NEWSLETTER POLICIES

- The Pastor of Culdee shall serve as the Editor over all content.
- The articles from each committee shall report only actions taken and events and actions which will occur in the future.
- Due to stewardship of resources, all reports shall be a single page or less with double spacing using a Times New Roman font, and for editing purposes, in Word format.
- Exception for the Finance Committee Report – one page or less for the committee's report; however, all numeric pages needed for the monthly report are to be used.
- Exception shall be granted for the Pastor's article; though, every attempt should be used to keep to the one-page limit.
- There shall be a proofreader to insure grammatical content.
- Committees should make their reports by the 20th of the month in order to offer sufficient time for formatting and proofreading.
- The Pastor and Administrative Assistant shall have the right to cancel the newsletter production or adjust the date of publication due to work load of **paucity** of reports.

Actions from the December 9 Stated Session Meeting

- Elders approved a Congregational/Incorporation meeting for Sunday, December 29 immediately following the 11:00 a.m. service.
- Elders approved the request from Beverly Dunlop to begin a puppet ministry with interested youth. The program will use the classroom on the left as you enter the sanctuary building from the Sun Room. A lock will be placed on the door to insure the protection of the puppets and equipment. The puppet ministry will be under Christian Education and will meet on Sundays between the REACH service and Sunday School, with Emily Marion as leader. At the same time, younger children will continue working on music with Beverly Dunlop.
- Christian Education is continuing to accept applications for the Nursery Attendant's position.
- Elders approved a set of Newsletter Policies which will be placed in Culdee's Manual of Administrative Operations.
- Elders did not act on the proposed 2020 budget. The 2019 Budget will be in effect until the any needed changes are made and brought back to Session for approval.
- The Endowment Committee's Policies and Procedures will be placed in the Session Book in appreciation for the time and effort put into its creation and to make it available for future reference if needed.

The Finance Ministry had recommended that the Session revisit the offering of automated deductions for Culdee members and it was reported that the Session had decided not to pursue this concept at this time.

The year in review.....God allowed us to be blessings in so many ways!

* We supported the Moore Free and Charitable Clinic in Southern Pines that provides primary care services at low or no cost to eligible adult residents in Moore County. By providing quality primary care to the uninsured, they help reduce the burden of preventable health problems in the community. We were blessed to have Tony Price, the clinic's CEO, join us in a Moment for Missions during our 11 o'clock service on April 27.

* One of our new missions was Pilgrim's Progress, a safe house in Pinehurst for men struggling with drug and alcohol addiction. This ministry house is the medium from detox to treatment and focuses on instilling Christian values and expressing the love of Jesus Christ to all who enter its doors. The residents attend 12-step meetings and church services. Recently their van was in urgent need of replacement and Culdee, along with several other churches, stepped up to meet that need. Thanks to God they were able to purchase a quality van to continue their work. A few weeks ago we also held a donation drive in the sunroom for men's pants, socks and underwear. I delivered a car full of much needed items to their house in Pinehurst on December 12.

* A continuing mission for Culdee is the Sandhills Coalition. Established in 1986 by eleven local churches, the Coalition now operates a client services center as well as a resale shop. The Coalition offers a wealth of services including food, clothing and financial assistance to struggling households in Moore County. This year's Harvest Festival chose the Coalition as its mission focus and dozens of food bags were collected during Revival in September.

I look forward to seeing where God leads us in 2020!

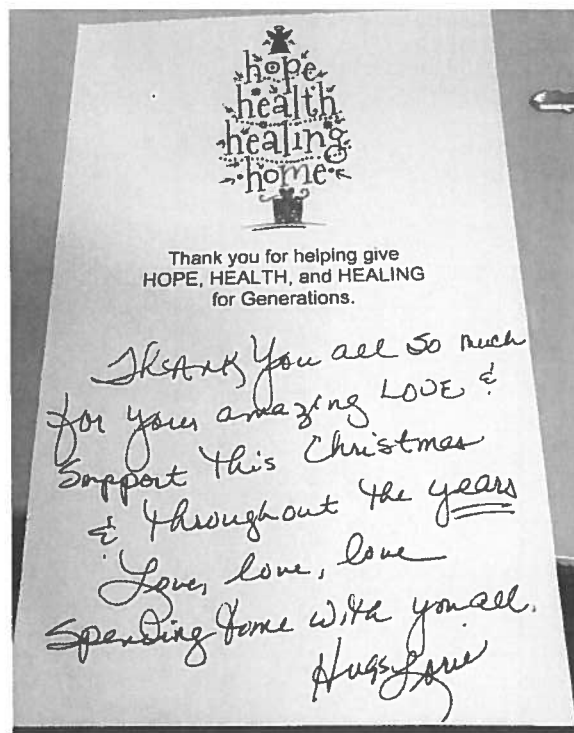
remembers God. Let's make plans to enlarge our circle of women to include some of our younger ladies.

Children's Hope Alliance (Barium Springs Home for Children)

On December 8, Lori Fees from Children's Hope Alliance spoke briefly during worship service thanking the church for providing gifts for children in their care. She refers to Culdee as "rock stars" of support! We have been supporting Barium Springs for many years and your help in this project is always appreciated. There are 400,000 children in North Carolina who have an emotional, mental or behavioral disorder. There are 115,000 NC children who do not live with a parent and 112,000 in the U.S. waiting to be adopted. Each year 19, 000 children age out of foster care without being adopted or reunified with family members. One in four foster children age out of care are later arrested. Of note, one in two foster children graduate from high school.

November 10, 2019

Session met in Room A of the Fellowship Hall building at 6:00 p.m. with a quorum of Elders in attendance.

Call to Order and Affirmation of Quorum: Rev. Jane Love, Moderator and Interim Pastor

Devotion and Prayer: Karon McKenzie, Elder of the Month

Consent Agenda: The following minutes were received and approved by vote of Elders.

- **Stated Session** of October 13, 2019 and **Congregational Meeting** of October 27, 2019

Clerk's Report:

- Active Membership Roll is at 146
- Elders approved, by vote, the request by Joan Altman to have her name removed from the Active Membership Roll.
- On October 16, a poll of Elders was taken on the following item of business: "A Congregational Meeting will be scheduled on October 27, 2019 to hear and act on the report of the Nominating Committee." The motion was approved by a quorum of Elders.
- On October 20, a poll of Elders was taken on the following item of business: "The motion from the Christian Education Ministry is to hire a nursery attendant with the discussed applicant in consideration." The motion was approved by a quorum of Elders.

OLD BUSINESS:

Christian Education Ministry reported that a contract had been sent to a discussed applicant for the **Nursery Attendant's** position. The applicant wants more information on whose supervision she would be under and who would pay for the required CPR training before deciding if she will sign the contract. A 3-month trial will when a contract is signed for the position. Christian Education will come back to session with further developments.

OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

Worship Ministry reported that nothing has been done, as of yet, about a new church brochure.

After the Congregational Conversation held on October 27th at 3:00 p.m., one follow-up comment card suggested that it would be helpful for the members of the congregation to know what the guidelines, duties, and responsibilities are for each session ministry /committee. Session has previously discussed the need to update all such documents.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Training dates for all Elders who will be serving in 2020 will be set for November or December.
- Pastor Jane requested continuing education time off for an **Inservice for a Pre-Retirement Seminar** that will be held at First Presbyterian in Dunn on November 11 - 13. She would like to take off the rest of that week as well if a guest minister can be found. Elders approved her request.
- Discussion was held and approval given to setting general guidelines for the **Culdee Newsletter**. Diann Fortune is putting her extensive computer skills to work laying out the pages of the newsletter so they are both attractive and easy to read. A committee of 2 or 3 would assist by checking for theological correctness; spelling/grammar/wording; and encouraging all ministries, committees, and groups to get involved by sharing news and facts in articles about the events and activities going on in the life of the church. Pastor Jane volunteered to check for theological soundness, and Eve Williamson volunteered to help with proofreading. Another volunteer would be welcomed.
- The Elders voted to set Sunday, December 1 at 10:30 a.m. for the **Ground Breaking Service** for the **Youth's Basketball/Shelter Project**.

A document recording three motions related to the Endowment Committee was made available to Elders and guests to review. Pastor Jane reminded guests that they would be able to comment during the discussion period for each motion that received a second, if they were first recognized by the Moderator. Speakers would alternate pro and con and should limit their comments to 2-3 minutes.

The **first motion** considered by the Elders received a second and was opened for discussion. The motion read, "The Finance Committee will elect one or two of its members to oversee the interest rates, investment opportunities, etc. applicable to the church's invested funds and make recommendations. The Finance Committee will take recommendations to the Session, as needed." As read, it was approved (not unanimous.... three nays).

OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

Following some discussion, a friendly amendment was made to the first motion. It then read, "The Finance Committee will **set the number of its members** to oversee the interest rates, investment opportunities, etc. applicable to the church's invested funds and make recommendations. The Finance Committee will take recommendations to the Session, as needed." Elders voted and approved the amended motion (not unanimous.... two nays and one abstention)

The **second motion** considered by the Elders read, "We'd like to move that the Culdee Session revisit their decision to dissolve the Culdee Endowment Fund Committee and its Policy and Procedures and reinstate the Culdee Endowment Fund Committee and its Policy and Procedures due to.....possible confusion and misunderstanding of its purpose by some Session members, and conversations at the "Everything Finance" meeting recently conducted by Interim Pastor Jane Love where congregation members voiced the following concerns.....the removal of a layer of financial oversight on losing a team of interested and knowledgeable members concerned with the wise, secure investing of God's money, and the concern over the manner in which the dissolution occurred."

The **second motion** received a second. Following a period of discussion, the Elders voted; the motion was defeated (not unanimous....2 ayes)

The third motion read, "The Endowment Committee and its Policies and Procedures Guidelines should be reinstated." The motion received no second; there forth, the Session did not take it up.

Pastor Jane had a prayer and thanked all the guests for their attendance and participation.

MINISTRY REPORTS:

Building and Grounds: Ryan Bailey / Rick Mathews

- More LED will be placed in the Fellowship Hall Building.

Outreach: Amber Clayton

- The motion (Jim Dalton/Karon McKenzie) was made to base the 35% designated for missions from the 2019 Harvest Festival earnings on the gross figure. The Elders approved the motion (not unanimous...one abstention)
- From the committee, the motion was made to give the entire 35% to the Sandhills Coalition because it was advertised that way and the money will be used in a variety of ways by the ministry to help the community. The vote to approve was unanimous.

- Plans will be made for the Christmas Party that will follow the Christmas Program.
- From Committee, the motion was made to approve the curriculum, "We Saved You A Seat" for Stephanie Barber's Girls Class. The Elders are appreciative of her willingness to take over the class.

Finance: Jim Dalton / Tim Bailey

- Elders received the monthly financial sheet for October.
- General discussion was held on the budget process and what it should look like. Each ministry was asked if they anticipated increasing their budget request and why, or did they anticipate holding at the same level as 2019. Finance will get each ministry a spreadsheet of their budget breakdown before the next Stated Session.

Worship: Janie Taylor / Johnie Marion

- Reminder of Community Thanksgiving Service on November 24; Thanksgiving Breakfast/PW Thank Offering Program; Christmas Program/Party on December 8.

Pastor Jane noted that all material (Mission Statement, Results of the Church Vitality Survey, and a request letter) the West Community's **Committee on Ministry** would need to consider approving our request to form a PNC has been delivered ahead of their upcoming meeting on November 5. She will contact Rev. Martindale to see if the committee reached a decision.

There being no further business to come before the Session, the meeting was adjourned and then closed in prayer by Pastor Jane. The next Stated Session meeting is scheduled for Sunday, December 8, 2019.
