The King of Persia was looking for a new queen. Many beautiful young women were brought before him.




Esther, a Jewish girl, was one of the women. She was an orphan who had been raised by her cousin Mordecai.

The king was very pleased with Esther. He chose her to be his new queen. Mordecai told Esther not to tell anyone she was a Jew.



The king appointed a new advisor, Haman. Haman hated Jews. He planned to destroy the Jews in Persia.




Mordecai told Esther about Haman's plan. Esther knew she had to stop Haman. For three days, Esther and the Jews fasted.




Then Esther took action. She risked her life to save the lives of the Jews. Esther stood before the king.
