Note from our Pastor

A few weeks ago after the 5pm Saturday evening Mass I was talking with a man leaving church who told me he had grown up in the parish and he was in town that day visiting his brother and they decided to come back to their home parish for Mass. He told me about his early life here at Sts. Peter and Paul and the profound impact this community had on his faith life. Going over this long span it made me appreciate a little more the history of our local church and specifically our parish, where he got started.

Many weddings, funerals, baptisms that we celebrate here are for parishioners, some who have been here for generations and others who have just moved here, but others are for those who have a history with the parish. Some grew up here, others have received other sacraments here as have their parents and grandparents. These come back and are strengthened in their faith by the sense of home and belonging they feel when they come in our doors. We realize some of them have taken their faith that was first nourished here and helped it spread and grow affecting many others. Others may have had a different journey and only in coming back here do they make a connection with their faith again, and it may be an opportunity for them to grow at a time in their life where they are now receptive to that faith.

I consider it an honor to be able to be a part of this community for all of them. As a means we have here of nurturing those who will take what has started for them here and not only have helped them on their journey through life but also be the means that they then will bring others to God. Also as a place where people can come back, to be reminded of or find what they may not even recognize is missing in their lives, often at a critical time in their lives. Our parish community doesn't just affect those who live in our parish boundaries, or even just those who are registered in the parish, but fortunately can have an effect on many others as we go out to others in our lives and as they may visit here, whether coming back or just coming for Sunday Mass when staying in a local hotel.

Thank you for the way you continue to be this community where we can evangelize even while staying at home, and know that our actions, our words, and our prayers are not only serving our relationship with God but can truly help build up the Body of Christ, where all me feel at home.

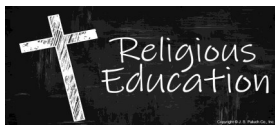

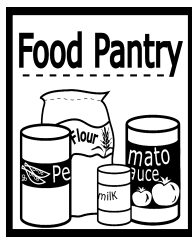

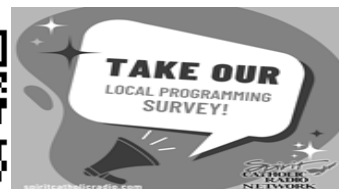
