"Now faith is the substance (assurance, confidence) of things hoped for, the evidence (proof, conviction) of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1)

To know the true nature of faith in Christ, we must understand that faith is not an entity in and of itself and cannot be understood simply in the act of believing. All who have faith in Christ do believe in Him, but the power of God unto salvation is not in their believing. It is in Christ Who is the object of their faith. The foundation of faith is the Word of God. The object of faith is the Lord Jesus Christ in the glory of His Person and the power and success of His finished work as the Surety, Substitute, and Redeemer of His people whom God gave to Him before the foundation of the world. Christ is the fulfillment of the law for all who believe in Him (Rom. 10:4), and believing in Him is not just believing something. It is believing from the heart unto righteousness (Rom. 10:10).

Faith in Christ is a sovereign, powerful gift of God to His people, and it comes by revelation as God the Holy Spirit reveals the Gospel to His people (Rom. 1:16-17). We understand, then, that faith is not natural to sinful people. By nature, we have no capacity or desire to believe the truth as it is in Christ (Rom. 3:10-12; 1 Cor. 2:14). It is offensive to us (John 3:19-20). But God gives us a new heart to receive His truth of salvation in Christ with joy (John 1:12-13; Rom. 15:13; Eph. 2:8-9). The validity and power of God's truth is not in our believing it. Our believing something does not prove it to be true. God-given faith is in the truth of Christ crucified and risen from the dead, and it is true whether we believe or not. Our believing this truth simply gives evidence that we are objects of God's sovereign love, grace, and mercy in and by the Lord Jesus Christ. It is because of the power and the merits of Christ as the Savior of His people that all for whom He died and arose again will be given the gift of faith (John 12:32; 16:9-11).

Faith is not the impulsive or moving cause of justification. It is an act of pure and free grace, without any motive in the creature. Therefore, the Apostle saith, "being justified freely by His grace, through the redemption which is in Jesus Christ" (Eph. 1:7). But this benefit would not be of grace, but of works, if our faith was the impulsive cause of it, because faith is a work or act of ours, as we learn from the words of Christ – "This is the work of God, that ye believe on Him whom He hath sent" (John 6:29). Salvation is not of works, in any branch of it – "For by grace are ye saved, through faith; that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast" (Eph 2:8-9). From whence it is evident that justification, which is a considerable part of salvation, cannot be by works. The grace of God eminently appears in contriving the way of our justification by Christ's righteousness, and in sending Him into the world to work out a righteousness for us, in which we stand complete in HIS sight. Hence, we are said to be justified by His grace, that we might be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life (Titus 3:7). No other cause can be assigned why sinners are justified in the sight of God, than His free favour and sovereign pleasure, as the effect of which He determined to justify them in the righteousness of His Son.
