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Faith Works By Love

"For we through the Spirit wait for the hope of righteousness by faith. For in Jesus Christ neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision; but faith which worketh by love." (Gal. 5:5-6)

As we preach and live the truth and power of God's grace, mercy, and love towards us (sinners saved by grace) in Christ, unbelievers often accuse us of being antinomians (against the law) and paving the way for sinful behavior. When this happens, I want to ask them – If the reality of God's grace, mercy, and love for His people in Christ, whereby He justifies us in His sight based on Christ's righteousness imputed, cannot motivate a person to worship, serve, and obey the Lord's Word, then where does that leave him? It leaves him with no other motive than the evil, God-dishonoring, Christ-denying, motives of self-righteous legalists and mercenaries who seek to serve the Lord for gain. But make no mistake about it - true God-given faith works by love, grace, and gratitude for the things that God has freely and unconditionally given us in and by the Lord Jesus Christ. If righteousness and the blessings of salvation and eternal life come by our works, then Christ died in vain (Gal. 2:21). But He did not die in vain for His people. He not only established the only righteousness by which they are all justified – His righteousness imputed – He also gives them a new heart to serve the Lord and fight sin in newness of life (Rom. 7:4-6). This newness of life is that faith that works by love and which honors God and exalts Christ, the Lord our Righteousness. —Pastor Bill Parker

Cared For By the Creator

Elijah the prophet had the same essential needs as every other sinner. He will be provided for and cared for by his God in a way that causes him to lean more fully on Him and glorifies Him. God instructed him to go down to a particular brook and said, "I have commanded the ravens to feed thee there." Every creature and all the creation are under the sovereign rule of Him who made all things. Will these black birds actually be there? Will they bring sufficient to sustain him? Yes, they will, because Almighty God has "commanded" them to do so! God has often proved Himself to be the great Provider of His people. He has done so in unlikely places and by unlikely means. We should learn this as we look to the cross. It comes, sent of God, winging its way into our lives through the Gospel. It first appears dark and dreary, reminding us that we are sinners, assuring us that God hates sin and convincing us that God is just. But this raven has "bread" and "flesh" in his mouth. It brings the message of Christ and Him crucified - Christ who is the "Bread of Life" and "God manifest in the flesh." Hope and peace, righteousness and forgiveness, grace and mercy. "I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever: and the bread that I will give is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world ... Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day" (John 6:51; John 6:54). It is to the sinner as it was to the prophet, "Rise and eat." Believing on Christ, the raven becomes to us the white dove of peace! The "bread and flesh" of Christ becomes our Life!

Then, sometimes the providence that God sends to us at first seems to darken our sky like a flock of black ravens. Will they destroy us and pick our bones? Will they take away our every joy? No. They will "feed" us and bless us and bring us on our way to glory. They are messengers that work together for good to the His "called" ones that love Him. They will because He has "commanded" them to!

So, on any midnight dreary, if I ponder, weak and weary.

And need or unbelief come tapping on my chamber door.

God will send His ravens winging, bread and flesh to me there bringing,

And remind me that He'll leave me, "Nevermore!"
