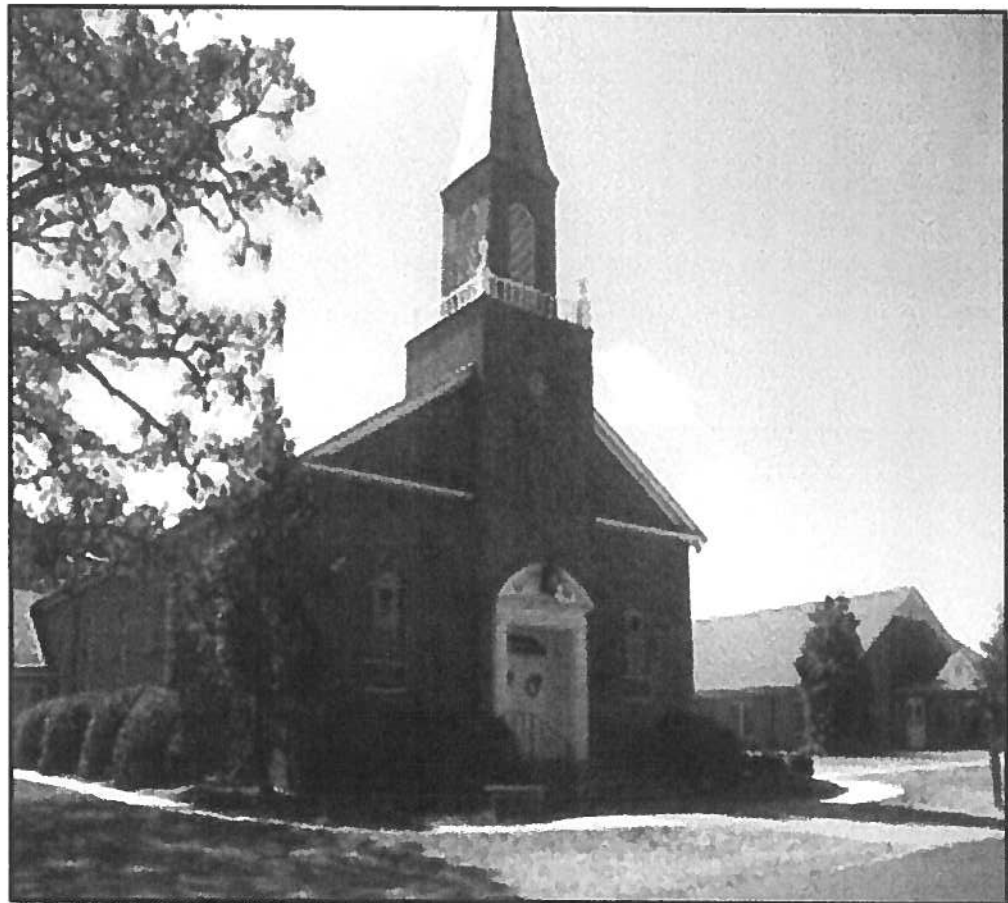

## OUTREACH

In the early 1980's a fellowship of local churches recognized a more efficient system was needed to assist struggling families in the Moore County area. Eleven charter churches came together to form the **Sandhills/Moore Coalition for Human Care**. The Coalition is located in Southern Pines and leases their location on Pennsylvania Avenue from the town for just \$1 a year.

Today the Coalition is supported by over 60 area churches (including Culdee), the United Way of Moore County and countless individuals and businesses. The Coalition is now comprised of 2 campuses – the retail shop/donation center is located on Pennsylvania Ave and the client services center is located on Indiana Ave.

The Coalition is always in need of donations and volunteers! For a list of current needs you can visit their website for a weekly list of several urgently needed items (diapers are always a must have). Also, there is a link to volunteer either in the shop or in the client services center. Morning and afternoon shifts are available. ***If anyone is interested in volunteering with me please let me know and we can go together or as a church group.***

# **Session Minutes**

## **Stated Session Meeting**

Below are the items acted on by the Elders at the August 11 Stated Session Meeting.

- Approved the following: Going forward with the Youth Project (half-court basketball/shelter).
- Approved the following: Scheduled three meetings to review/discuss the results of the Church Vitality Survey with the congregation.....Sunday, Aug. 18 from 5-7 p.m.; Wednesday, Aug.21 from 6-8 p.m.; Sunday, August 25 from 5-7p.m. All meetings will be held in the Fellowship Hall.
- Approved the following: The weekly stewardship statement and the monthly financial report will not be placed in the weekly bulletin. In an effort to make sure transparency is present, the weekly stewardship statement will be posted outside the church office and on the bulletin board over the water fountain in the Fellowship Hall building. The monthly financial report will be published in the monthly newsletter.
- Approved the following: For clarity and transparency, the finance ministry will be directed to show the weekly and monthly stewardship report of income broken out to general operating fund total and designated funds total.
- Approved the following: The Elder Nominating Committee will include Elders Rick Mathews, Chair and Karen McKenzie. A representative from the PW, PM, Youth, and two elected members of the congregation will complete the committee.
- Elders, joyfully and thankfully, affirmed Diann Fortune's willingness to coordinate the Culdee Newsletter!

Update since the Stated Session on August 11:

1. The Session is at work on a plan to best respond to the questions raised by attendees at the Church Vitality Survey meetings.
2. Also, the Nominating Committee now includes Jewell Vest from PW; Jim Stewart, PM; and Adin Patterson from Youth. Two members of the congregation will be added at a Congregational Meeting scheduled for September 8<sup>th</sup> immediately following the 11:00 worship service.

## Making the Move

On August 18<sup>th</sup>, you may have noticed the Stewardship Statement was removed from the bulletin; however, the same information is readily available on the bulletin board to the left of the entry door to the church's offices, and also, the information is posted on the bulletin board in the fellowship hall over the water fountain across from the Choir Room. If mobility issues prevent you from gaining access to either of these two spots, you may call the church office on Wednesdays from 10am – 11am. and gain the information.

I wanted to briefly reflect on the reasons Session has taken this step, though there was a recommendation from your Finance Committee to keep the statement in the bulletin. The reasons I list here have come from my experience with other churches, but I will offer insights from two articles\*\* that I shared with the Session.

1. AVOID CONFUSION -Generational Giving has resulted in a shift in the way people give. In the past, many people gave each week; however, now many people give in lump sums ( for example, taxes in April or December); if you offer weekly statements, the normal low giving patterns in certain months suggest the church is in financial trouble when, in reality, it is a normal pattern for that month. Additionally, many churches receive over 50% of their income in December and so the earlier reporting can look artificially bad as well as suggest the leadership is being fiscally irresponsible.
2. VISITORS -A bulletin's purpose is to aid a person's understanding and participation in worship; the bulletin serves as a means to orient a visitor. The bulletin is not primarily for those inside the church but for those visiting. If visitors attend a church, they already feel like an outsider and if the bulletin contains “insider information,” church jargon that only members understand, and announcements for already assembled groups, the visitors get the clear message that indeed they are outsiders. Financial information in the bulletin is like you showing a new neighbor your checkbook balance. Many churches already have the reputation of always hitting people for money and the statements in a bulletin may add to this impression.
3. STEWARDSHIP – The truth is that in churches where the leadership has established integrity and is doing their job; the majority of attendees have little to no desire to see the financial information. While some twenty or thirty years ago the current fiscal safeguards might not have been in place, currently, you have a number of checks and balances that insure the gifts you bring to God are carefully used and managed! Your Finacial Committee and Session have assured fiscal responsibility with such measures as an annual outside audit and a counting procedure each Sunday that entails two Elders being present, nonfamily members sharing the task and a double check of all recordings and accountings. Explicit and detailed instructions are followed for counting, depositing, and posting of pledges/contributions.
4. PROPRIETY – There's no question that anyone who gives money to Culdee has a right to see how the money is being spent. However, I agree with Rusty Soulman's assessment in his article, “Financials in the Church Bulletin,” and I quote: “I have trouble giving out this information to just anyone. We've all met people who attend churches who are destructive critics... Jesus described them as 'wolves in sheep's clothing' (Matthew 7). These are people who want power but who don't sacrifice and are not committed to God or to the church. They wouldn't be caught dead tithing, but will show up at business [finance meetings or Session] with an agenda.” Offering just a snapshot of a church's ongoing financials may offer easy access for such destructive folks to be irresponsible and may lead to possible slander or offer attacks in a public forum, hurting the church's reputation.

You have a Session committed to using your gifts to God in a responsible fashion. You have a Finance Committee that is gifted and has open meetings. You have a God who from 1886 has provided for Culdee and has promised in Scripture to always provide. If we do our part in bringing to our generous God, the best of what God has given us, we will not just survive but thrive!!

Why did we make the move from weekly statements in the bulletin? The reasons listed above are a few but J. Cliff Christopher in *Not Your Parents' Offering Plate* says, "one of the leading reasons people decide to give to an organization is the organization's financial stability and fiscal responsibility. When we publish our giving dollars with a 'woe is us' message, we completely undercut our perceived reputation as a financially stable and fiscally responsible organization." Culdee is such an organization, one with responsibility and stability, but even more important than that is the truth we all assert by faith, our God will supply our needs and that is good news!!

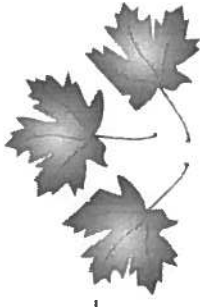
