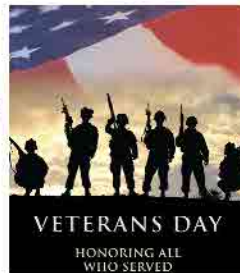

## A Testimony of “Reaching In”

*Since I received a diagnosis of colorectal cancer in August of last year, the congregation of FBC has wrapped their arms around my family and me in a remarkable way. These beautiful expressions of love and support are indicative of your individual spiritual gifts and the awesome love of God.*

*After learning I had cancer, at times there was apprehension. The days can be long when you have no idea whether your cancer is Stage 1 or Stage 4. As a parent, you want to see your child grow up and participate in his training. As a wife, you can't imagine being without your spouse and as an only child, you wonder if anyone would love and take care of your mother as you would.*

*Throughout treatment and surgery, there were times of physical pain and times of rejoicing, but there was never a time when I felt without the love of God. Very often, I would reflect on how Christ must have felt in the garden on the night before he knew he would die such a painful death. I reminded myself that, at its worst, my suffering paled in comparison to what Christ had gone through for me.*

*God's love was expressed to me in so many ways. I saw the love of God each time my husband and mother would walk through the door for their “shift” of staying with me while the other cared for Alex, who was not allowed in the hospital. I saw God's love in the prayers, phone calls, e-mails, cards and visits from my church family, some of whom I had never met.*

*My Sunday School class wrapped their arms around me and their collective wisdom and love made me know that Christ would provide the strength to handle pain or the knowledge that my illness may be terminal.*

*I will never forget Allen Tallent and Marvin Smith sitting with my family in Asheville during a 5 ½ hour surgery. I will never forget returning to my room after surgery and Rendell waiting. I will never forget how Cindi Morrison and the other youth leaders loved Alex through his fear of losing his mama at age 11. Words are insufficient to express my gratitude to my deacon and friend, Allen Tallent, for everything he has done for me.*

*God has blessed and I am currently cancer-free! As God has promised, so many good things have come from this experience. As a church family, you have blessed my life and I am indebted to all of you. Should any of you be experiencing cancer or facing an ostomy procedure either now or in the future, please call me as I would be honored to help you in some way. My prayers are full of thanksgiving for my church family as you have shown me that God's love is sufficient. Thank you. – Susan Haire*

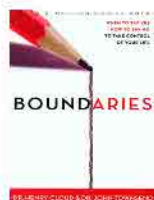
## REACHING OUT TO CITYKIDS

## RECIPE REQUESTS

*from Shannon Wiles, FBC food services team member*

### Crustless Apple, Gorgonzola & Walnut Tart

Spray a nine inch tart pan with cooking spray.  
Preheat oven to 325°

1 Granny Smith Apple  
1 Gala Apple  
1 Golden Delicious  
3/4 cup Crumbled Gorgonzola Cheese  
1/2 -3/4 cup sugar  
2 Tablespoons Flour  
1 Teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 cup sugared walnut pieces\*

Cut apples into quarters and slice very thinly into bowl of lemon water. Mix sugar, flour and cinnamon in a large bowl. Dry apples and toss with sugar mixture. Add cheese and walnuts. Spoon into tart pan and bake for 25-30 minutes, covering loosely with foil during the last 5 minutes.

\*Sugared walnuts

Melt 3/4 to 1 cup of brown sugar with 1/2 stick butter in a small sauce pan. Add 2 cups walnut pieces. Stir to coat and remove from heat. Let cool slightly, transfer to baking sheet lined with waxed paper, separate and allow to cool.
