

Made to Serve

I thought it often in my first year as a mother, when I was every day discovering what this new life of parenthood looked and felt like: doing anything with kids is a hundred times harder than doing it without kids. But it's a thousand times better.

From eating dinner to going to Mass to taking a walk around the block — every single outing, even the simplest ones, had an extra level of logistical complexity. I had to bring diapers and food and extra clothes, I had to be ready to distract, to comfort, to settle, to de-escalate. Before, I just showed up, did the thing and went home. Now, I had to be ready to coordinate.

I had to be ready to serve.

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But even while everything had become so much more complicated, so much harder, there was suddenly a joyfulness to these experiences that had not been there before. Yes, I was a mom now, a servant if there ever was one, constantly tending to someone else's needs, and it was difficult. Sometimes terribly so. But it was beautiful (not in a physical way — I was usually covered in baby spit-up — but my soul had that glow, you know?).

It was the first time in my life that I really understood what it was to serve, and the power of that vocation to which we are all called.

This isn't just true of parenthood. It's true of every relationship. When we find someone we can meaningfully, wholeheartedly serve — our spouse, our best friend, our employees, our students, our patients, whoever it is — the effort becomes nothing compared to the joy and the fulfillment we find in the work.

We were made for greatness, and Christ tells us that to be great is to serve. So don't be afraid of greatness. Don't be afraid to serve.

In this episode the two greatest commandments taught by Jesus are discussed and reveal the importance of Love for God and Neighbor.





Fifth Grade Class By Lynsey Ayers




Hello everyone! It is so crazy to realize that it is already at the end of the 1st quarter! It feels as though it has just flown by. The fifth graders have been working very hard at keeping up with everything. They have finished Unit 3 in math and are now moving on to learning about how estimation can be used with decimals.

We have completed learning about the first civilizations in the Americas in social studies, and we will be moving on to learning about European Exploration which is very

exciting! Soon we will begin our Sailing Quest!

We also went on our first field trip of the school year to the WET program, where we learned all about water and how it can be used. For example pollution, erosion, water safety, irrigation etc. It was very fun! I am very excited to see what the next quarter will bring for the fifth grade!





BOO! The Halloween books have been jumping off the shelves with excitement! Students will continue to be greeted by creepy characters, wacky witches, and ghoulish adventures during the month of October! It will be frighteningly FUN!

Other October themes include Columbus Day/Indigenous Peoples' Day (Oct. 14th), National Book Month: the month-long celebration focuses on the importance of reading, writing, and literature. National Book Month is also a time to honor the country's best books and authors, which ties in nicely with our Reading Incentive Program. Students have finished their reading goals and projects for September and the upper grade classes are invited to display their projects in the library throughout the year! By this time, students should be well on their way to completing their October Reading Incentive goals.

The library's big event for October is the **Scholastic Book Fair!** The Book Fair will take place the week of Oct. 21-24, the week of Parent/ Teacher Conferences. The fair takes place downstairs in the Learning Center. The fair will be open Mon-Thurs. right after school until 4:00 P.M. It will also be open Tues. and Thurs. evenings during P/T Conferences. Please plan to come to the Book Fair that week! The children have received a Book Fair sample flyer and are very excited about the new books! They will have a chance to preview the new books during their library time and will be making a wish list for you! Thank you for supporting the Book Fair! 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These first graders absolutely LOVE clapping rhythms, and have also enjoyed sharing their artistic renditions of the quarter rest! This class has mastered identification and performance of quarter note, eighth note and quarter rest rhythms, and are able to accurately perform 4 beat rhythm patterns individually or with a group, and with various sequencing, no less! Wow, 1st grade - great work!

We have accomplished much in the other grade levels over the past few weeks as well; Pre-K students have not only been moving to the music, but have been VERY creative with their rhythm sticks! Second grade students are performing rhythm patterns, including half notes, from notation. Third grade is learning about measures and time signatures, and is preparing to begin their bucket drumming unit. Grades 4-5 have been singing up a storm and are now beginning to polish their abilities with 2/4, 3/4 and 4/4 time signatures/measure building and notes/intervals on the staff – whew! We've been busy! Singspirations has been diligently learning music and choreography for our 3 show choir numbers this year, and are MORE than excited to present them at the Old West Choir Fest the morning of Saturday, November 2nd – we are so very blessed!
