How Great Is Your God?

There is a wonderful song we used to sing which talked about how big God is. However, the important question is, “HOW GREAT IS YOUR GOD?” This question demands individual responses based on your relationship with Him.

As for me, I can say my God is big enough to take care of all my problems and meet all my needs. Philippians 4:19 says, “But my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.” That principle changed the desperation in the life of the widow of Zarephath into a miracle (1 Kings 17). How great is your God?

A close examination of God’s word reveals that God is so big, it is mind-boggling. Beloved, not only did God create the entire universe -- He also created you and me. As numerous as we are on earth, God created each of us uniquely, particularly and meticulously. Even identical twins demonstrate the greatness of the Almighty God in different ways. No wonder Psalm 139:14 says, “I will praise Thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvelous are Thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well.”

We can sing songs about how big God is, but the truth is in some instances we imagine Him to be so small, we belittle Him. It is sad and should not be that way, but that is how it is. The Almighty God, Who is the creator of heaven and earth, is bigger and greater than any problem and any need. We can triumph over all adversity because of the greatness of our God. Yet as big and as miraculous as our God is, He always cares about us:

- (1) He knows when a tear falls from our eyes: “Thou tellest my wanderings: put Thou my tears into Thy bottle: are they not in Thy book?” (Psalm 56:8);
- (2) He knows the number of hairs on our heads: “But the very hairs of your head are all numbered” (Matthew 10:30); and

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(3) He always provides for us: “Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they?” (Matthew 6:26)

Let Us Now Consider The Greatness Of God As Outlined In His Word, the Holy Bible:

1. The Greatness of God at Creation: “In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth” (Genesis 1:1). He created all things by the power of His spoken word except man, who was created out of clay (Genesis 3:14). If God is powerful enough to create visible out of invisible, He is greater than any power imaginable.

2. The greatness of God at the time of the flood (Genesis 6). Christians today think too little about God’s greatness and the magnitude of His power. The acknowledgment of God in our daily lives has diminished just as it did at the time of Noah when every man did as he pleased. That righteous man, Noah, was able to save his entire family and consequently preserved humanity when God executed judgment on the earth.

God is bigger than any problem and any need.

3. The greatness of God at the call of Abram (Genesis 12). The Lord spoke to Abram while he lived among people that did not fear God in the pagan land of Mesopotamia. God gave Abram a command with four aspects to it. He was to go: (1) from his land; (2) from his relatives; (3) from his father’s house; and (4) to a land chosen by God, which was not mentioned. In fear and awe of God’s greatness, Abram obeyed and left. Obedience to God often requires forsaking something familiar in order to receive something better.

4. The greatness of God in the life of Joseph (Genesis 37). Like Jacob his father, Joseph received dreams from God about his life and destiny. His older brothers planned to kill him so that his dreams would die with him. By the greatness of the Almighty God, he was sold into slavery in preparation for the days of famine when he would save his family and generations to come.

5. The Greatness of God in the land of Egypt (Exodus 2). When all male children born in the camp of the Israelites were to be killed, God, by His greatness, preserved Moses because of a unique assignment He had for him.

A. The greatness of God at the site of the burning bush (Exodus 3). “And the LORD said, I have surely seen the affliction of my people which are in Egypt, and

have heard their cry by reason of their taskmasters; for I know their sorrows” (Exodus 3:7).

B. The greatness of God at the Red Sea (Exodus 14:21-30). At the Red Sea when there seemed to be no way out, God, by His mighty power, parted the sea. The hand that guided Israel and enabled them to pass safely through the Red Sea on dry land was the same hand that closed the sea on their enemies, who perished.

6. The greatness of God in the life of the wife of the prophet (2 Kings 4:1-7). The Lord showed His greatness in the life of the widow when, by His great power, the little she had was transformed to abundance.

7. The greatness of God in the life of the Shunammite woman when she got her only son back to life (2 Kings 4:8-37). Although the headline of that story in the Bible is titled “Miracle of The Shunammite’s Son”, I believe it should be retitled, “The Greatness Of God In The Life Of The Shunammite Woman And Her Son.”

8. The greatness of God in the land of Babylon (Daniel 3). We also see the greatness of the Lord in the lives of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego. Though bound and thrown into the fire they were unharmed, but those who threw them in were consumed by the fire and died (19-25). The mighty God opened the eyes of the ungodly king to see His greatness. The king was astonished to see a fourth man walking in the fire with them and affirmed that. “... the form of the fourth is like the Son of God” (Daniel 3:25).

Also in Daniel Chapter 6, a decree was passed because of a conspiracy to eliminate Daniel. Again, we see the greatness of the Almighty God when he turned the conspiracy against Daniel’s enemies, who were all devoured by the lions.

9. The greatness of God at the birth of Jesus (Luke 1: 26-37). Isn’t the virgin birth of Jesus Christ seemingly mythological and scientifically impossible? Critics claim that the idea of the virgin birth is historically unconvincing and without merit. No wonder few in His homeland were aware of His birth until wise men from the East came inquiring. God, in His greatness, did that to baffle the critics, to confuse the enemy and to confound the wisdom of the wise.

10. The greatness of God in feeding the multitude (Matthew 14:15-20). Jesus had compassion on the crowd and fed five thousand men beside women and children, with only five loaves and two fishes. Interestingly, twelve baskets were left over from what seemed insufficient for a grown man. This is the only miracle of Jesus recorded in all four gospels and all four state, “Everyone ate and was filled.” Now, let us consider this question: Why twelve leftover baskets? The answer is obvious: Those who serve the Lord enjoy

the abundant life that Jesus gives. He provides bountifully and His large rewards are for anyone committed to His kingdom work.

11. The greatness of God at Lazarus' death (John 11:1-44). Lazarus, who had been dead and buried for four days was called back to life by Jesus. Jesus acknowledged the greatness of the Father when He lifted up His eyes and said, "Father, I thank Thee that Thou hast heard Me. And I knew that Thou hearest Me always.' ... And when He thus had spoken, He cried with a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come forth.' And he that was dead came forth ..." (John 11:41-44).

12. The greatness of God at the end of the ages (Revelation 2:17). Regarding the latter day Jesus says, "...To him that overcometh will I give ... a new name written, which no man knoweth saving he that receiveth it" (Revelation 2:17).

The greatness of the Almighty God will be revealed on that day and each and every one will be judged according to the things written in the book of life (Revelation 20:11-15).

God's large rewards are for anyone committed to His kingdom work.

Beloved, how great is your God, how big is your problem and how serious is your predicament? To you, the greatness of your God depends on what you can believe Him for or what you can entrust into His care. In the day of adversity, if you meditate on a verse of scripture and trust in God, then you will know that Your God is big enough to deliver you.

How great is your God? 2 Chronicles 2:5-6 confirms that great is our God above all gods and that the heaven and heaven of heavens cannot contain Him. However, in spite of His greatness, Romans 8:39 states that nothing "... shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." In reality, your God is as big as you will allow Him to be. Do not allow challenges of life to be bigger than your God. It is an insult to Almighty God when you look up to your problems and you look down on Him. Again, ***How great is your God?***
