

### I WILL NEVER FAIL YOU NOR FORSAKE YOU

Recently I read a story about a two-year-old girl from Kentucky who became lost for 36 hours. A desperate search was launched. Then a neighbor saw the missing girl come walking out of the woods into his backyard. She was covered in dirt but unharmed. She also was not alone. Following her was her pet pit bull who had stayed with her to protect her.

This heart-warming story reminds us of Jesus' promise to never forsake us. If you have ever experienced being abandoned, you can appreciate how much Jesus' commitment means to us. There are certainly moments when we can feel all alone. The death of a spouse, children moving out of the house, relocating to a different area, starting a new job. These and others can be situations that are more than just unfamiliar. They can create a sense of abandonment.

On April 8 around 4:00 p.m. I was walking down a sidewalk on Sweeny Avenue when I stepped into a deep hole and went flying. I felt a sharp pain in my right shoulder from the hard fall and was not sure I could get up. I felt all alone. Vehicles drove by which I hoped would stop and help me, but they all kept going. Needless to say, I was on my own. I also felt a throbbing in my right shoulder that would not go away. Added to my bad right knee I was not feeling overly confident about my future well-being. And then I started feeling not so all alone when I shared my experience with others. I was amazed to learn that I was in good company when several people told me about their shoulder injuries.

One of the most caring things we can do for each other is to be there with and for one another, especially during tough times. Here at Bethany we have just finished training people for Stephen Ministry. A Stephen Minister is someone who is able to be a caring listener for others when they are dealing with troubling experiences. When we are hurting it helps to know that we have people we can turn to who care about us.

Before Jesus was taken to be crucified He promised His disciples that He would come back for them. He said, "Lo, I am with you always." There are moments when we will sense Jesus' presence directly. There are also moments when we will feel Jesus' presence through the caring of others. Either way it is so comforting to know God's compassion and care. Sometimes it is hard to ask for help, but God never intended for us to go through life all alone. I hope you will call me about having a Stephen Minister to talk to. It will bless you beyond words.
