Who Will Be Abased, and Who Will Be Exalted?

The Lord concluded the parable of the Pharisee and the publican with these words – "for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted" (Luke 18:14). What is it for a person to exalt himself? Remember, the Lord spoke this parable to people who "trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others" (Luke 18:9). He then used the Pharisee who boasted in what he imagined God had enabled him to be and to do to be righteous. To exalt yourself, then, is to imagine yourself saved and accepted of God based on anything other than the righteousness of Christ freely imputed and received by faith. To exalt yourself or any sinner in this way is a denial of Christ. All who boast of such "shall be abased" in that God will expose the iniquity of their best efforts to establish their own righteousness before Him, and they will perish in their sins. The Lord then used the publican, an infamous sinner, who had nothing of or from himself in which to boast but only begged for mercy. He humbled himself as he saw his need of God's grace and mercy based on the sacrifice of Christ Who is the one and only mercy-seat. The publican expressed his need of Christ to satisfy the justice of God by working out righteousness for him. All who believe and rest in Christ, who glory in His cross, for the forgiveness of sin and the establishment of righteousness "shall be exalted" in glory as they will enter the eternal bliss of heaven in Christ. – Pastor Bill Parker

Christ Our Surety

My English dictionary defines a surety as "one who is legally liable for the debt, default, or failure of another." The Lord Jesus Christ is the Surety of the everlasting covenant of grace (Heb. 7:22; 13:20). Before the foundation of the world, He covenanted with the Father to be the Surety for the elect (Rev. 13:8). From that time the Father looked to Him to answer for those sinners, not as a mere co-signer, sponsor, or helper to make up for their deficiencies, but to assume and fully discharge ALL of their debts and obligations; for they are totally bankrupt! From the very moment that He, by covenant, agreed to be their Surety, the Father looked to Him for all that they owed. He fully satisfied God in their behalf. Therefore, they MUST be set free and enter into the glories of heaven. What a message of hope this is to guilty sinners! Full, free, everlasting salvation through the Lord Jesus Christ, their Surety, by faith, trust, and confidence in Him!
