### What is Lent? Why is Lent?

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at Sunday on Maundy Thursday. It's a period that culminates in the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. It is not just the six Sundays preceding Easter, but includes Ash Wednesday as well as everything that comprises "Holy Week": Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. Lent is a time for reflection, a time for examination, a time for confession.

Our weekly Lent services will be held here at Bethany on Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. We'll do the Holden Evening Prayer each week, and we'll be joined by members and friends of Faith/Trinity.

Maundy Thursday will be held at 4:00 p.m. and Good Friday will be held at 7:00 p.m., both here at Bethany.

### **Social Work is Rewarding Work**

A child saying "mom" for the first time at 3 years old, a parent getting a job that brings them joy – these are successes that are important to Mallory Berkenpas, Service Coordinator in LSI's Early Childhood department in Sioux City.

Mallory has been an employee of LSI for more than a decade, and has held many different roles in supporting children and families. "My heart lies in working with children and families and prevention work, because I've seen the value in it. I see how important it is. I wish more people knew and understood and valued the work that is done in the early childhood period because it is so crucial," said Mallory.

She expressed that one of the most rewarding parts of her job is being able to see, experience and walk this journey alongside these families, who along the way, make these small or big strides – whatever that means for them.

"Maybe the child says 'mom' for the first time at 3 years old, which is something that has happened in our program. That's a big win for this child that didn't speak from zero to three years old, and did because of the interventions we helped that family find," said Mallory. "All of those successes are so important to me and also my staff – being able to see them grow, build their skill set and feel good about their work."

"Social work can be so hard... so I think being able to see those small and big wins along the way is important," said Mallory.



Dear Friends in Christ,

Not long ago I was returning to Fort Madison from the Keokuk National Cemetery on the Illinois side of the river. That cemetery is an impressive place; I've probably been there four or five times, and I never cease to be impressed by the beauty of all those identical gravestones in perfect formation--no matter what direction you look at them, they're in straight lines. Throw in the rolling terrain on which the cemetery is laid out and the history of how it got to be where it is, and we've got a national treasure right in our relative back yard! I crossed the river into Hamilton, Illinois, and was treated to a display of waterfowl wildlife, the likes of which can be seen only in places like we have around here. There were the occasional eagles in the trees and over the water; already there were some migrating ducks in noticeable numbers. But the "stars of the show", so to speak, were two separate groups of white pelicans, each of which numbered in the thousands--what a sight! The spectacle I was treated to lasted all the way to Nauvoo. I've never got to the point where that drive between Hamilton and Nauvoo has become "ho-hum"; there's always something breathtakingly beautiful or unusual about each trip up and down that road.

That day was one of many over the past 8 years when I've been caused to thank God for the opportunity I've had to be down here in "the Florida of Iowa". This area--and I'm giving credit to Illinois and Missouri as well when I say this--has got to be one of the very finest areas of the country *that hardly anybody knows about*, or for that matter, that people *in Iowa* don't know about! Natural beauty and fascinating history make Burlington, Ft. Madison, Keokuk, and the surrounding area a special place to be. For the record, I tell people who don't live around here about it *a lot*.

I realize, too, that *workwise*, this is for the most part *not* a land of opportunity for *younger* people, but perhaps something can be done about *that* as time goes by.

Such are my thoughts as I prepare to spend my ninth Lenten season in Ft. Madison, and my first in Burlington. May the time we share this Lent make the celebration of our Lord's resurrection all the more meaningful and joyous.
