GROWING AUTHENTIC RELATIONSHIPS IN CHRIST

Recently I saw a story on the internet of what life was like 100 years ago. I am a big fan of history and love to learn how different things were during previous eras. Call it nostalgia, reminiscing, or longing for the "good old days," we can yearn for the past in the illusion that it was preferable to the present. The truth is that God calls us to fully embrace this current moment.

How the church addresses the world today is what we call "our mission." Many companies, clubs, organizations, hospitals, and schools have something called a "mission statement." Bethany's mission statement appears every Sunday on the first page of our bulletin. "Reaching out in Worship, Fellowship, Learning and Love—We are God's people." I certainly recognize this as a great mission statement, but when was it written? Does it match today's world?

One of the most frequent conversations taking place in the church today is how to reach young people. In order to best answer that question we need to explore what young people are looking for. One of the great desires of young people is to have authentic, meaningful conversation with people of all ages. In the times we are living in it is not unusual for a 20 year old to want to visit with a 90 year old! Shortly before going to the cross Jesus told His disciples, "love one another as I have loved you." Jesus wishes for His followers to grow authentic, meaning relationships with Him.

Young people today are very smart. Young people today see a lack of authenticity in the relationships people share. Perhaps they have even witnessed a lack of authenticity in the church. In contrast to this disingenuous culture of today, Jesus was totally genuine with everyone. Jesus said that we should love each other with sincerity, honesty, and integrity. This is how Jesus loves us.

Over the past several months I have asked our council to think about our mission statement. Is it time for us to revisit what we currently have in contrast to our world of 2020? What are your thoughts on a mission statement for Bethany? May God direct us in His mission for Bethany.
