***Biblical Heroes and God's Personality* with Rabbi David**

First Semester - *Biblical Heroes*

What is the secret of the magic of our biblical heroes? We will deal with familiar and forgotten characters from the biblical story, examine these wonderful characters that are the focus of The Book, the bestseller of all time, the book that has the longest shelf life ever.

Second Semester - *God's Personality*

The Midrash loves the fact that the Biblical God is not an abstract principle, but has a real personality and that God is involved in the human condition. This semester, we will examine God's personality, as expressed in the stories about the Flood and about the creation of the world as well as ancient Midrashim. We will see that the Biblical God has a full 'personality', which is complex and dynamic and try to look at the Bible's simple meaning and at the midrashic understanding to it.

39 Books with Rabbi Rapport

Have you ever wondered what lies in the Torah and Haftarah readings? There are 39 books in The Bible and we will study, briefly, every one. This "Taste of Tanakh" study series will explore the many and varied styles of Biblical literature in search of an understanding of what the Bible is meant to be.
