NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ June 11, 2023

We celebrate today the MOST HOLY BODY and BLOOD OF CHRIST, our gospel unveils to us the assurance of gaining eternal life in these words of Jesus: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever... Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life..." Jesus "made himself the bread of life and the wine of salvation to be our life of love and joy. No one else can give what he gives..." He is our food in our journey towards the Kingdom. And "if you walk with Jesus along this path, he will lead you to the poor, the weak, the lonely and the oppressed, not with fear and despair, not with feelings of guilt and helplessness, not with anger and revolt... but with a new deeper peace and love and hope."

The EUCHARIST is the "most intimate and sacred human event... It is the gift that we cannot fabricate for ourselves. It is to be received. It is freely offered and asks to be freely received." Around the Eucharistic table, "we become a family, friends, community, yes, a body." The Eucharist is really overflowing with grace endorsed with three values: GIVING: Jesus gives his life. He tells us that life is stronger than death. **FORGIVING:** Jesus forgives us all to become worthy partakers of the table of life. He tells us that love is stronger than hatred. **THANKSGIVING:** Jesus invites us to thank his Father in sending his only Son. He tells us to be grateful rather than resentful. As we go forward to receive the Bread of Life and the Wine of Salvation in our Eucharist celebration today, I would like to propose three basic questions for our reflection for the week: If we hate and discriminate against other people, are we ready to receive Jesus as the BREAD OF LOVE? If we support abortion, are we ready to receive Jesus as the BREAD OF LIFE? If we are a violent, bitter and revengeful person, are we ready to receive Jesus as the BREAD OF PEACE? Beloved friends, be the REAL BREAD for others today!
