#### A Journey of Overwhelming Joy

After going through fertility treatments and being told they weren't able to have any more kids, Dani and her husband pursued their foster care license in 2015 and have cared for 13 kids since.

"Throughout our journey of being foster parents, we've had many great placements," said Dani. "Our shortest placement lasted five days when we cared for a girl, whose mother was incapable of watching her while she recovered in the hospital, and our longest lasted 18 months."

Dani shared that one of their biggest blessings was having the opportunity to adopt some of the children they fostered. The family adopted their first child at age one, and they had plans to adopt another when the child turned 18 years old.

"Every time our family adopts another child, I get the same feeling of overwhelming joy," said Dani. "I feel like any expectant mom –not being able to contain my joy when their adoption comes up, and telling everyone I know about it."

Dani shared that it is hard to explain the full impact fostering – and the lows and highs it brings – has had on her family. "We've cried, stressed and lost a lot of sleep. We loved, laughed and had so many firsts," said Dani. "But I still tell everyone who is considering being a foster parent to do it. It's a roller coaster, but so worth it."

Dear Friends in Christ,

Between the seasons of Advent/Christmas and Lent/Holy/Week/Easter there lies a 5-8 Sunday season known as "Epiphany". To say the least, Epiphany doesn't get the "press" afforded to its predecessor and its successor, but we'd be missing a lot if we didn't have it.

The word "Epiphany" means "manifestation" or "appearance". In the Church, the word refers to the "appearance" of Jesus, his gradually becoming known to and by the world around him. The season begins on January 6th with remembering the visit of the Wise Men to Mary and Joseph's house in Bethlehem; this story, recorded at the beginning of Matthew 2, represents the first time that people from outside Israel beheld "him who was born King of the Jews". The first Sunday after January 6th is "The Baptism of Our Lord"; as its name suggests, we hear about Jesus' baptism and what it entailed--God's approval and God's call to service (in that sense, *Jesus'* baptism is a lot like our own). Then we'll move to a story in John where Jesus is identified as "the Lamb of God' by John the Baptist, and in which Jesus attracts the attention of the first of his disciples. The Sunday after that we'll hear about more people joining Jesus' band of disciples, and then the rest of the season will be spent with The Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5.

These are some of the events from Jesus' time in Galilee, where he gained his fame before he "took his show on the road", so to speak. These were the "happy days", the times when it was *fun* to be connected with Jesus--the times when whatever opposition there was was passive, and when throngs of people followed him everywhere he went and couldn't say enough good things about him. That was all *before* he went to Jerusalem, and brought his message about the Kingdom of God to a power structure whose leaders were just fine with the way things were.

The very last Sunday of the Epiphany season is The Transfiguration. Without going into detail here (we'll do enough of that when the day gets here), that event was something for the disciples--and maybe for Jesus himself--to hang onto as things would get tougher and tougher, resulting in the events surrounding Good Friday. It was a reminder of the good times they had had, and a glimpse of what awaits both Jesus and them after all the *bad* times they're soon to face.

As I put together this summary of the Epiphany and its place within the church year, I'm thinking, "Okay, this is interesting, but what does it mean for us, here and now?" What comes to mind is this: what the church year says about following Jesus is that the Christian life is not a *hobby*; if we're going to be "Christ-ians", we've got to be willing to take the bad with the good and vice versa. It's never been the case that everybody likes Jesus, andi it's never been the case that everybody likes those who follow Him. But it should also be remembered that there were plenty of great moments even *after* the decision was made to go to Jerusalem; there were still plenty of people who *loved* Jesus in the midst of all the hostility and danger. Such will always be the case

There's no such thing as a "fair-weather Christian". God has given us all everything we need to take the bad with the good, not the least of which is life together in the Church, not to mention the promise of the Paradise which awaits those of us who are "faithful unto death, and who will win the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10).
