"There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus." Romans 8:1

There is not a more blessed declaration than this in the whole word of truth. It is the sweetest note sounded by the gospel trumpet, for it is the very crown of the whole jubilee. Is not condemnation the bitterest drop in the cup of trembling? The most thrilling, piercing note of that terrible trumpet which sounded so long and so loud from Sinai's blazing top all the people that were in the camp trembled? (Exod. 19:13, 16)

Condemnation is the final execution of God's righteous law, and therefore carries with it all that arms death with its sting and the grave with its terror. The apprehension of this; the dread and fear of being banished for ever from the presence of God; of being lost, and that without remedy; of sinking under the blazing indignation of Him Who is a consuming fire, has filled thousands of hearts with horror.

And it must be so as long as the law speaks in its thunders, as long as conscience re-echoes its verdict, and as long as the wrath of God burns to the lowest hell. O the blessedness, then, of that word of grace and truth, worthy to be sounded through heaven and earth by the voice of cherubim and seraphim, "There is no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus!"

After Joseph revealed himself to his brethren in Egypt saying, "I am Joseph, your brother, whom ye sold into Egypt" (Gen. 45:4), he sent them back to their father with specific instructions of what they were to tell him: that God had made him lord of all Egypt (vs. 9); of all his glory in Egypt and all that they had seen (vs. 13). It is instructive and comforting to note that they were not told to tell their father what they had done! Not even their sin of selling Joseph into Egypt. Nor is there any indication that it was ever brought up in the presence of their father, or by Joseph.

It is even so with the greater Joseph, our Lord Jesus Christ. He graciously, lovingly, and savingly reveals Himself to His brethren with their sin in full view. But, He not only forgives our sins, He forgets them; they will never be brought up in the presence of the Father. His blood so thoroughly and completely cleanses us from all sin that God "remembers them no more" (Jer. 31:34; Rom 8:1, 33-34). He presents us to the Father "holy and unblameable and unreproveable in His sight" (Col. 1:21-22); and all of His brethren speak of what they have seen – HIM AND HIS GLORY!
