IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY AS AN EXHIBITOR TO READ AND BE AWARE OF ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS

OPEN CLASS BEEF RULES

- 1. Registration is \$5.00 per head. Registration forms are due to the Fair Office by July 15th (4:00 pm) preceding the fair. Late registrations will not be accepted.
- 2. Exhibitors Must Be at least 8 Years of age by September 1st of the current year.
- 3. Exhibitors must abide by the Department of Agriculture's rules and regulations and the General Livestock rules which is found at the beginning of the Premium Book.
- 4. Cattle will have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) completed within 30-days of check-in.
- 5. Animals are assigned a Check-In time in which;
 - All exhibitors are responsible for getting their animals onto the scale during the check-in process.
 - Health papers and animals will be checked, and regulations will be enforced.
- 6. Cattle shall be identified by an official ear tag or other unique identification device approved by the PDA official identification includes;
 - A USDA-issued National Uniform Ear tagging system or
 - A 15 digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with "840" and having a US shield or
- 7. Due to space limitations and safety concerns, use of grooming chutes in the Beef Barn are subjected to the following regulations:
 - Grooming Chutes may be brought into the Beef Barn after Fair Closing on Monday evening and must be removed immediately following judging on Wednesday.
 - Grooming Chutes may also be used for special events i.e. fitting competitions.
 - To ensure equal access to the Beef Barn washing facilities, grooming chutes are **NOT PERMITTED** on the wash rack.
- 8. Exhibitors must keep their animals under control at all times. A committee representing Show Management will observe the handling of all animals, both in and out of the Show Ring. They have the authority to disqualify any exhibitor for unethical practices. If an animal poses a safety risk at any time to any spectator, exhibitor or other animals it will be removed at the discretion of the superintendent/ Show Stewards. Resulting in the forfeiture of all placing and class premiums.
- 9. Any unused feed, feeding utensils and / or bedding must be kept out of sight at all times.
- 10. Each exhibitor is responsible for keeping stalls clean with fresh bedding and all animals must be well groomed at all times. Each Exhibitor must provide their own bedding.
- 11. Joint ownership is considered to be one owner in accordance with registration papers.
- 12. Animals must be under halter while being shown and controlled by owner or the owner's representative.
- 13. Steers shown in the 4-H classes are not eligible to be shown in the Open Class.
- 14. The weight for Open Class Dairy Beef is a minimum 400 Lbs. and a maximum of 900 Lbs.
- 15. All stalls must be cleaned <u>daily</u> and upon the exit of your animal. It is not the superintendents responsibility to clean stalls, the exhibitor is responsible. Failure to comply will result in premium checks being held.
- 16. Entries will be released from the barn at 7 pm the last Saturday of fair week.
- 17. There is no limit to the number of animals an exhibitor may show in Open Class providing barn space is available.
