"And We Know"

"And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose." (Rom. 8:28)

The Greek for "know" means that we see something as true with the mind's eye (which means the heart) not necessarily by experience but by revelation from God. We do not always know by experience that all things, good and bad, work "together for good," because we are so limited in our knowledge of things present and cannot see the future.
