God's Word declares the oneness of truth and condemns EVERY DEPARTURE FROM THE TRUTH AS A DIRECT ATTACK ON GOD HIMSELF! Do not tell me that a man's heart is right with God when his head contains a creed of error and denies the Person and work of the Redeemer. —H. Binary

The Children of God

Forasmuch then as THE CHILDREN are partakers of flesh and blood, He also Himself likewise took part of the same; that through death He might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil" (Heb. 2:14). We who are saved by God's grace in Christ are children of God by divine election as we were chosen in Christ before the world began. Christ was made flesh and blood (His sinless humanity) because the children are partakers of flesh and blood. This enabled Him to die for our sins and bring reconciliation between God and His children. The Holy Spirit gives us life in the new birth because we already are the children of God - "But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth His Son, made of a woman, made under the law, to redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. AND BECAUSE YE ARE SONS, God hath sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father" (Gal. 4:4-6). Now, it is true that, even as children of God and elect before the world began, we fell in Adam into sin and death, and we are naturally born spiritually dead, depraved, and showing no evidence of being children of God. Before we are born again by the Holy Spirit, we are lost children, and by nature, in our own spirits, children of Satan, no different than children of wrath. Thank God for His grace to choose us and adopt us into His family where we are full-fledged children of God. -Pastor Bill Parker
