# Sunday July 10, 2022 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The heart of the law is LOVE! Consider these challenging words of Blessed Teresa of Calcutta, addressed to the mothers in our world, she said: "... today, the mother forgets her child. Not only forgets it, but destroys it. And for what? The mother is afraid of the child, of that little unborn child...the most beautiful creation of God's love, the gift of God. That little unborn child is our NEIGHBOR, too. Let mothers today be the potential Good Samaritan and let the unborn child live..."

We don't choose our neighbor. A neighbor is not of geography, but of the heart. What makes us neighbors is our generous being with and attending to people in need. The focus given by Jesus to the "love of neighbor" does not restrict the ability to love to the limits of what is close and known to us. Charity begins with those who are in need, whether at home or elsewhere.

In the gospel today, Jesus tells us about a "Good Samaritan" who loves God and neighbor. Samaritans were thought to be heretics. For generations, Jews were told that the Samaritans were definitely not and would never be their neighbors. However, the gospel story brings out the goodness of the Samaritan. He did not think of his own convenience, and what he saw in the road was a man in need and acted immediately to help him. It was love in action. The Samaritan may be a pagan in the eyes of the Jews, but in what he did, we see the love of God in his heart.

The Levite and the priest have used their religious beliefs to evade the man who fell into the hands of the robbers. But to excuse ourselves from our Christian duty to charity in the false guise or religiosity is something inexcusable. To be a Christian, above all, is to imitate Christ who said, "It is mercy I want, not sacrifice."

If you're asked today by Jesus, "Who is a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" and if your answer is, "The one who treated him with mercy," Jesus is telling you right now, "GO AND DO LIKEWISE!" That will be your mission this week... be a good and loving neighbor to everyone!


