



Sixth Sunday of Easter

As I Love You

This week my children were learning about energy. We set up an experiment with toy cars — one was placed in front of another, and a third was pushed into the two stationary ones.

The forward motion caused the front car to move, but not much. "Most of the energy goes into the car in the middle, not the car on the end," my daughter concluded.

I asked her why she seems to have so much energy, and I seem to have so little.

"Because you're old," she replied confidently.

Most days I feel like that first car, barreling at life with all my energy and love and good intentions, only to have it almost entirely absorbed by the proverbial middle car. It's so easy to be discouraged. The devil so badly wants us to feel discouraged.

But the law of love is not unlike the law of conservation of energy. Love is neither created nor destroyed. It is only transferred from one form to another. And yes, sometimes it certainly seems like it disappears. It appears to get lost between my hands and the plate of dinner that goes uneaten or evaporates off of my lips as words I fear are never heard. It is spat upon as a commandment the world would prefer I do not keep.

But we are not called to simply love one another — to love when it seems effective and productive and appreciated. We are called to love as Christ loved: recklessly, selflessly, and yes, even without logic. We are called to love with a love that doesn't give up and is never withdrawn. A love that doesn't fear death or the world's hatred. A love that stands willing to argue, to be reviled, to be dismissed.

We are called to be that first car, hurtling ourselves against a world that isn't ready to accept or understand us. And we trust that, even when we can't see how, the love that seems to disappear simply changes forms.



Liturgy Corner

Sacristan Before the Mass begins, someone has to prepare for it.

The sacristan "diligently arranges the liturgical books, the vestments, and other things that are necessary for the celebration of Mass" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 105a). This short description summarizes the invaluable work performed behind the scenes by a person who helps us pray at the Eucharist.

The sacristan may be a volunteer or a paid staff member. In some churches, the priest or deacon performs this role.

A sacristan needs knowledge of the principal liturgical books: The Roman Missal and the Lectionary for Mass, as well as auxiliary materials such as the Rite of Baptism for Children and the Book of Blessings. A good sacristan will understand the liturgical year and know how to locate the texts for any Sunday in the primary books, marking them with ribbons. The sacristan will also be aware of special ceremonies taking place on particular days and be prepared to set the books accordingly.

A sacristan may also set out the vestments to be worn by the priest and deacon. Traditionally, sacristans spread the vestments on a sacristy table, neatly arranged one on top of the other, so the clergy can do them in order.

Sacristans also prepare the bread and wine, the vessels, and other materials necessary for the Mass. They usually bring the bread and wine to the back of the church where the procession of the gifts will begin, and they set other articles on the credence table in the sanctuary.

You may not see them much after the service begins, but the Mass would not go smoothly without the careful, devoted work of a parish sacristan.





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

I can't believe this is my final bulletin and that the year is coming to end. What an amazing year it has been with this special group! I will truly miss them at the end of the year, but am happy I can peek over at them across the hall next year!

We are in the middle of our Oregon Trail Simulation unit and it is the highlight of our classroom right now! The wagons trains are moving along, already facing many challenges. Students have had to decide on witch trail to follow at a fork in the road. Both trails had their own set of fates that students had to choose wisely on. They are learning a lot of decisions require a lot of energy and delays on the journey.

We started a unit on fossils. We recently did a lab where students got to create their own cast and model fossils using plaster of paris, modeling clay, and small animal figures. The students really enjoyed this project!
