## Italian Wine Facts

- Italian wine production began some 4,000 years ago.
- Italy is the birthplace of Prosecco.
- Wine Bottles are typically 750ml because a typical glass blower's lung capacity was about 750ml using one breath to create a bottle. So the average size of wine bottles is related to the average lung capacity of European glass blowers 400 to 500 years ago.
- There are more than 2,000 grape varieties in Italy. Some of the most popular white grape varieties are Trebbiano and Catarratto, and the most popular reds include Sangiovese, Barbera, Montepulciano, Nero D'Avola and Primitivo.
- The average Italian consumes around 54 litres of wine per year.
- There are 20 Wine Regions in Italy alone: Veneto, Tuscany, Piedmont, Emilia-Romagna, Lombardy, Umbria, Abruzzo, Trentino Alto-Adige, Friuli-Venezia Giulia, Marche, Puglia, Lazio, Sicily, Sardinia, Campania, Liguria, Calabria, Molise, Basilicata and Valle d'Aosta.

## Did you know?

### 1. FRANCE

While France and Italy compete for the top wine production region of the world they are also reducing wine production every year. France has lowered production by 11% since 2007.

**MAJOR GRAPES:** Merlot, Grenache, Trebbiano Toscano, Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon, Carignan, Chardonnay, Cabernet Franc, Pinot Noir, Gamay, Sauvignon Blanc

### 2. ITALY

Italy may be second to France, but there is a growing trend in both countries to remove vineyards. Italy has reduced their production by at least 7% since 2007.

**MAJOR GRAPES:** Sangiovese, Montepulciano, Merlot, Trebbiano Toscano, Nero d'Avola, Barbera, Pinot Grigio, Prosecco

### 3. SPAIN

Spain is home to the largest vineyard acreage in the world. Despite this fact, Spain also has much lower wine yields than neighboring France and Italy resulting in less total wine.

**MAJOR GRAPES:** Tempranillo, Airén, Garnacha, Monastrell, Bobal

### 4. UNITED STATES

90% of wine from the United States is from California. California is home to the world's largest wine producer, Gallo, in Modesto, CA.

**MAJOR GRAPES:** Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay, Merlot, Pinot Noir, Zinfandel, Sauvignon Blanc
