NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Fifth Sunday of Easter ~ May 7, 2023

Sometimes, life is like a "cup filled to the brim with war, violence, rejection, loneliness, and endless disappointments." And we become hopeless, desperate and just want to give up. However, it is in these moments of uncertainty that the life-giving words and healing grace of Jesus come to the door steps of our hearts. He will tell us: "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own..." He doesn't see us as hopeless human beings, but rather as the grandeur of his creation with gifts to share with others.

As a "chosen race" Jesus wants us to "live our broken love as a partial reflection of God's perfect and unconditional love." In this manner, "we can forgive one another... and enjoy the love we have to offer." As a "holy nation and a people of his own" we are encouraged by Jesus to create a space where strangers can enter and become holy friends. "Good relationships are hospitable. When we enter into a home and feel warmly welcomed, we will soon realize that the love among those who live in that home is what makes that welcome possible." Let us make our Church as a home for everyone. And as a "royal priesthood" we should develop within us a genuine service that is fashioned from the kind of service which Jesus gave to the whole world. It should be a service motivated by love and compassion – with no strings attached and without counting the cost.

Jesus said, "There is no greater love than this than to lay down one's life for one's friends." If Jesus looks at us and sees us as a "chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation and a people of his own," the question now for all of us is: "IF YOU LOOK AT OTHERS, WHAT DO YOU SEE?" Read this story before you give your answer:

The student said, "Master, when I see you, I see a pig!" Instead of being insulted, the master smiled and answered, "When I look at you, I see Jesus!" The student asked, "How can that be?" The master replied, "Well, what you see is what you are in the inside. If you see Jesus, your values are like Jesus, when you see a pig, you act like a pig!" Now, I would like to post the question again: "IF YOU LOOK AT OTHERS, WHAT DO YOU SEE?" Do you see a pig or Jesus? Be careful with your answer. It will reveal who you really are in the inside.
