

2022 Budget:

The Culdee Session approved the 2022 Culdee Budget at their November 14, 2021 meeting after much thought, discussion and research. The budget will be presented to the congregation during January and will be placed in the bulletin a week before to give members time to look it over.

The Presbyterian Church (USA) Book of Order explains that the Session determines all the budget except for the compensation (Call) of the pastor. The Book of Order states that the only part of the annual budget the congregation votes on is the Pastor's Call. There are projected amounts for the pastor in the 2022 budget but they will likely change to meet the needs of the new pastor (when one is engaged). The congregation will vote on the Pastor's Call once the PNC presents a potential candidate for installation.

Staff Changes:

Culdee Finance Ministry extends much appreciation to Office Manager Edith Martin for her many years of service and wishes her much joy in her new adventure! Her retirement date is January 15, 2022.

In searching for someone to try and fill Edith's shoes, there could be some changes around Culdee to fit current needs and finances. The first priority continues to be able to fully support a pastor financially. Some options discussed in Finance to support this priority were to adjust the days and hours that the church office is manned by paid staff. During times when no one would be in the office, the message on the phone would continue to provide the name of the Elder of the Month along with contact information. That way if someone had a need, that person would know how to contact church leaders for assistance. If office hours change, some new volunteer opportunities could be upcoming--which is also exciting.

Financial Status:


