The Role of Fear in Conflict

It needs to be stated that conflict in faith communities, as in families, businesses, and within other groups, is common and natural. We are constantly in conflict as we make decisions with other people because we often have different information, motives, and positions. Most of this conflict is resolved through conversations where the parties debate the merits of any given decision and a consensus is reached.

There are times, however, when conflicts arise that are not resolved or, at least, not resolved fully. Over time, these unresolved conflicts can become a problem especially within a faith community. One reason conflict might “go underground” is that members of the faith community do not think conflict should happen among the people of God, and the natural reaction is to ignore the unresolved conflict hoping God will handle it.

This brings us to the role of fear in conflict. It might be suggested that this fear is the fear of not winning the conflict, but it is not that straight forward. To understand the subtleties, it is important to know that each of us has three basic emotional needs¹. The first is the need to like ourselves and to be liked by other people. This need is called **Identity**. The second emotional need is to feel safe from harm, from abuse, to be housed, clothed and fed, and to be part of a community. This emotional need is called **Security**. The third emotional need is to feel in control of our lives, to be able to make decisions for ourselves, and not have others give us unsolicited advice on how we are to live or behave. This need is called **Empowerment**.

As children we develop strategies designed to make us feel as if these emotional needs are being met. Some of these strategies are helpful and some are toxic or detrimental. For instance, the compliant child will get the attention they crave (identity and security). The oppositional child will get the attention they crave and, even though the attention might be punishment, it still makes the child feel as if his/her emotional needs are being met. As adults, we continue to develop these strategies – some helpful (cooperation) and some toxic (bullying and demanding).

Even when a conflict appears to be about scarce resources, these three emotional needs will play a role. A classic example is the story of two sisters baking something for the family. They are using two different recipes and each recipe calls for a single lemon. They only have one lemon. Conflict arises until they learn that one recipe requires juice of the lemon and the other requires only the zest of the lemon. Conflict was resolved by asking why the lemon was important. But behind the conflict is the concern each sister

has about her identity (being perceived as a good cook who ensures all ingredients are available) and empowerment (I've decided to use the lemon for my recipe).

Successful (Christ-centered, spirit led) resolution of conflict within your faith community requires sensitivity to these three emotional needs and the strategies being used. At its core, the conflict is always going to be about the failure of one or more strategies.

Where conflict arises in the faith community it is important to have someone act as a third-party neutral (pastor, experienced mediator in the congregation or a good listener). The following steps might be helpful in providing closure and reconciliation:

1. Identify the stakeholders in the conflict – not to be confused with folks who have been recruited by a stakeholder to support the stakeholder's position.
2. Meet with the stakeholders in a neutral area (a pastor's office can be intimidating) – it is important that each stakeholder hear what the other has to say.
3. Establish a ground rule that each will listen to the other with respect.
4. Ask each stakeholder to "help you to understand what is going on" – try to use neutral language and active listening.
5. Once each has shared his or her understanding, you need to determine "positions" – what is it that each stakeholder wants.
6. For each position, ask: "why is that so important to you?" – listen carefully to the answer because it will lead directly to the emotional need not being met:
 - a. Getting hurt feelings about the way they have been treated – identity.
 - b. Feeling left out by not being asked for input about a decision that was made – identity and empowerment.
 - c. Having a decision announced that somehow affected them – empowerment and security (am I still in a valued relationship within the community).
 - d. Hearing a criticism relayed by someone else – identity and security.
7. Once an emotional need has been identified, often the conflict can be resolved through meeting the need by an apology, a promise to change behavior, an invitation to participate in a review of a decision, by an affirmation of the stakeholder's importance to the community, or all of the above.

Conflict is normal and even helpful in making decisions within the community. Special attention needs to be paid to conflict that is interfering with the spiritual growth or mission of the community. This article provides some direction for identifying the source of conflict and how to approach resolution. Where additional support is needed, the Conflict Transformation Team is available to answer questions about specific issues, and to provide trained mediators to offer their services to you and your faith community.

Clerk's Report:

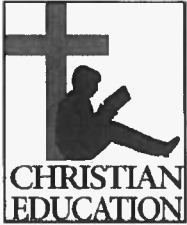
- Active Membership Roll is 144

Worshipping in Spirit and Truth

Worshipping with others each Sunday is an important part of Christian life. It should be a joyful experience for everyone yet some leave empty and unmoved . Worship only becomes a true joy when we allow God’s Spirit to take control – when we become participants and not just spectators. The following ‘food for thought’ excerpt is from an article entitled *Worship in Spirit and Truth* written by Rev. David Mathis.’ Rev. Mathis is the executive editor for the Desiring God Organization and pastor at Cities Church in Minneapolis/St. Paul, Minnesota.

Rev. Mathis writes – “The issue is not whether we will worship, but what. Even better, *whom* and *how*. When we ready ourselves for corporate worship, perhaps the most significant biblical text is Jesus’s words in John 4:23-24, “*The hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.*” True worship says Jesus is in *spirit* and *truth*. The “truth” part centers on his person and work, the one who is himself “the Truth”. It is this “word of truth” by which we’re given new birth, and for those who are new creatures in Christ, our “spirit” owes its existence to the “Spirit of God”. As John Piper writes, “True worship comes only from spirits made alive and sensitive by the quickening of the Spirit of God” (*Desiring God*, 82). God’s Spirit ignites and energizes our spirit. It necessitates *true doctrine* about the Father and his Son, and *due emotion* about that doctrine. It is both an affair of the heart and an affair of the mind.

The essence of true worship is not external, but internal – heart and head, emotion and thought, spirit and truth – whether we’re talking all of life as worship or corporate gatherings for worship. Yet, some are prone to identify worship with the externals: how nice (or shabby) the building is, how many are in attendance, how good the music is, how gifted the preacher is, or whether someone is waving a hand distractingly. But external forms are not the essence of our worship. True worship is internal – it flows from the heart and mind – it is Spirit and truth. “

Worshipping the living God in Spirit and truth has a way of changing things, including us. True worship done properly, becomes a joy not a task, and goes far beyond Sunday morning as we find ourselves praising and honoring God in all we say and do.



Finance Ministry: Chairman Danny Aldridge & Vice Chair Diann Fortune

2020 Budget Update: The Finance Ministry presented a draft of the 2020 Proposed Budget to the Session at their February 9, 2020 scheduled meeting. Chairman Danny Aldridge explained the budget development process of comparing the actual expenditures provided by Culdee's accountant at Sandhills Accounting Services with the 2019 Session approved budget. The 2020 Proposed Budget was adjusted to an amount aligned with what was actually spent in each individual line item. Any line item that had a budgeted amount with no money spent in 2019 was adjusted to zero for 2020. Funds may be requested from the Session if a need arises. The budget was approved provided funds were returned to the Confirmation Class line and the Pastors Terms of Call were clarified.

The budget begins with the Pastors Terms of Call which breaks down specifically how the pastor is paid. The 2019 budget had figures lumped together making it challenging to clearly grasp the exact expense to Culdee and the documentation from Sandhills Accounting Services had amounts that weren't calculating correctly based on information provided both by Interim Pastor Jane Love and the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina. The Proposed 2020 Budget breaks the Pastors Terms of Call into its individual components as listed by the Presbytery for easy clarification. Through this process, Interim Pastor Jane Love directed Finance Ministry to the Treasurer of the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina, Gayle Boykin, for assistance in understanding the compensation package. After additional clarification from Gayle Boykin at the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina, Finance Ministry has adjusted the figures in the Pastors Terms of Call. Since they are different from what was approved, the Session will have to vote on the changes.

Basketball Court Funding: Finance Ministry also determined that a new account be established to separate funds specifically designated for the Youth's Multipurpose Basketball Court project from the pre-existing funds designated for youth and youth activities. Culdee Treasurer Ann Savage will be checking records to identify funds that were specifically designated for the basketball court so they may be moved to this new account. The youth can decide to keep some pre-existing funds for snacks and activities and may want to use a portion of pre-existing funds for the purpose of the basketball court after informing the Session of its intent.

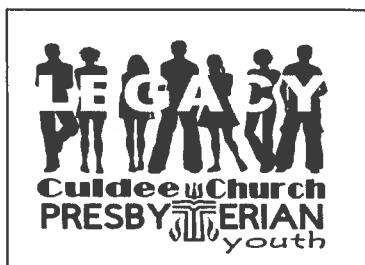
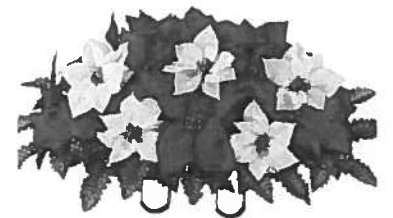
Presbyterian Men: Wade Garner
