever! The Apostle Paul wrote to the Galatian church:

"Let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, IF we do not give up! So then, as we have OPPORTUNITY, let us do good to EVERYONE, and especially to the household of faith."

~Galatians 6:9-10

remembered her ... how we cried together about her daughter and how much it meant to her. I could hardly believe this woman sought me out after have only a 30-minute conversation 9 months ago. Through our conversations, she has said that she believes Allah has brought us together as 'good friends already,' but we know that Jesus has orchestrated this friendship from the beginning because He wants to bring hope and peace to this broken woman. Please keep her in your prayers, that Jesus will reveal Himself to her and pray for me, that God would give me wisdom in my words and our conversations. Don't know what God has planned with this new friendship, but I am excited to find out!
