

Be Opened

There are several moments throughout the calendar year when we are tricked into thinking we can reinvent ourselves.

One of them is New Year's Day. The barista at my coffee shop told me that they sell more decaf coffee in January than in the entirety of the remaining year, because everyone is swearing off caffeine. By February, she said, the trend subsides: folks have realized they're not actually superheroes just because the last digit of the year has increased by one.

The beginning of a new school year is another of those moments. Every pencil is freshly sharpened, and every lesson plan is painstakingly plotted. Our heads are full of what we plan to do this year, how we plan to do it, who we plan to become.

But by May, the wind is out of our sails. We've learned the concepts, we've used up the pencils, yes — but we've remembered that underneath it all we're basically the same people, with the same shortcomings and the same obstacles as we always were. The only difference in September was we had new planners.

The truth is that we cannot reinvent ourselves. We can't change ourselves at all, not on New Year's Day or the first day of school or on our 40th birthday or after quitting a bad habit. We are what we are: blind in some ways, deaf in others, crippled in still more, moving through life with uncertainty, stumbling in the dark.

People don't change. Not without miracles.

\But being a Christian means believing in miracles and being ready for them at any moment — in January or in September, in the middle of a hopeless week or at the end of a bad day, when you feel strong and when you don't, when you want to be better and when you feel too tired to try.

No, we can't change ourselves, but we can be changed. There is one who can change us if we will let him. He is waiting — now, tomorrow, yesterday, next week. The time is always right for a miracle.






Requesting a Mass to be said for a loved one is a special way to honor either someone still living, or one who has gone ahead of us to the next stage of life in

Feasts and Celebrations September 5 - St. Teresa of Kolkata (1997).

Gonxha Agnes Bojaxhiu joined the Loreto nuns and taught in India. Shocked by the poverty and suffering she witnessed, she founded the Missionaries of Charity to help her to "serve [Christ] in the poorest of the poor."

September 14 - Exaltation of the Holy Cross (c.326). St. Helena (mother of Emperor Constantine) discovered what is believed to be the True Cross while on pilgrimage in Jerusalem. On that site, Constantine built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher.

September 17 - St. Robert Bellarmine (1621). A Jesuit, Robert was a scholar devoted to studying and writing about Church history, Scripture, and the Fathers of the Church,

aiming to explain and defend Church doctrine. Although a cardinal and counselor to Pope Clement VIII, he lived a simple life.

September 21 - St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist (1st Century). Also called Levi, he was a notorious tax collector. St. Matthew left everything when he was called to discipleship (Luke 5:27).

Are you willing to share your Catholic faith with others? If so, would you be willing to be a catechists on Wednesday evenings?



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

Pre-K started off the first week of school learning about classroom rules, how to play with each other, and our routine. They have also been exploring centers and making new friends. Pre-K also thought it was cool that they got to leave the classroom and go to specials. We had our first practice of safety drills. I must say Pre-K did an excellent job. They got to explore the school, and look for doors that had owls on them. An owl means it's a safe place for them to go. They learned where to go for a fire, tornado, and lock down drill.

This last week we have been working on drawing circles, tracing our name, and learning how to use glue and scissors. Now that we are getting into the swing of things, these next couple of weeks we will be learning how to draw people, working on our fine motor skills, and starting our apple unit. We will also be working on colors, numbers, letters, and shapes.

I am very excited for this year! I cant wait to share all the things we will be learning and creating. I would also like to thank everyone who donated towards the giving tree. Pre-K is excited to use all of their fun items.













2nd Grade Class By Lori Svitak



Second grade is off to a great start. The students are settling into the routine and learning all the new procedures. In math, we are learning about ones, tens, and hundreds. We have been using the base-ten blocks to break apart numbers to understand place value. It's always better to manipulate things when learning.

In reading, we have worked on learning how to take vocabulary tests. The students did very well on their first test. We are enjoying the stories in our anthology. The skills we are working on are inflectional endings -s and -es, the differences in statements, questions, commands, and exclamatory sentences, and understanding the author's use of characters, setting, and events.

In science, we are beginning our unit on plants and animals. We are looking at the similarities and differences in each of the lifecycles. We will explore how plants and animals help each other.

One of our team building activities we did was to work together in groups of two to "Save Freddy" This involves teamwork to get a life saver gummy on a gummy worm without using your fingers. They had to use paper clips instead. This was a lot of fun!

I am looking forward to getting to know each of your children!
