

All Elders were present with Rev. Rick Martindale as Moderator of Session.

Elders approved a motion from Outreach to **donate \$500.00** from the Mission Fund to **Camp Monroe**.

Elders approved a motion from Outreach to allow **Haiti**, **Help and Hope** to conduct a fundraiser to help raise \$2,000.00 to fund four months of daily breakfast for the students at **Pastor Sidor's school in Haiti**.

The present office copier contract is coming due in April. Elder approved Finance's motion to award the new five-year contract to **Copiers Plus**.

Elders approved a motion from Worship to schedule in person worship services in the sanctuary beginning on April 11 with the understanding that date could be changed if a guest minister cannot be scheduled. The service will be heard in the parking lot on 91.3, and it will be videoed to upload to the internet.


Elders approved the scheduling of an Easter Sunrise Service at 7:00 a.m. followed by a "take home" biscuit breakfast and an opportunity to make a donation to the Mission Fund.

We welcome your input and would love for you to join us!



HAITI, HELP and HOPE MINISTRY

Lahai Roi School in Haiti has grown from 60 students to 400. Due to widespread poverty, most go without food at home. Pastor Sidor provides breakfast of a roll and peanut butter for \$500 a month. Lunch consist of rice and beans at a cost of \$1000 a month. God so graciously provides each day so these children can be fed!

The Haiti Help and Hope ministry sends money each month for salaries and breakfast.

Crosspoint Church in Georgia sends money for lunch each month. We learned from Pastor Sidor in December that he had only been able to feed the children breakfast 2 or 3 times a week. There were many empty tummies! A generous donor gave \$2000 to pay for 4 months of breakfasts. Since January the children have been served breakfast every day. That time is running out and we would like to start a campaign to raise \$2000 for 4 more months.



We all have loose change, a piggy bank, a jar, or bucket of coins. Please prayerfully consider donating to this campaign. If you have coins, they can be dropped off at the church office. Cash and checks are great too! The last time we filled our large coin tower, we raised \$1700! We can meet or beat that goal with your generosity!



Finance Ministry: Chairman Danny Aldridge & Vice Chair Diann Fortune

Luke 14:28 For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it?

Meeting Schedule:

The Finance Ministry is still meeting in the Session Room following its regular schedule of the second Sunday of the month. The Session meeting follows at 6:00 in the Fellowship Hall. Church members are welcome to attend. **Financial Status:**

The Sandhills Accounting Services February 2021 Financial Report shows that the monthly income was about \$25.00 short for paying February bills but overall, the church is holding steady financially. The Liquid Asset accounts indicate 9.42 months of operating funds, 6 months of which are reserve funds for emergencies. The Presbytery recommends 1 year of reserves but a previous Culdee session set a goal of 6 months of reserves. Reserves are growing currently because the salary for a full-time pastor is not being paid.

The transactions for the investments approved by the Session at the February meeting have been completed. The 6-months reserve funds will remain secure in CDs.

Savings, CDs and Investments:

Currently Culdee has all three types of accounts. They each serve the church's needs differently. The Finance Ministry's job is to communicate together and with the Culdee Investments Committee who consult financial experts as needed. The Culdee Investments Committee then makes a recommendation to the Finance Ministry explaining the type of account that will provide the most growth on gifts and contributions given to God balanced with an appropriate level of risk. After discussion, the Finance Ministry makes a recommendation to the Session and the Session decides whether or not to approve the recommendation.

For instance, the Sarah Ann Fortune Fund is an account established to continue into perpetuity (forever). Due to it's purpose, is not an account that will be drained of funds rapidly; therefore, it was decided to invest those funds with a professional investment company for them to oversee. The risk is moderate and its earnings will go up and down as the market does. But since the fund is for perpetuity, the year's end historically shows greater earnings than a savings account or CD.

Culdee also has monies called Liquid Asset Funds. The 6-month reserve is part of this money. The Finance Ministry recommended that money over the 6-month reserve be invested for maximum growth and the 6-month reserves continue in CDs for the time being.

Lightning Strike & Insurance Update:

The lightning-damaged television in the Fellowship Hall has been replaced and is reconnected to the church's WIFI network. Additionally, the sound board for the sound system in the Sanctuary has been replaced with the most current technology. The company completing the insurance work has included training as part of the installation contract. Beverly Dunlop will be looking for interested folks to volunteer for the training session.

The amplifier for the chimes has not arrived. Once that is replaced and it is determined there is no further damage, this portion of the claim will be complete.

Currently the insurance team is waiting on the evaluation from the electrician concerning potential electrical issues affecting the sanctuary lights and the irrigation pump for the sprinkler system. These items will be treated as another portion of the original claim should lightning be the culprit. Once these two issues are resolved, the insurance claim should be complete and the church reimbursed for the remainder of costs by the insurance company.

Copier Contract:

The contract for the church's copier has undergone the bid process and is almost complete. A new contract is expected to be signed before the existing contract expires in May. It will cost less monthly and provide more and faster copies.

Repairs:

Culdee has been blessed through the years to have folks that felt pride in and took responsibility for, not only providing quality buildings, but maintaining them in a manner that honors God. Before the interim pastor left, a team of ladies drew up a list of repairs needed around the manse, much of which has been completed. There are additional areas in the basement from previous water damage that need to be addressed - replacing sheetrock, trim, molding and painting. Buildings always need attending and maintaining.

Appreciation:


