What Is "IT"?

"For what saith the Scripture? Abraham believed God, and IT was counted unto him for righteousness." (Romans 4:3)

What exactly did God impute (charge, credit, account, reckon) to Abraham (and to all true believers) for righteousness? In other words, how was Abraham made right with God? However it was for Abraham, it is the same for all justified sinners. Many, even most would claim that Abraham's believing was imputed to him for (or in place of) righteousness. But this is not the case. Our believing in Christ (which is the gift of God, by the power of the Spirit, and the fruit of righteousness) is not our righteousness, nor even counted as our righteousness, before God. Righteousness is perfect satisfaction to God's holy law and justice. Where can we find the perfection of righteousness whereby God would justify ungodly sinners (Rom. 4:5)? It is said that Abraham's "faith is counted for righteousness." What was Abraham's faith, i.e. what did Abraham believe? "Abraham believed God." And what did God promise It was the same promise that is given to all of His people – the Gospel promise of righteousness by the Lord Jesus Christ accomplished by His obedience unto death as the Surety, Substitute, and Redeemer of His people. This is "IT," the righteousness that God has freely imputed to all of God's elect as evidenced by their God-given faith in Christ (Rom. 1:16-17). "Even as David also describeth the blessedness of the man, unto whom GOD IMPUTETH RIGHTEOUSNESS without works" (Rom. 4:6). Another way to read Romahs 4:3 is, "Abraham believed God, and thus he was considered to be made right with God." It is clear, then, that Christ's righteousness is what is imputed to all who believe in Christ (Rom. 10:4).
