

Section 5 – Student Policies

5.032 – Credit Recovery

1. No more than 4 attempts at credit recovery over the course of student's high school career will be allowed for a student to graduate.
2. Grades 9-12 may retake high school credit classes if they receive an "F" for their semester mark.
3. Both the failing grade and forgiveness grade are calculated into the student GPA.
4. The transcript must reflect that the student attempted the failed course (and / or credit recovery is needed).
5. The transcript must reflect when coursework is counted as credit recovery.
6. Students may not use credit recovery as a means to boost their GPA for various school accolades including National Honor Society and the like.
7. Credit recovery can be utilized for one course per Academic Year.
8. All Credit Recovery courses come with an additional cost. Full payment must be provided prior to the start of the credit recovery course.
9. Credit Recovery is scheduled with a start and completion date. Failure to complete coursework on time could result in a failing grade.
10. Credits transferred into OSCA from another institution are vetted against the high standards represented in our curriculum. It may be necessary for a student to retake certain coursework for credit, in preparation of graduation.
11. Credit recovery coursework is carefully selected to meet student needs and includes a faculty facilitator. There may be circumstances when credit recovery is not offered. The goal should always include maximum student participation during the regular school year so that recovery for credits is not needed.
