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THE MEETING OPENED WITH A MOMENT OF SILENCE AND THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO OUR FLAG.

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PRESENT: MAYOR KRIVACEK, MR PETRISKO, MR GYURE, MS WILSON AND REV CALDWELL. ALSO PRESENT: TREASURER DAVID J BIRES, CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO, AND POLICE CHIEF SCOTT ADAMS, CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICIAL ALLAN CHIESI AND FIRE CHIEF ANDREW FEDOR, CONTROLLER BETH KRACINOVSKY AND CITY SOLICITOR PATRICIA MCGRAIL.
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A MOTION NEEDED TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MARCH 8, 2017 COUNCIL MEETING WAS MADE BY MR GYURE AND SECONDED BY MS WILSON. THE YAYS ARE REV CALDWELL, MR GYURE AND MS WILSON. MAYOR KRIVACEK AND MR PETRISKO ABSTAINED. CARRIED 3-2.

CITIZENS REQUEST

NICKOLE NESBY OF 513 COCHRAN STREET STATED THAT SHE'S REACHED OUT TO PA LAND AND TRUST EARLIER THIS YEAR REGARDING A CONSERVATION PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN AGES 5-18 IN THE CITY TO LEARN ABOUT NATURE. CHRIS A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE PROGRAM RETURNED THE CALL WONDERING IF THE PROGRAM CAN BE RUN THROUGH THE BOYS N GIRLS CLUB OR THE CITY. MS NESBY STATED THAT SHE SUGGESTED RUNNING THE PROGRAM THROUGH THE CITY BEING THAT THE BOYS N GIRLS CLUB CUT OFF AGE IS 12 WHICH ELIMINATES THE AGES OF 12-18 TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM PLUS THERE IS NO PHYSICAL PLACE TO PUT THEM. THE PROGRAM IS GOING TO BE RUN BY THEM OUTSIDE IN NATURE. SHE SAYS THAT'S ONE PORTION AND THE OTHER PORTION IS THAT THEY WOULD LIKE TO DO A PRESENTATION. MS NESBY ASKS MAYOR AND COUNCIL WOULD THEY BE OPEN MINDED TO A PRESENTATION. MAYOR KRIVACEK ASKS WHAT SHE WANTS THE CITY TO DO. MS NESBY STATES THAT SHE INVITED MEMBERS FROM THE SCHOOL BOARD TO THE PRESENTATION AND CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO AND COUNCILMAN REV CALDWELL TO ATTEND AS WELL. MAYOR KRIVACEK STATES THAT HE SEES NO HARM IN HAVING THE PRESENTATION ON THE PROGRAM. MAYOR KRIVACEK CONTINUES AND ASKS WHERE WILL THE PRESENTATION BE

HELD AT. MS NESBY SAID THAT SHE WILL TALK TO CHRIS AT PA LAND AND TRUST TO SEE WHEN AND WHERE HE WANTS TO HOLD THE PRESENTATION BEING THAT HE WANTS TO START THE PROGRAM THIS SUMMER. MAYOR KRIVACEK STATES THAT THE PRESENTATION CAN BE HELD EITHER HERE AT CITY HALL OR THE SCHOOL. MAYOR KRIVACEK CONTINUES ON TO SAY THAT HE THINKS THERE'S NO PROBLEM WITH DOING THAT.

ANDY VAMOS OF KARL STREET WISHES THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL ALONG WITH THE POLICE AND FIRE DEPTS A HAPPY EASTER. HE ASKS CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO ABOUT THE STATUS OR UPDATE OF THE GLADORA PROPERTY. THE CITY MANAGER STATES THAT THE COUNTY IS MAKING THE CITY DO AN ASBESTOS SURVEYS ON ALL THE PROPERTIES TO BE DEMOLISHED SO THAT DELAYS THE BIDS BY ALMOST 2 MONTHS. THE COUNTY CHANGED THEIR ROLE ON HOUSES, NOW THE COUNTY WANTS ASBESTOS SURVEYS. HE STATES THE SURVEYS ARE DONE AND THAT MOST OF THE RESULTS ARE IN AND THAT THE CITY IS WAITING ON ONE MORE AND THEN THEY CAN BID THEM OUT. HE CONTINUES TO SAY ONCE THEY ARE BIDDED OUT FOR 30 DAYS THE LOWEST OF THE BIDS WILL BE REWARDED BY THE CITY OR THE SCOG, THEN 30 DAYS LATER THEY'LL PROBABLY START. THE CITY MANAGER STATES THAT IT MAY BE LATE SUMMER BEFORE THE GLADORA PLACE IS DEMOLISHED. MR VAMOS STATES THE REASON FOR HIM ASKING IS BECAUSE THE RESIDENTS ON KARL STREET WANTS TO KNOW.

MATT DURIK OF 36 NORTH THIRD STREET SAYS THAT HE HAS COUPLE OF QUESTIONS. HE GOES ON TO SAY THAT AT THE LAST MEETING THE SOLICITOR MENTIONED A MARIJUANA PLANT WILL BE PUT IN DUQUESNE. HE STATES HE RECENTLY READ IN THE PAPER THAT BRADDOCK WILL ALSO BE CONSIDERED FOR A MARIJUANA PLANT. HE ASKS IF THERE IS ONLY GOING TO BE ONE PLANT IN THE AREA. THE MAYOR AND CITY SOLICITOR BOTH ANSWERED THAT THERE'S GOING TO BE 2 GROWTH FACILITIES IN THE AREA. MR DURIK THEN ASKS IF THE CITY WAS STILL IN THE RUNNING. THE CITY SOLICITOR CONFIRMED THAT THE CITY IS STILL IN THE RUNNING. THE MAYOR STATED TO MR DURIK THAT THE CITY WON'T HEAR ANYTHING UNTIL JULY. MR DURIK THEN ADDRESSES CODE ENFORCEMENT ALLAN CHIESI ASKING HIM ABOUT NORTH THIRD STREET, NORTH FOURTH STREET, HAMILTION AVENUE AND GRANT AVENUE STILL BEING RESIDENTIAL. MR DURIK STATES THAT HE KNOWS THAT HAMILTON WAS OR IS BEING CHANGED OVER TO LIGHT INDUSTRIAL. HE ASKS ABOUT LUNA AND HIS PROPERTY ON NORTH FOURTH STREET AND NORTH THIRD STREET. HE WAS TOLD THAT HE HAS A GRADING PERMIT AND AS LONG AS HE STAYS IN HIS ZONING DISTRICT THAT HE'S OK. IF HE STARTS TO COME OUT OF THE ZONING DISTRICT THEN HE HAS TO APPLY FOR A VARIANCE. MR DURIK THEN ADDRESSES THE ACT47 COORDINATOR JOHNATHAN INGRAM ON WHAT IS BEING DONE ON TRYING TO GET THE CITY OUT OF THE ACT 47. MR INGRAM TELLS MR DURIK THAT THEY HAVE BEEN WORKING ON A NUMBER OF ITEMS TO BRING THE CITY IN MORE MONEY LIKE THE WATER DEPTS

INCREASE TO HELP THE WATER FUND OPERATE ON ITS OWN COMPARED TO TAKING MONIES OUT OF THE GENERAL TO HELP OFFSET SOME OF THE WATER COSTS. THERE HAS ALSO BEEN TALKS ABOUT CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS WITH LABOR GROUPS IN COOPERATING ON BOTH SIDES. MR INGRAM CONTINUES ON TO SAY THAT THERE ARE A NUMBER OF THINGS THEY'RE WORKING ON INCLUDING TRYING TO DECREASE THE DELINQUENCIES ON REAL ESTATE TAX. MR DURIK ASKS IF THERE IS A WAY THAT THE CITY CAN PUT A LIEN ON AN OWNER'S PROPERTY IN ANOTHER CITY, TOWNSHIP OR BOROUGH TO HELP MAKE THEM PAY TAXES ON THEIR PROPERTIES IN WHATEVER CITY, TOWNSHIP OR BOROUGH THEY MAY OWE IN. MR INGRAM STATES THAT THE CITY PURSUES IN EVERY WAY THAT THEY CAN. HE CONTINUES TO SAY THAT THERE ARE RESTRICTIONS AND CHALLENGES TO TRACKING SOMEONE DOWN. THE CITY SOLICITOR ADDS THAT PART OF THE PROBLEM FOR DOING THAT IS THE COST. THERE ARE LEGAL FEES BUT THERE ARE ALSO OUT OF POCKET COURT FEES THAT OFTEN EXCEED THE VALUE OF THE PROPERTY THAT IS LIENED.

MARS REPORT FOR MARCH 2017. ANSWERED 102 CALLS. TRANSPORTED 68. GREAT JOB.

1. POLICE CHIEF ADAMS: A TOTAL OF 288 CALLS WERE ANSWERED IN MARCH 2017. 69 CRIMES AND OFFENSES WERE COMMITTED OF THAT 69, THERE WERE 37 ARRESTS, 36 WERE ADULTS, 1 JUVENILE, 17 FALSE ALARMS, 19 ACCIDENTS, 14 NON-TRAFFIC CITATIONS AND 41 TRAFFIC CITATIONS. THERE WAS 1 PARKING CITATION ISSUED AND 12 ABANDONED VEHICLES WERE REMOVED.

2. FIRE REPORT: THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 23 CALLS ANSWERED IN THE MONTH OF MARCH 2017. THERE WERE 10 STRUCTURES, 6 AUTO ACCIDENTS, 3 MISC., 1 EMS ASSIST AND 3 MUTUAL AIDS.

3. BUILDING INSPECTOR / CODE ENFORCEMENT ALLAN CHIESI: REPORT FOR MARCH 2017. COLLECTED \$1100.00 FOR INSPECTION OF 24 HOUSES AND \$461.00 FOR 3 BUILDING PERMITS FOR A TOTAL OF \$1561.00. THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 10 COMPLAINTS: 3 GARBAGE CALLS, 3 ABANDONED/VACANT HOME CALLS, 2 DEAD ANIMAL CALLS AND 2 POTHOLE CALLS.

CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO: I AM SUBMITTING A QUOTE FROM HOSACK, SPECHT, MUETZEL AND WOOD REGARDING THE 2016 AUDIT. THE COST OF THE PROPOSAL IS \$18000.00, THE SAME AS LAST YEAR. I RECOMMEND CONCIL APPROVE THE PROPOSAL. MOTION WAS MADE BY MR PETRISKO AND SECONDED BY MR GYURE. CARRIED 5-0.

THE CITY RECEIVED ITS HEALTH INSURANCE QUOTE EFFECTIVE MAY 1, 2017 FROM UPMC. THE PREMIUM INCREASED 3.5% WHICH IS BELOW WHAT IS BUDGETED. THE CITY IS THRILLED WITH THE NUMBER, BUT CAUTIOUS FOR FUTURE YEARS.

THE PLANNING COMMISSION HELD A MEETING ON MONDAY, MARCH 27TH REGARDING A SUBDIVISION APPLICATION FOR 2 LOTS FOR HABITAT FOR HUMANITY. THE COMMISSION LISTENED TO TESTIMONY FROM DEREK MORRIS REGARDING THE SUBDIVISION OF LOTS 378-N-35 AND 378-N-37

BETWEEN FERNDALE AVENUE AND FERN ALLEY. THEY RECOMMEND THE SUBDIVISION TO COUNCIL WITH UNANIMOUS VOTE. GLENN ENGINEERING REVIEWED THE PLAN AND APPROVED THE DRAWINGS. THEY ARE SIMPLY CHANGING THE BOUNDARY LINES ON THE LOTS, SO THE NEW HOUSES WILL BE RIGHT BEHIND THE OTHER. MOTION WAS MADE BY MAYOR KRIVACEK AND SECONDED BY MR GYURE. CARRIED 5-0.

DAVID J. BIRES: TAXES COLLECTED FOR MARCH 2017 WERE \$205,558.90. THE FOLLOWING IS A YEAR TO DATE BREAKDOWN OF MONEY COLLECTED BY KEYSTONE MUNICIPAL SERVICES: DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX \$26,310.26, LST/OPT \$14,975.78 MERCANTILE TAX \$4,778.37 AND EARNED INCOME TAX \$2,273.62. THE FOLLOWING IS A YEAR TO DATE BREAKDOWN OF MONEY COLLECTED BY JORDON TAX SERVICES: EARNED INCOME TAX \$156,801.92 DELINQUENT EARNED INCOME TAX \$2,363.11, NON RESIDENT EARNED INCOME TAX \$32,827.30. THERE WERE 10 NEW WATER ACCOUNTS SENT TO JORDAN TAX SERVICES TO CHECK AGAINST THEIR TAX LISTS.

A MOTION WAS MADE TO REFUND THE EXONERATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$9,296.13 (YRS 2015-2017) BY MAYOR KRIVACEK AND SECONDED BY MR GYURE. CARRIED 5-0.

CONTROLLER'S REPORT

BETH KRACINOVSKY: THE CITY RECEIVED ITS 2017 TURNBACK ALLOCATION FOR \$3,700 ON MARCH 1, 2017. THE MS-965 FORM WAS COMPLETED AND WE ANTICIPATE OUR LIQUID FUEL FUNDS RECEIVED BEFORE THE END OF THE MONTH.

PATRICIA MCGRAIL: WE DID COMPLETE OUR REVIEW OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE AND SUB DIVISION ORDINANCE THAT WAS THE SUBJECT OF THE PUBLIC HEARING TONIGHT AND IT LOOKS TO BE IN ORDER.

DAVID GILLILAND: THE DEMOLITION OF 17 SOUTH SECOND STREET AND 125 WEST GRANT AVENUE IS COMPLETE HOWEVER THE GRASS SEED DID NOT GROW. HE WILL RE-SEED THE LOTS THE WEEK OF APRIL 10.

THE CD 42 PROJECTS FOR THE AURILLES STREET WATERLINE REPLACEMENT AND THE WATER VALVE REPLACEMENT AT FIRST STREET AND GRANT AVENUE WILL BEGIN THE WEEK OF APRIL 17, 2017. THIS PROJECT SHOULD BE COMPLETED IN ABOUT A MONTH.

THE DEMOLITION PROJECTS WILL BE ADVERTISED AS SOON AS THE ASBESTOS SURVEYS ARE COMPLETE. THE SAMPLES FROM THE SITES WERE COLLECTED ON MARCH 28, 2017 AND WILL BE ANALYZED WITH REPORTS TO FOLLOW. ONCE THE ASBESTOS SURVEYS ARE COMPLETE THE REPORTS WILL BE BROUGHT TO COUNCIL FOR CONSIDERATION.

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THE MEETING OPENED WITH A MOMENT OF SILENCE AND THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO OUR FLAG.
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PRESENT: MAYOR KRIVACEK, MR PETRISKO, MR GYURE AND MS WILSON. ALSO PRESENT: TREASURER DAVID J BIRES, CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO, AND POLICE CHIEF SCOTT ADAMS, CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICIAL ALLAN CHIESI AND FIRE CHIEF ANDREW FEDOR, CONTROLLER BETH KRACINOVSKY AND CITY SOLICITOR PATRICIA MCGRAIL. ABSENT: REV CALDWELL
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A MOTION NEEDED TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR APRIL 12, 2017 COUNCIL MEETING WAS MADE BY MR GYURE AND SECONDED BY MR PETRISKO. CARRIED 4-0.

CITIZENS REQUEST

ANDY VAMOS OF KARL STREET ADDRESSES CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO ON AN UPDATE OF THE GLADORA PROPERTY ON THE CORNER OF WILMOT STREET AND KENENDY AVENUE. CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO STATES THAT BIDS WILL BE RECEIVED MAY 19 AT 10AM, THEREFORE IN JUNE'S MEETING WE WILL EXECUTE THE CONTRACT TO LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER. THE CITY MANAGER ALSO NOTES A 30 TO 45 DAY ESTIMATE SO IT MAY BE JULY OR AUGUST. MR VAMOS ALSO STATES THAT HE HAS TALKED TO SOME OF HIS FRIENDS AND THEY ALL WANT TO WISH YOU PEOPLE LOTS OF LUCK.

KEVIN PRICE OF 301 SOUTH FOURTH STREET STATES THAT WE'RE WONDERING ABOUT THE WATER SITUATION. HE GOES ON TO SAY THAT HE UNDERSTANDS THAT THEY'RE DOING THE PIPES AND STUFF LIKE THAT BUT NOBODY WAS DULY NOTED AROUND HERE OF WHAT WAS GOING ON SO THAT'S WHEN PEOPLE COME IN HERE COMPLAINING AND THE NEWS PEOPLE COME IN HERE. MR PRICE CONTINUES ON TO SAY THAT THE WATER AROUND HERE HAS BEEN MESSED UP FOR ABOUT 4 OR 5 DAYS. HE AGAIN STATES THAT HE UNDERSTANDS THAT THEY'RE DOING THE PIPES AND NO ONE KNOWS THE WEBSITE TO CONTACT ANYONE THAT KNOWS WHAT'S GOING ON AROUND HERE. HE STATES THAT HIS DAUGHTER THAT RESIDES

ON HILLVIEW STREET HAS HAD MESSED UP WATER FOR FOUR DAYS. THE CITY MANAGER STATES THAT THE NEW WATER LINE IS BEING REPLACED ON AURILLES STREET. MR PRICE INTERRUPTS AND SAYS THAT'S UNDERSTANDABLE BUT PEOPLE IN THIS COMMUNITY SHOULD KNOW THIS. CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO STATES THAT WE NOTIFIED THE GENERAL AREA WHICH WAS AURILLES AND CATHERINE STREETS REGARDING THE VALVES AND REGARDING THE HYDRANTS. THE CITY MANAGER CONTINUES ON TO SAY THAT THE NOTICES WERE HAND DELIVERED BY CITY WORKERS ON FRIDAY THAT INTERRUPTION OF THE WATER SERVICE WOULD TAKE PLACE MONDAY AND TUESDAY AND THAT THERE WOULD BE CLOUDY WATER BECAUSE OF THE VALVES AND HYDRANTS AND TO GET THE OLD LINE SHUT DOWN AND THE NEW LINE PUT IN. MR PRICE STATES THAT WITH ALL THE WATER ISSUES HAPPENING IN FLINT AND DOWN IN THE CITY OF PITTSBURGH THAT THEY DON'T WANT THAT TO START HAPPENING HERE. THE CITY MANAGER STATES THAT THERE'S NO COMPARISON TO WHAT'S HAPPENING IN FLINT. MR PRICE STATES THAT THE'S NOT COMPARING THAT HE JUST WANTS PEOPLE TO BE DULY NOTED ABOUT WHAT'S GOING ON WITH THE WATER AROUND HERE. CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICIAL ALLAN CHIESI STATES THAT BY THE HEALTH DEPT RULES WHEN WE DO SOMETHING LIKE THIS WE HAVE TO NOTIFY THE PEOPLE WHO ARE DIRECTLY INVOLVED WHICH WAS AURILLES STREET, VIOLA AVENUE AND SOME OF CATHERINE STREET AND WE DID THAT. WE WERE TO GIVE THEM A 24 HOUR NOTICE AND WE GAVE THEM THE WHOLE WEEKEND. IF IT GOES FURTHER THAN THAT THEN IT'S OUT OF OUR CONTROL. CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICIAL STATES THAT THIS HAPPENS ALL THE TIME AND GOES ON TO SAY WHEN REPLACING VALVES YOU MAY HAVE DIRTY WATER TEMPORARY. HE CONTINUES ON TO SAY IF RESIDENTS CALL DOWN TO THE WATER DEPT AND SAY I HAVE DIRTY WATER JEANNE SHOULD BE ABLE TO TELL THEM THAT WATERLINES ARE BEING REPAIRED. MR PRICE SAID THAT THE STATE ITSELF AND OTHER STATES ARE HAVING WATER ISSUES AND THAT HE DOESN'T WANT THAT TO TRICKLE DOWN HERE. THE MAYOR STATES THAT WE ARE MONITORED BY THE ALLEGHENY HEALTH DEPT. WE HAVE MET WITH THEM AND THEY MONITOR US EVERY WEEK. THE MAYOR ALSO STATES THAT THE CITY HAS TO SEND IN REPORTS EVERY WEEK AND THAT THERE ISN'T ANYTHING WRONG WITH OUR WATER. THE MAYOR CONTINUES ON TO SAY THAT THERE WAS A FIRE ON CRAWFORD AVENUE WHICH AFFECTED HIS WATER AND TURNED IT BROWN. THE MAYOR REITERATES WHAT THE CITY MANAGER AND THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICIAL HAS SAID ABOUT NOTIFYING THE RESIDENTS ABOUT THE WATERLINE BEING REPLACED AND THERE'S A CHANCE OF HAVING DIRTY WATER. THE MAYOR ALSO NOTES THAT IT IS A TEMPORARY INCONVENIENCE. MR PRICE STATES THAT HE HAS A RIGHT TO BE CONCERNED. THE MAYOR AGREES AND SAID THAT HE'S GLAD TO THAT MR PRICE IS A CONCERNED RESIDENT. MR PRICE STATES THAT HE HAS GRANDCHILDREN THAT HE'S WORRIED ABOUT. HE STATES THAT THE KIDS DON'T KNOW WHAT'S GOING ON WITH THE WATER, DRINKING THE BROWN

WATER THINKING THE WATER IS STILL GOOD. THE CITY MANAGER ASKS MR PRICE IF HIS DAUGHTER CALLED DOWN CITY HALL AND WHAT WAS SHE TOLD. 

A MOTION NEEDED TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MAY 10, 2017 COUNCIL MEETING WAS MADE BY MR GYURE AND SECONDED BY MR PETRISKO. CARRIED 4-0.

CITIZENS REQUEST

MR PRICE STATES TO MR PICCOLINO THAT IT IS HIS UNDERSTANDING THE INSPECTOR GUY IS HERE THIS WEEK AND IT WAS SCHEDULED FOR THIS WEEK HERE. MR PICCOLINO STATES THAT MR PRICE'S SON WAS IN AND HE HAD A CALL WITH YOUR LAWYER MR DELUCCA WHO CONTACTED PAT MCGRAIL'S OFFICE AND THEY BOTH AGREED THAT IT IS A PRIVATE CLUB THAT NEEDS A SPECIAL EXCEPTION. HE ALSO STATES THAT MR CUPELLI WANTS TO RE-CONFIGURE AND REPAVE, THEREFORE HE WOULD LIKE PERMISSION FROM COUNCIL TO PAVE A PORTION OF THE STREET OR A ROAD BLOCK WHERE IT GOES FROM HIS PROPERTY TO WHERE IT'S ZONED TO THE MIDDLE OF THE STREET WHERE HE HAS PROPERTY ON BOTH SIDES. MR FURMAN STATES THAT MR CUPELLI IS ASKING COUNCIL TO CONSIDER ABANDONING THE PUBLIC ENTRANCE IN EXCHANGE HE WILL GIVE A VACANCY AGREEMENT. THE MAYOR ASKS IF THERE IS A HOUSE STILL DOWN THERE. THE MAYOR TELLS MR FURMAN TO PUT WHAT THEY WANT TO DO IN WRITING AND WE'LL GIVE IT TO OUR SOLICITOR AND WE'LL SEE WHAT WE CAN DO.

MR ANDY VAMOS OF KARL STREET STATES THAT HE WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALLAN AND THE STREET DEPT FOR TAKING CARE OF THE HIGH GRASS AND BRUSH THAT WAS BLOCKING THE VIEW OF THE TRAFFIC TRAVELING UP AND DOWN THE STREET.

NICKOLE NESBY OF COCHRAN STREET STATES THAT IN APRIL YOU ALL HAD INDICATED THAT YOU ALL WERE IN DISCUSSION ABOUT THE MEDICAL MARIJUANA. THE MAYOR STATES THAT WE MAY HEAR SOMETHING AROUND THE END OF JUNE. ASHLEY WAGNER (REP FOR SOLICITOR) INTERJECTS STATING THAT NO ONE KNOWS YET WHO HAS BEEN GRANTED A LICENSE, WE ARE ALL STILL WAITING. MS NESBY ASKS WHAT THE DISCUSSION WAS PERTAINING TO BECAUSE THERE WAS NO INFORMATION GIVEN AT THAT TIME. THE MAYOR STATES THAT WE TALKED ABOUT GIVING THEM THE SUPPORT TO BRING IT HERE AND THAT WE WOULD BE HAPPY TO HAVE THEM, IN FACT THEY ALREADY HAVE LEASED 3 ACRES OF GROUND DOWN IN THE MILL SITE DETERMINED ON IF THEY GET THE CONTRACT AND IF THEY

GET THE CONTRACT THEY WILL BUILD A BRAND NEW BUILDING. MS NESBY THEN ASKS IF MAYOR AND COUNCIL CAN ELABORATE MORE ON AMERICAN TEXTILE. SHE STATES THAT SHE SPOKE WITH SENATOR BREWSTER'S OFFICE AND WAS TOLD THAT THEY ARE IN THE PROCESS OF SECURING 3 MILLION DOLLARS FOR THE EXPANSION OF AMERICAN TEXTILES. THE MAYOR STATES THAT THIS IS NEWS TO HIM. THE CITY MANAGER STATES THAT THEY HAVEN'T SPOKE TO HIM ABOUT EXPANDING AND THAT HE ONLY KNOWS OF THE REMEDIATION OF THE CURRENT SITE. MS NESBY THEN ASKS IF AMERICAN TEXTILES ARE REQUIRED BY THE STATE TO MAINTAIN A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF EMPLOYEES THAT LIVE IN THE CITY. THE CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO REPLIES NOT THAT WE KNOW OF.

AMELIA LAST NAME AND ADDRESS NOT MENTIONED STATES THAT SHE FILED A COMPLAINT LAST WEEK ABOUT A TRAFFIC STOP THAT INVOLVED OFFICER FOSTER. SHE STATES THAT HE TOOK \$2000 WHICH WAS HER PERSONAL MONEY. SHE STATES THAT SHE'S BEEN CALLING ALL WEEK SPEAKING TO THE CITY MANAGER ABOUT IT. SHE STATES THAT THERE WAS NOTHING FOUND IN THE CAR AND THAT THE OFFICER DID NOT GIVE HER A RECEIPT OR ANYTHING. SHE STATES THAT HE PUT SOMETHING IN A BAG AND PLACED HANDCUFFS ON HER AND WOULDN'T TELL HER WHAT WAS IN THE BAG. SHE THEN STATES THAT WHEN SHE RETURNED TO HER CAR SHE NOTICED THE MONEY WAS GONE AND SHE HAS BEEN CALLING EVERYDAY SINCE THEN. SHE ALSO STATES THAT SHE SPOKE WITH THE CITY MANAGER AND HE TOLD HER THAT THE MONEY WAS IN THE POLICE CHIEF'S POSSESSION AND THAT SHE WAS GOING TO GET HER MONEY BACK. SHE SAID THE CHIEF HASN'T RETURNED HER CALLS AT ALL THIS WEEK. THE MAYOR RESPONDS SAYING THAT SHE HAS TO TALK TO THE POLICE CHIEF AND THAT HE BELIEVES THAT HE INVESTIGATED THE SITUATION AND THAT HE MAY HAVE A SOLUTION FOR YOU. THE POLICE CHIEF SAYS ALONG WITH THE INVESTIGATION INVOLVING THE MONEY ISSUE THERE WERE ALSO SOME ALLEGATIONS MADE AGAINST AN OFFICER THAT YOU MADE. POLICE CHIEF SCOTT ADAMS SAID THAT HE FINISHED THE INVESTIGATION THIS MORNING AND THE REASON FOR THE DELAY WAS THAT HE WAS OFF UNTIL TUESDAY JUNE 13, 2017. HE SAID WITH THE COMPUTER PROBLEMS HE HAD, HE TOOK THE BEST CHANCE AND REVIEWED IT. HE STATES THAT HE WILL CALL TOMORROW SOMETIME WITH THE FINALIZED INVESTIGATION AND ABOUT YOUR MONEY ISSUE.

THERESA BARLOW ADDRESS NOT MENTIONED STATES THAT SHE JUST WANTS TO KNOW IF THERE ARE ANY SUMMER PROGRAMS AND JOBS FOR THE CHILDREN AND THE ADULTS. CITY MANAGER FRANK PICCOLINO STATES THAT THEY ARE ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR SEASONAL SUMMER HELP. THE CITY MANAGER ALSO STATES THAT THE ISSUE THEY ARE HAVING IS THAT YOU HAVE TO HAVE A DRIVER'S LICENSE WHICH IS A STANDARD PROCEDURE. HE ALSO STATES THAT THEY ARE HAVING TROUBLE GETTING APPLICANTS WITH LICENSE AND THAT HE KNOWS

GOODWILL AND AUBERLE ARE OFFERING A JOB PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF 18. HE ALSO STATES THAT IF YOU KNOW SOMEONE OVER THE AGE OF 18 THAT HAS A DRIVER'S LICENSE THAT'S IN GOOD STANDING TELL THEM TO PLEASE APPLY AND WE'LL SEE HOW MANY WE CAN HIRE. MS BARLOW STATES THAT SHE HAS TWO CHILDREN THAT BOTH HAVE LICENSE THAT DID APPLY AND NEITHER ONE HAS RECEIVED A CALL. THE CITY MANAGER ASKS FOR THE NAMES OF HER CHILDREN THAT APPLIED. MS BARLOW ANSWERS THE LAST NAME FOR BOTH OF HER CHILDREN IS SCOTT. THE CITY MANAGER STATES THAT HE HAS THEIR APPLICATIONS BUT THEY HAVEN'T HIRED ANYONE YET. THE CITY MANAGER ALSO STATES THAT HE TALKED TO ONE OF HER SONS LAST WEEK AND THAT HE WOULD BE IN TOUCH. MS BARLOW THEN ASKS ABOUT THE YOUTH, THE UNDER 18. THE CITY MANAGER STATES THAT THE UNDER 18 WILL GO THROUGH GOODWILL OR AUBERLE. HE CONTINUES TO SAY THEY HAVE A PROGRAM THAT PAYS THE YOUTH TO WORK WITHIN THE CITY. THE PROGRAM TAKES CARE OF PAYING THEM, THE INSURANCE, THE LIABILITY AND THINGS OF THAT SORT. MS BARLOW ASKS IF THEY HAVE TO GO TO AUBERELE IN MCKEESPORT AND STATES THAT THEY ALREADY HAVE WHO THEY ARE GOING TO HIRE. THE CITY MANAGER AND THE MAYOR BOTH STATE THAT THAT ISN'T HOW IT WORKS AND THAT WE GET A CERTAIN NUMBER OF CHILDREN AS WELL AS MCKEESPORT. THE CITY MANAGER TELLS MS BARLOW TO CALL TOMORROW SO HE CAN GIVE HER MORE INFORMATION ON THE PROGRAM.
