Summarize interventions which may decrease risks associated with obesity in laboring patients. List tools to identify personal biases toward individuals with obesity. Utilize communication and language which is patient centered for individuals with obesity.</p>

This objective provides attendees with a skill and attitude change by clearly understanding the medical bias and physical differences people of size face during pregnancy.</p> <p>List at least five unique equipment needs for people of size throughout maternity care. By being aware of the needs of people of size, attendees will be able to create safe spaces for people of all sizes in their workspace to help reduce size bias and trauma. Explain what it means to have a bias against people of size. Following the presentation, attendees will be able to explain weight bias and identify their own bias to start working through it.</p>
