Our mission is to assist women who have been commercially sexually exploited through survivor-led peer support and harm reduction services, while providing education about the harm inflicted on women and the community.

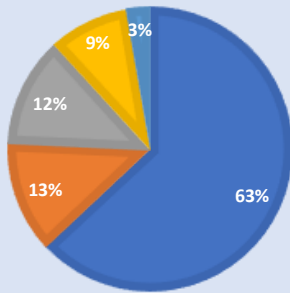
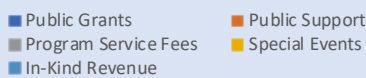

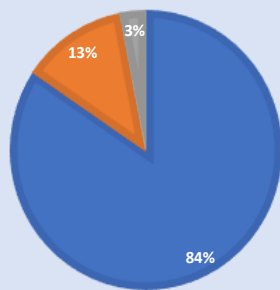
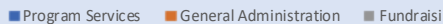
2017 Financial Highlights

- 84% of every dollar goes to direct program services.
- Our annual budget increased by 33% between 2016 and 2017.

We **BELIEVE**...

CASH was founded on the belief that incarceration alone could not help women leave a life of commercial sexual exploitation. This belief grew into RESET (Reducing Sexual Exploitation and Trafficking), our prostitution diversion program. With support from Kaiser Permanente and the California Corrections Partnership, we graduated 81 women, increasing their knowledge, confidence, and skills and reducing the damage caused by a prostitution conviction.

that every **WOMAN**...

CASH serves women ages 18 to over 50. Our volunteers and partners help us meet the varied and complex needs of young women, pregnant women, women with addictions, mental health and severe trauma, homeless women, and women impacted by crime. In 2017, 100 dedicated volunteers, including the Assistance League of Sacramento and Soroptimist International Sacramento South, provided 1800 hours of hands-on service.

should be treated with **DIGNITY**...

CASH educated 800 people in colleges, community groups, treatment centers, the medical profession, law enforcement, and social service agencies. We cover the debilitating effects of stigma to help our community better assist women who have been commercially sexually exploited. With support from the Sierra Health Foundation, we created 3 toolkits to help affordable housing, community college, and career centers meet the unique needs of our participants.

and **RESPECT**.

Our Center is home to women who have very few places to call their own. Every day our door is open for a meal, a friendly chat, and non-judgmental support with no barriers to help. In 2017, we served 275 women. This includes RESET participants, trafficking survivors, pregnant women, and women who call the street of Oak Park home.

2017 Accomplishments!

- We provided 2500 meals.
- Partnered with One Community Health to provide 110 HIV tests.
- In partnership with Dignity Health, 41 trafficking survivors received access to quality health care.
